# RE: Resolution Approving Implementation Of Residential Permit Parking (RPP) On Howe Street From John Street To Pleasant Valley Avenue As An Addition To The Existing Area "A" RPP

# SUMMARY

A resolution has been prepared approving the implementation of Residential Permit Parking (RPP) on Howe Street from John Street to Pleasant Valley Road as an addition to the existing Area "A" RPP as shown in the attached Exhibit A. All petition requirements for implementing an RPP have been satisfied per Oakland Municipal Code, Section 10.44, and as spelled out by Ordinance No. 10689 C.M.S.

The request by area residents for RPP resulted from the increase in long-term parking activities by non-residents on streets near the Piedmont Avenue shopping district, the nearby post office, and Kaiser Permanente. The parking problem is compounded by many of the area residents owning more than one car, and, in addition, some of the residential properties do not have off street parking. The proposed RPP will allow area residents to find long-term parking near their homes.

# FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated cost to install RPP signs on Howe Street is \$1,000.00. Funds are available in the Public Works Agency budget under Miscellaneous Services, Organization 30262, Project 0000000, Account 53719, Program NB33, and Fund 1750.

# BACKGROUND

The Residential Permit Parking Program was established to alleviate parking congestion in residential neighborhoods caused by non-residents (such as employees, shoppers, visitors) who park for extended periods of time. Upon establishing RPP on Howe Street, RPP signs will be installed which limit on-street parking to two hours, except for vehicles displaying Area "A" RPP permit stickers.

OMC Section 10.44.050 states that a petition requesting establishment or expansion of an RPP area is required to be signed by residents representing at least fifty-one percent of the addresses within the proposed area. City staff received a RPP petition on February 3, 2006

Item: \_\_\_\_\_ Public Works Committee March 13, 2007 containing 20 qualified signatures, and a second RPP petition on January 2, 2007 containing an additional 10 qualified signatures. The total 30 signatures received represent 54 percent of the 56 eligible addresses. The petitions satisfy OMC requirements. The two petitions are attached in Exhibits B and C.

OMC Section 10.44.050 states that at least eighty percent of the block fronts in the proposed RPP area must be residentially zoned, and a minimum seventy-five percent of all on-street parking spaces within the proposed RPP area must be occupied during any two-hour period between eight a.m. and six p.m. All parcels in the proposed RPP area on Howe Street are zoned residential. In April 2006, a parking survey was conducted on Howe Street. The parking occupancy was 84 percent in the morning and 79 percent in the afternoon. Hence, the RPP petitions satisfy all OMC requirements.

A public hearing was held at the Mosswood Park Recreation Center on September 12, 2006 to discuss the proposed RPP. There were ten attendees, and no opposition voiced against the proposed RPP.

RPP permit fees are waived for eligible residents and businesses within certain blocks of Area "A", as highlighted in solid black in Exhibit A. The fees are paid by Kaiser Permanente as a part of a mitigation measure for parking impact produced by Kaiser's improvement projects in the 1990's. Residents and businesses that are outside the Kaiser zone of impact are required to pay for parking permits. (See Exhibit A)

#### **KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS**

Residents on Howe Street have been inconvenienced by long-term parking demand generated by nearby commercial and institutional land uses. Area residents wish to add Howe Street to the existing RPP as allowed by the Municipal Code. The existing Area "A" RPP has a two-hour parking time limit, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

#### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: There are no significant economic opportunities.

<u>Environmental</u>: The proposed RPP is expected to reduce vehicle emission and noise associated with non-resident parking on Howe Street, and possibly result in alternative transportation choices such as bicycle or transit use.

<u>Social Equity</u>: RPP is already approved for the streets adjacent to the proposed block. Approval of this proposal will create equity in parking policy throughout the area.

#### DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

The proposed RPP will provide more opportunities for disabled and senior citizens to find available parking closer to their homes. Vehicles displaying a disabled placard will be exempted from the time restriction.

#### **RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE**

Staff recommends approval of the resolution establishing RPP on Howe Street from John Street to Pleasant Valley Avenue as an addition to the existing RPP in "Area A" in accordance with the procedures of the Oakland Municipal Code, Section 10.44, in order to alleviate the lack of long-term parking spaces presently experienced by the area residents.

#### **ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL**

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the resolution.




Legend




Existing Area "A" RPP - Free

Enclosed, please find a completed petition requesting a 2-hour RPP on Howe Street, North and South sides, between the intersections of Pleasant Valley Ave. and John Street.

Please note the following regarding the petition signatures:

- 4336 Howe Street is currently unoccupied. The owner was recently deceased and the house is in the process of being sold, so there was no one to sign the petition.
- 4339 Howe Street is currently unoccupied. The owners live outside the area and do not rent the house or occupy it. I left a note in case the owners came by, but otherwise I have no way to contact them for a signature.

Please note the following regarding your field survey:

We have street sweeping four days each month, on the second and fourth Mondays and Tuesdays. All-day parkers (those who park all day on our block but do not live in the area) do not park on our block on street sweeping days. Since all-day parkers are a problem on our block in terms of not having available parking for residents (and why we're requesting the RPP zone), I request that you do not conduct your field survey on any of those four street sweeping days since it will give the faise impression that we have available parking on all days.

We understand that, if this area is designated as a Preferential Residential Permit Parking area, certain restriction will be placed upon on-street parking within the designated area; that subject to the regulations and restrictions established by the City Council, their visitors will be eligible to obtain permits exempting them from such parking restrictions; that the snowil initial fee for a Residential Parking Permit is \$25.00 per vehicle; that a conval renewal fee for a Residential Parking Permit is \$15.00 per vehicle; that a Residential Parking permit may be insued to a resident of the same address, but not more than three Residential Parking Permits shall be issued to any one address, except in areas where it appears that the number of permits issued would exceed the number of legal on street parking spaces where the initial sale would be limited to two or possibly one permit per resident; that no more than one Residential Parking Permits shall be issued to each motor vehicle owned or leased for which a application is made; that fees for one day and 14 day. Visitor Parking Permits are \$1.00 per day and \$5.00 per vehicle, respectively; but that no more than two Visitor Parking Permits per any one address shall be issued at any one time.
