RE: A Resolution to Amend the Public Law Group-OPOA Negotiations Contract by \$150,100

for a Total Contract Amount Not to Exceed \$300,000 for Negotiating the Expiring Memorandum of Understanding Between the City of Oakland and the Oakland Police Officers' Association and Extend The Contract from June 30, 2006 to June 30, 2007

#### **SUMMARY**

The City Council has authorized the City Administrator to enter into contracts for professional or specialized services if the mandates of Oakland City Charter Section 902(e) have been met. The City currently has a contract with Public Law Group (PLG) for serving as Chief Negotiator, developing negotiation strategy and directing all matters throughout the course of negotiations; communicating with elected officials and City management for direction and input throughout negotiations; preparing for bargaining and leading the bargaining team at the table, including proposal and counter proposal development and costing preparation of final negotiated contract; providing training to City management and departments on new or revised provisions in the adopted contract; and conducting impasses processes, if necessary. This is a request to increase the current contract by \$150,100 for a total contract amount of not to exceed \$300,000 and to extend the contract to June 30, 2007.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed contract extension would cost the City's General Fund an estimated one time cost of \$150,100 in FY 2006-07. Funding is available in the FY 2006-07 Non-Departmental budget, Citywide Activities Unit organization (90591); Miscellaneous Contract Services account (54929).

### **BACKGROUND**

The Oakland Police Officers' Association (OPOA) Memorandum of Understanding expires on June 30, 2006. As the Council is aware, negotiations with the OPOA for a successor agreement are ongoing. The parties have recently completed their presentation of initial proposals. The parties will begin exchanging counterproposals on language/management issues shortly. We hope for significant progress in these areas during the summer months. Given the very large number of changes proposed by the City, and the need to conform or incorporate the side letters, general orders and related agreements such as the promotional agreement, shift schedules and transfer policy, the negotiations will be lengthy and detailed. The current PLG contract, not to exceed \$149,900, expires June 30, 2006.

#### KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

Public Law Group will continue throughout the coming months to serve as Chief Negotiator for a successor memorandum of understanding.
