

- 3. Adopt a Resolution authorizing the application, acceptance and appropriation of grant funds for the Murray-Hayden Program from the California Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe Neighborhood Parks and Coastal Protection Act Of 2002 for the following projects: The Main Library Children's Courtyard in the amount of one hundred forty-six thousand dollars (\$146,000); Raimondi Field in the amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000); and, Peralta Hacienda Historic Park in the amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) (002431-2c)
