Scanning: Officers received numerous calls from citizens in the surrounding area asking for assistance with an abandoned house. The house was described as, run down and a strange smell was coming from the inside. Windows were broken out, and several unknown individuals were coming and in and out.

Analysis: It appears that the owner of the property was unresponsive to several requests from his neighbors. Upon the officer's initial response, they noticed the property to be in very bad condition. There were abandoned vehicles and blight, all over the property and broken windows on the exterior. Family members of the owner gutted the interior of all plumbing and wooden beams. The gas and electricity was on and not being monitored.

Response: O.F.D. responded to the property and turned off the gas and electricity. C.E.D.A. Inspector Tom Espinoza had a clean up and board up done on the property. An 11570 letter was sent to the property owner.

Assessment: The property is completely boarded up. The property has been relieved of squatters and unknown individuals occupying the residence. The owner has taken responsibility for the property, and is taking steps to improve the appearance. The property is to be sold eventually.

SCANNING:

- Citizens complaints for last 12 months pertaining to Robberies.
- Victims complaints for last 12 months pertaining to Robberies.
- Merchants meetings.

ANALYSIS:

- Reviewed seventy five recent Robbery reports for District 4 to determine common factors.
- Interviewed approx. 50 victims of past Robberies.
- Reviewed several video tapes of past Robberies.
- Interviewed several Beat Officers and Walking Officers.
- Reviewed several OPD Robbery analyses.
- Conducted research on current OPD robbery prevention programs including several outside agencies programs.
- Conducted surveillance of areas mostly affected by current Robberies.

RESPONSE:

- Conducted Robbery Decoy Operations. (An undercover Officer would act as a past-out drunken person carrying money, cell phone and jewelry on his person.)
- Conduct surveillances with arrest teams in areas mostly affected by recent Robberies.
- Set up permanent surveillance cameras on International Ave along with posting signs that informed the public that the area was under video surveillance.
- Developed a new Robbery Prevention Program called Operation "HANDS OFF". This program entails several different elements.

- 1. Large 6 ft. X 3 ft. Banners that are displayed on the front of several businesses. These Banners are in Spanish and English. The Banners have a photo of a faceless person behind a set of jail bars. The top caption is "DO THE CRIME... SPEND THE TIME" The middle caption states 5 Years State Prison for Robbery. 4 Years State Prison for Burglary and 3 Years State Prison for Auto Theft. The bottom caption states "YOUR COMMUNITY IS WATCHING". * The effect of the Banners is to send a visual reminder to criminals that they will go to prison if they commit a crime. It also sends the message that the community is watching out for criminal activity.
- 2. Posters that are displayed in merchant windows on International, Fruitvale and Foothill Blvd. The Poster displays a photo of a person attempting to steal a purse from a citizen, and several bystanders on cell phones calling the Police. The photo then shows two Officers arriving at the scene to capture the Robbery suspect. The Top caption of the poster states "THE COMMUNITY WORKING WITH THE POLICE WORKING WITH COMMUNITY" On the poster are 10 tips on 'How not to be a victim" These posters are in Spanish and English. * The effect of the posters is to send a visual reminder that criminals are being caught and the community is assisting to Police.
- 3. Postcards that contain the 10 tips on How Not To Be A Victim. These postcards are distributed by local merchants and community members.
- 4. Personal alarms have been distributed to many of the merchants, senior citizens, Day labors, ice cream vendor, taco trucks and community members.
- 5. Officer Festag has conducted several training session in teaching individuals how to be aware of their environment and how not to become a victim. There have been over three hundred participants in these training sessions to date.

ASSESSMENT:

- An OPD Robbery analysis has shown that Robberies and associated crimes have decreased 33 % on Beat23X which is the test area for Operation HANDS OFF.
- Interviews with community groups and merchants have stated that they notice a big difference in their community as a result of HANDS OFF.

Scanning: On 03 Mar 06 Aubrey Johnson was shot and killed during an argument over a handgun. There were several witnesses who identified Ronald Randolph PFN #BDS087 as the killer. Since this time Randolph had been seen in the area of High and International Blvd. by several sources. Randolph is a known pimp in this high prostitution area and he has been seen with Laquanda Nuno who is a prostitute who works for Randolph. During this period there was a lot of violent crime in Dist. 5 that resulted in the (Hive Five) operation being created to combat the influx of crime that ranged from homicides to Prostitution. There were several complaints from citizens about the crime associated with the prostitution and pimps that hung out along the High st. and International Blvd. corridor. Patrol received several calls a day about prostitution up and down international as well as other crimes in the area.

