RESOLUTION NO. 85178 C.M.S.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR,
OR DESIGNEE, TO ENTER INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL
MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) WITH THE
OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (OUSD) TO
ESTABLISH AND DEFINE THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN
THE CITY AND OUSD WITH RESPECT TO IMPLEMENTING
THE OAKLAND POLICE DEPARTMENT'S (OPD) SCHOOL
SAFETY OFFICER PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2011 the City Council adopted Resolution No. 83627 C.M.S., accepting and appropriating \$10,739,575 in grant funds from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (USDOJ/COPS) to OPD to fund entry-level salary and fringe benefit costs of 25 police officers for a 36-month period, from September 1, 2011 through August 31, 2014; and

WHEREAS, due to the time required to hire officers, OPD was not able to commence the program until August of 2012 and therefore OPD applied for and received an 18-month extension of the COPS grant money award period, until February 29, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the primary purpose of the MOU is to set forth the agreed-upon working relationship between the City and OUSD, seeking to achieve four specific goals in furtherance of OPD's School Safety Officer Program, in respect to six specific OUSD schools; and

WHEREAS, said goals are (1) to reduce and/or eliminate child trafficking; (2) to reduce and/or eliminate student truancy; (3) to provide students safe passage to and from school; and (4) to provide mentoring services to students at the following designated schools (1) Roosevelt Middle School, (2) Coliseum College Prep Academy and Roots International Academy (located on the former Havenscourt Middle School campus), (3) Elmhurst Community Preparatory School, (4) Frick Middle School, (5) Parker Elementary, and (6) Bunche Academy; and

WHEREAS, Section 504(f) of the Oakland City Charter provides that, when directed by the City Council, the City Administrator shall have the power and duty to represent the City in its intergovernmental relations and to negotiate contracts for joint government actions, subject to Council approval; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby authorizes the City Administrator, or designee, to enter into an MOU with the OUSD that outlines the working relationship and

responsibilities regarding the School Safety Officer Program in the City of Oakland; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator, or designee, is hereby authorized to complete all required negotiations, certifications, assurances, and documentation required to accept, modify, extend and/or amend the proposed MOU with OUSD and a copy of the fully executed agreement shall be placed on file with the Office of the City Clerk; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Attorney shall review and approve said proposed MOU with OUSD, as to form and legality.


