History

- City of Oakland a grantee since 1972
- Serves o to 5 prenatal through 5 years old
- Federal, State and City Funding
- Served 1700 children
- 2012 Program Designation Renewal System (DRS)
- 5 Year grant (2016 to 2021)

Program Goals

- Oakland's Head Start children are ready to thrive in Kindergarten. They are healthy, ready to learn & have the skills needed for success in school.
- Parents, Family & Community are empowered and engaged in their children's education.
- Oakland's Head Start learns from the information collected to always move forward and grow stronger.

Program Enrollment

Head Start serves 1006 children and their families

- 590 in Head Start (3 & 4 year olds)
- 416 in Early Head Start (prenatal, infants and toddlers)

City Directly Serves 420 Children:

- 14 City sites throughout the City of Oakland
- **248** Head Start children
- 172 Early Head Start children [82 are home-based]

Program Enrollment

Head Start Delegate Agency Serves 368 Children

- **220** Head Start Children
- 148 Early Head Start Children

Head Start 4 Partners Serve 218 Children

- 122 Head Start Children
- 96 Early Head Start Children

Governance

City Council

- Executes the federal and state contracts
- Establishes structure, communication, and oversight

Advisory Board (Committee)

- Head Start Advisory Board re-established in 2014
- Advise on strategic programming
- Feedback on fiscal & programmatic reports, & practices
- Support program goals

Governance

Parent Policy Council

Parents elect one Representative and one Alternate from:

- City of Oakland Grantee Centers
- Partner programs
- Delegate agency
- Oakland community

Role of Policy Council:

- Advise staff on local program policies, activities and services
- Decide on the direction of the Head Start program.

Head Starts Five Core Areas

- 1 Eligibility, Recruitment, Selection, Enrollment and Attendance (ERSEA)
- 2 Education and Child Development
- 3 Health and Nutrition
- 4 Mental Health and Disabilities
- 5 Parent, Family and Community Partnerships

Eligibility, Recruitment, Selection, Enrollment & Attendance (ERSEA)

Families must meet National Poverty Guidelines, 2018 (e.g. \$25,100 for family of 4)

The Head Start Team works with families daily to promote attendance to ensure children receive the full range of services.

EDUCATION

- High quality research based curriculum
- Strengthen teacher skills through training & teacher/child engagement through master CLASS® (Classmate Assessment Scoring System) coaching
- Children ready for preschool, kindergarten & beyond

HEALTH & NUTRITION

- Offer vision, hearing and medical screenings
- Provide resources, referral and information to health and nutrition services for children and families
- Use of newest technology for more accurate health and nutrition screenings

MENTAL HEALTH & DISABILITIES

Children and families receive:

- Mental health, behavioral support
- Provide support with disabilities and trauma informed services
- Participation in Oakland Starting Smart and Strong Initiative (OSSS)

Parent, Family & Community Partnerships

Parents are a Child's First Teacher

At Head Start parents are partners in the education & care of their children to:


- Engage children in school readiness goals

Head Start Challenges

- Oakland's Program is under-enrolled in particular Early Head Start
- 2 Lack of teachers hiring challenges

Head Start Successes

- Major Transformation from a ½ day to a full day program
- Resiliency in Communities After Stress and Trauma (ReCAST) & Packard Grants – Trauma Informed Curriculum
- 3 A new partnership with Oakland Unified School District (OUSD)
- 4 Using Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS) Quality Standards at pilot sites
- Workforce Development Partnership to recruit and train teachers
- 6 Partner with Acorn Evaluation to be more data driven