Analysis: Considering the viciousness of this crime and the fact that the killer was known to be operating in the Dist. 5 area as a pimp, Officer Garrett Smit and Sekou Millington knew that this person had to be caught. After acquiring the PFN photos of both Nuno and Randolph, Smit and Millington obtained the most current information for the pair as possible. Officer Smit and Millington looked for Randolph and Nuno almost on a daily basis and kept up the pressure on those individuals engaged in criminal activity along the High st. International Blvd. corridor.

Response: With Randolph and Nuno's photographs and personal information, Officer Smit and Millington began searching for the pair. Sekou and Smit concealed themselves in a covert vehicle and began to conduct surveillance in the area of High st. and International Blvd. After a couple of hours looking for the pair, Sekou and Smit got another PSO uniform officer to conduct a stop on prostitute who looked like Nuno. After conducting the stop Sekou and Smit realized that this person was not Nuno. Although this person was not Nuno, Sekou and Smit received information from this person that Nuno was seen in the area along with Randolph just one day prior. Smit and Millington gave the girl that they had stopped their contact information and the girl agreed to contact Smit and Millington if she Saw Randolph or Nuno. One hour later Smit and Millington received a phone call that Randolph had just dropped Nuno off at High st. and International Blvd. and was driving a green Chrysler. Smit and Millington went to this location and detained Nuno but Randolph was gone. Nuno was transported to Homicide. Within another hour Smit and Millington received another call that Randolph was driving

the Chrysler in the area. Smit and Millington returned to High st and International Blvd. area along with Ofc Anderson and Sgt. Brock from homicide. Other uniformed officer also assisted. Smit then located Randolph's vehicle in the parking lot of the coliseum hotel. This hotel is frequently used by pimps and prostitutes. A surveillance was conducted on the vehicle and after a short period Randolph appeared. Randolph was arrested on the spot carrying a loaded firearm. Several other weapons were recovered from Randolph's vehicle. Randolph was transported to Homicide where he admitted to the murder and was charged with murder the next day.

Assessment: This arrest provided closure to the victim's family and took a violent criminal off of the street. Dangerous weapons, that included a firearm was also taken off of the street. Although this was not a typical PSO project, this project yielded great results at a time of an influx of crime in the Dist. 5 area. Randolph is headed for prison and will no longer be prostituting woman along the

Scanning: Officer Sara Whitmeyer received several complaints from citizens who live in the area of 10168 foothill Blvd. about drug dealing coming from this location and individuals dealing in front of this location. There was also a motorcycle club operating out of the garage of this location that citizens complained about. There were several calls for service almost every day for Patrol officers to go to this location for things such as, narcotic activity, loud music, drinking in public and illegal parking on the sidewalk.

Analysis: Officer Whitmeyer went out to this location and observed just what the citizens were complaining about. There were People hanging around this location, believed to be involved in narcotic activity. There was also loud music, and motorcycles parked illegally on the sidewalk and drinking in public.

Response: Officer Whitmeyer's response to this situation was to make several walking stops in and around the property, use an undercover buy officer to make a narcotic buy at this location and constantly go buy this location and address any quality of life issues around this property. As a result of the narcotic buys by the undercover officer, Whitmeyer was able to get a search warrant for the property. The search warrant at 10168 Foothill was a great success, as there were 7 arrested, cocaine base, narcotic packaging material and a shotgun was recovered. On the day the search warrant was served the property owner responded to the scene. This property was being rented and the owner was advised of all of the problems associated with the property and the tenants. As long as the current tenants were still living at this location Whitmeyer believed the problems would start back up. Whitmeyer then looked to have the problem tenants evicted. Since the owner didn't evict the tenants immediately, Whitmeyer used the City's Nuisance Abatement Unit to get the tenants evicted.

Assessment: Officer Whitmeyer continued to go to this location to insure that people were not still hanging around and causing problems. Eventually all of the trouble makers realized that this was not the place anymore and stopped hanging around. The property was cleaned up, painted and put on the market for sale. The problems associated with this property have been greatly reduced. Patrol Officer no longer have to go to this location about the same problems almost on a daily basis. The neighbors are very happy with the work that Officer Whitmeryer did with this location. The property looks 100% better than it did before.
