RESOLUTION APPROVING MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF OAKLAND AND THE DEPUTY ATTORNEY V AND SPECIAL COUNSEL ASSOCIATION, REPRESENTING EMPLOYEES IN REPRESENTATION UNIT U41 COVERING THE PERIOD OF JULY 1,2003 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2005.

#### **SUMMARY**

The City of Oakland has reached a tentative agreement on wages and other terms and conditions of employment with the Deputy City Attorney V and Special Counsel Association. Key provisions include increases to salaries and a three year agreement term, effective July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2005.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed three-year contract (retroactive to July 1, 2002 and through June 30, 2005) would cost the City an estimated \$59,890 for FY 2002-03, \$31,741 for FY 2003-04 (on top of the "baseline" amount for FY 2002-03), and another \$16,488 for FY 2004-05 (beyond the cumulative baseline for the prior years). Overall, the "baseline" payment for FY 2004-05 is estimated at \$108,119 (i.e., total of the three years' incremental increases), while retroactive payments for FY 2002-03 and FY 2003-04 are costed to be \$59,890 and \$91,631, respectively. Details are provided in the chart below:

Note: The annual amounts provided above are not cumulative, and reflect an increase from the prior year "baseline" amount.

There are budgeted appropriations to cover the cost of the MOU increases detailed above for FY 2004-05 (estimated at \$108,119). Retroactive increases for FY 2002-03 and FY 2003-04 (estimated at \$59,890 and \$91,631, respectively) will need to be paid within the FY 2004-05 budget baseline.

There are sufficient appropriations to cover the costs of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) salary increases detailed above for FY 2002-2005. Retroactive salaries will be absorbed within the existing Departmental budget. The costs identified above also account for changes to the original employee retirement contribution (3% pick up) and the change to the retirement formula for FY 04-05.

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ATTORNEY V AND SPECIAL COUNSEL ASSOCIATION

#### BACKGROUND

This labor agreement represents the culmination of negotiations that began in the Fall 2003 with representatives of the Deputy Attorney V and Special Counsel Association representing seven employees in the Office of the City Attorney. Negotiations were conducted from the Fall 2003 through Summer 2004. This is the first agreement for the Association. Items of significance include salary increases of 6 percent retroactive to July 6, 2002, 3 percent effective June 21, 2003, and 1 percent effective July 3, 2004.

### **KEY ISSUE AND IMPACTS**

This tentative agreement brings the salary increases of Deputy City Attorney V's and Special Counsel in line with those of other full-time professional personnel in the City Attorney's Office.

#### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

There are no environmental opportunities or impacts associated with approval of this resolution.

#### DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

There is no impact on residents with disabilities and/or senior citizens relative to accessibility.

#### RECOMMENDATION(S) AND RATIONALE

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the tentative agreements negotiated with the Deputy Attorney V and Special Counsel Association. The tentative agreements meet many of the interests of both parties, and represent a fair and reasonable settlement given the circumstances.

## ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the resolution.
