RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE A THREE-YEAR GRANT OF \$3,000,000 FROM KAISER **PERMANENTE** NORTHERN CALIFORNIA FUND FOR COMMUNITY BENEFIT AT THE EAST BAY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION TO LAUNCH THE OAKLAND UNIVERSAL ACCESS INITIATIVE IN SCHOOLS AND TO EXECUTE A GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF OAKLAND AND THE OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$75,000 IN YEAR ONE FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2008 TO JUNE 30, 2009, WITH TWO CONSECUTIVE TWELVE MONTH RENEWAL OPTIONS IN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$75,000 EACH YEAR, AND TO EXECUTE A GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF OAKLAND AND THE ALAMEDA COUNTY HEALTH CARE SERVICES AGENCY IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$551,000 IN YEAR ONE FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2008 TO JUNE 30, 2009. WITH TWO CONSECUTIVE TWELVE MONTH RENEWAL OPTIONS IN AMOUNTS NOT TO EXCEED \$1,117,250 IN YEAR **TWO, AND \$1,061,750 IN YEAR THREE**

WHEREAS, The City of Oakland would like to accept and appropriate the Kaiser Permanente Northern California Community Benefit Fund grant at the East Bay Community Foundation grant in the amount of \$3,000,000 to launch the Oakland Universal Access Initiative in Schools; and

WHEREAS, the three-year program period for the grant is from June 15, 2008 through June 30, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the four zip codes in Alameda County with the highest rates of teen births are located in Oakland and the six zip codes in Alameda County with the highest rates of chlamydia diagnosis among youth are located in Oakland and the six zip codes in Alameda County with the highest rates of assault hospitalization among youth are all located in Oakland, and the three zip codes in Alameda County with the highest rates of unintentional injury hospitalization among youth are located in Oakland; and

WHEREAS, School Based Health Centers define health in the broadest context and therefore offer a diverse range of services intended to holistically support student wellness, including medical services, mental health services and health education; and

WHEREAS, funds received will be used to launch the Oakland Universal Access in Schools Initiative enabling additional students in Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) to receive comprehensive site-based health and wellness services at 10 new School-Based Health Centers (SBHCs); and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland would like to enter into a grant agreement with the Alameda County Health Services Agency (ACHCSA), in an amount not to exceed \$551,000 in Year 1 Fiscal Year 2008-09, \$1,117,250 in Year 2 Fiscal Year 2009-10, and \$1,061,750 in Year 3 Fiscal Year 2010-11, to set up, manage and evaluate School-Based Health Centers; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland would like to enter into a grant agreement with the OUSD, in an amount not to exceed \$75,000 annually, to coordinate and support planning and implementation of School-Based Health Centers; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized to accept and appropriate the aforesaid grant in the amount of \$3,000,000 over a three year period to launch the Oakland Universal Access in Schools Initiative; and

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized to accept and appropriate the aforesaid grant in the amount of \$3,000,000 into Social Services Grant Fund (2994), DHS Administration Unit Organization (78111), Kaiser OUSD Health Project (G347510); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby authorizes the City Administrator or his designee to execute a grant agreement between the City and the Oakland Unified School District in an amount not to exceed \$75,000 for fiscal year 2008-9, with two twelve-month options to renew for amounts not to exceed \$75,000 per year, and a grant agreement between the City of Oakland and Alameda County Health Care Services Agency in an amount not to exceed \$551,000 in Fiscal Year 2008-09 (Year 1), \$1,117,250 in Fiscal Year 2009-10 (Year 2), and \$1,061,750 in Fiscal Year 2010-11 (Year 3); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents, including but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, modifications, payment requests, and related actions which may be necessary in accordance with the basic purpose of this resolution, at no additional costs; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Office of the City Attorney has approved this resolution as to form and legality and a copy is on file at the Office of the City Clerk.
