#### **SUMMARY**

The chair of the Community and Economic Development (CED) Committee has requested a monthly report tracking the outcomes to date under the City of Oakland's Vacant and Foreclosed Building Registry program. Modeled on a tracking report previously utilized by the Rules Committee, this monthly informational presentadon will provide quantifiable results of the effort, but will not attempt to evaluate the merits of current and possible alternative future approaches to the need to remediate the blighting effects that vacant and foreclosed residential buildings can have upon the Oakland community. Staff note that a separate report of the vacant building program, including options for augmenting or revising the effort, has already been agendized for a CED Committee meeting later this spring.

Outcomes generated to date under the current Vacant and Foreclosed Building Registration program are included as *Attachment A* to this report.
