The Hoover neighborhood once had a library branch called the North Oakland Branch Library, located at 3424 San Pablo Avenue, very near Hoover Junior High. This branch opened in 1888. There were also a Telegrove Branch housed in a much smaller storefront on 34th and Grove Streets.


Puarque Biblioteca Espana Medellin, Colombia

Located on a hillside in the neighborhood of La Ladera in Medellin, the *Parque Biblioteca Espana*, completed in 2007, is a stark trio of monolithic modern buildings looking down on what was once among the most dangerous neighborhoods in Latin America. Designed as a symbol of hope, the library, auditorium and community center buildings were inspired by the shape of boulders.

I am writing today to express my interest in becoming an Oakland Library Commission (OLC) member. I believe my extensive professional and personal experience in government program director, budget development and submission, engagement with community leaders and city officials, and the development of innovation in service delivery makes me uniquely qualified to serve on the Oakland Public Library Commission. I will bring my knowledge, skills and abilities to the commission to help empower, connect and nurture all people in line with the mission and values of the OLC. I am a 30-year Oakland resident who has lived many of those years in East Oakland, Allendale and Crestmont areas of Oakland. I am an Afro Cuban, openly gay woman who has dedicated my life to public service and advancing the voice and needs of marginalized communities. It is the calling of my life. In my chosen profession, I continue to serve as the director of the San Francisco Department of Child Support Services for almost 20 years, managing operations, budget and finance, statewide legislation, and community outreach. I have also dedicated much of my time to volunteerism. I have volunteered with the SF NAACP, the Young Women's Freedom Center. I currently serve the Alameda County Probation Department Community Advisory Board on Reentry Services, the San Francisco Reentry Council, Sentencing Commission, Family Violence Council, the Boys, and Girls Club, and the Friends and Stewards of the African American Museum and Library. My relationship and commitment to the public library system started at the tender age of seven years old in the Bronx, New York. A classmate and I were walking home from school one day when a car pulled up, and a man extended an arm out the car window with a gun and demanded that my friend Rosa and I get into his car. A lady walked up and immediately stood between Rosa and me and the gunman and told him to leave us alone. We are only children, and she would report the car's license plate to the police. The gunman sped away! Miss Giovanni, who stopped and risked her life for Rosa and me, was a librarian. She walked us home and spoke to our parents about Rosa and me joining the Super Kids after School Reading Program at the Parchester Branch (Bronx) of the New York Public Library. After school, I spent hours in the library reading, helping at the counter, and participating in read-aloud circles, where each kid would read from a chosen book and talk about what the story meant to them. That was my first book club! As a treat, Miss Giovanni took all the Super Kids into Manhattan to visit the main branch of the New York Public Library System. All I can say is - wow!!! One story we read as Super Kids that stayed with me well into adulthood was Romeo and Juliet by William Shakespeare. When I first moved to Oakland, California, I volunteered as a tutor at the Adeline Branch of the Oakland Public Library System. I met many young people from West Oakland who would come in for help with their homework. One day a young African American boy asked me for help with his reading assignment, which was to read – you guessed it - Romeo and Juliet! Well, life had come full circle for me at that moment! Intimidated by language as I once was, he was reluctant to dive into the book. Some words had double meanings, like "company," which confused him as it did me. Once we conquered the prose of Shakespeare (armed with a dictionary by our side), he found the story both entertaining and relevant as he was about the same age as the main characters and had a girlfriend. No longer intimidated by words, he declared he was a Super Kid empowered to learn anything he wanted! All he had to do was pull out his Webster's Dictionary and BAMMM! I continue my relationship with the Oakland Public Library System as a Board Member of the Friends-Stewards of the African American Museum and Library at Oakland (FSAAMLO). There, I found both community and a cause to celebrate the diversity and uniqueness of libraries. I met like-minded black and brown people dedicated to preserving and sharing precious historical archives that chronicle the African American experience in the Bay Area. When I walked into the African American Museum and Library, it felt auspicious, grand, and reverent. The pandemics of COVID 19 and the worsening of racial inequity have left historically marginalized communities further behind significantly. I believe the public library has "super powers" that can change the lives of young people. Now more than ever, the public library system is a beacon of hope, opportunity, and safety for so many black and brown children. It serves as a place of community that combats the loneliness and isolation that many seniors experience. It serves as a respite for the unhoused people and a place to start a job search, and most importantly, it serves as a place to dream big dreams, learn new skills, and find one's voice and read, read, read! I hope you will find both my professional and personal experience of value to the Commission, and I thank you for the opportunity to apply.



Cristina Tostado to the Library Advisory Commission to serve the term beginning October 5, 2020 and ending October 4, 2023, filling the seat previously vacated by Viola Gonzales.
