RE: Supplemental Report Regarding the City Racks Bicycle Parking Program

SUMMARY

At the May 8, 2007 Public Works Committee, the Committee directed staff to come back with a schedule of when meters would be removed prior to proceeding with that work.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is an informational report. Fiscal impacts are not included.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

Since the inception of the multi-space pay-and-display meter proposal, the Parking Division manager has had on-going discussions to address the issues of Bicycle Parking Program. The Parking Division remains willing to work with the PWA's City Racks Bicycle Parking Program.

Parking division will start the initial installation of the new multi-space pay-and-display meters on June 15, 2007 in route 2 around the Police Administration building and Grand Avenue Parking lot. The installation of these meters will continue at the rate of 50 meter every two weeks until all these meters are installed in the proposed areas of the city (see chart on page 2).
