RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the proposed ordinance authorizing a 2.8 percent increase for Fiscal Year (FY) 2015-16, consistent with the Consumer Price Index (CPI), for the tax imposed pursuant to the 1997 Emergency Medical Services Retention Act (Measure M).

OUTCOME

This adjustment of the FY 2015-16 special parcel tax for the 1997 Emergency Medical Services Retention Act would be consistent with the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

In June 1997, Oakland voters approved, by more than a two-thirds majority, the Emergency Medical Services Retention Act (Measure M). Measure M imposed a parcel tax for the purpose of raising revenue necessary to retain and enhance emergency dispatch and medical services in the City of Oakland and to replace funding from a previous assessment imposed by the City that was invalidated by Proposition 218. The Measure M legislation authorizes the City Council to increase the tax rates by a cost-of-living factor beginning in Fiscal Year 1998-99 and continuing each fiscal year thereafter. A 2.8 percent increase for the Measure M special parcel tax rate is proposed for FY 2015-16, consistent with the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase for the San Francisco Bay Area during calendar year 2014. At no time, however, may the rates be increased by more than 5.0 percent of the tax rates imposed by ordinance during the immediate preceding fiscal year.

ANALYSIS

The proposed ordinance applies an increase of 2.8 percent to the current Measure M special parcel tax amount, effective July 1, 2015. This increase is per the actual change in the San Francisco Bay Area CPI during calendar year 2014. The proposed increase applies on a fiscal year basis (i.e., July 1st – June 30th).

Note: The Consumer Price Index - All Urban Consumers is based on the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose, CA index

PUBLIC OUTREACH/INTEREST

A public hearing on the proposed ordinance to increase the Measure M special parcel tax is scheduled for June 2, 2015 at 6:30 p.m.

COORDINATION

The report was prepared in coordination with the Office of the City Attorney, the Controller's Bureau, and Francisco & Associates, the City's Contractor, who annually administers special financing districts on behalf of the City.

COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS

The FY 2015-16 estimated revenue from Measure M is approximately \$1,962,151, including the proposed rate increase. The proposed annual rate increase of 2.8 percent translates to \$53,444 of the total FY 2015-16 estimated revenue. This additional funding is needed to account for increases in personnel costs.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: Essential City services that serve the public greatly rely upon revenues generated from the Measure M special tax.

Environmental: There are no direct environmental impacts associated with the City Council action requested in this report.

Social Equity: Adequately staffed dispatch allows the City to properly respond to emergency situations all throughout the city.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A FISCAL YEAR 2015-16 INCREASE TO A SPECIAL TAX IMPOSED FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX, AND PURSUANT TO THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES RETENTION ACT OF 1997 (MEASURE M)

WHEREAS, in 1997 the voters of Oakland approved Measure M, a special tax to fund emergency medical services; and

WHEREAS, Measure M imposed a special tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by Section 3 of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Measure M provided that beginning in Fiscal Year 1998-99 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the tax only upon a finding that the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as shown by the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all items, has increased since the 1997 index year; and

WHEREAS, Measure M provided that any tax rate adjustment imposed by the City Council pursuant to the ordinance shall not exceed five percent of the tax rate imposed during the immediately preceding fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on this ordinance to increase the Measure M special parcel tax was held on June 2, 2015 at 5:30 p.m. in City Hall, One Frank H. Ogawa Plaza, Oakland, California; now, therefore,

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council of the City of Oakland hereby determines that the preceding recitals are true and correct and hereby adopts and incorporates them into this Ordinance.

- 2. The Oakland City Council hereby finds that the Consumer Price Index for all items in the San Francisco Bay Area was 245.02 for calendar year 2013 and 251.99 for calendar year 2014.
- 3. The cost-of-living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area as shown by the Consumer Price Index, has increased 2.8 percent from calendar year 2013 to calendar year 2014.
- 4. The Measure M special tax rate upward adjustment shall be 2.8 percent, effective July 1, 2015.
- 5. The following rate structure will be imposed on parcels within the City of Oakland effective July 1, 2015 for FY 2015-16:

6. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately on final adoption if it receives six or more affirmative votes; otherwise, it shall become effective upon the seventh day after final adoption.

NOTICE AND DIGEST

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A FISCAL YEAR 2015-16 INCREASE TO A SPECIAL TAX IMPOSED FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX, AND PURSUANT TO THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES RETENTION ACT OF 1997 (MEASURE M)

This Ordinance would authorize an increase of the special tax imposed for emergency medical services pursuant to Measure M for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 in the amount 2.8%, which represents the cost-of-living increase based on the San Francisco Bay Area Consumer Price Index from calendar year 2013 to calendar year 2014.
