RESOLUTION DECLARING THE WEEK OF MAY 16 THROUGH 22, 2010 AS HEPATITIS B AWARENESS WEEK IN THE CITY OF OAKLAND AND ENCOURAGING RESIDENTS TO SUPPORT PROGRAMS TO PROMOTE AWARENESS AND TREATMENT OF THE DISEASE THROUGHOUT NORTHERN CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2010 the City of Oakland wishes to recognize Hepatitis B Awareness Week in Oakland; and

WHEREAS, the Hepatitis B virus (HBV) attacks the liver and can cause one in four people to die of liver cancer if not properly monitored and treated; and

WHEREAS, HBV is a global epidemic that is killing one million people every year and effecting approximately 350 million people worldwide; and

WHEREAS, many with the virus often do not realize that they are infected, with symptoms not present until it is often too late; and

WHEREAS, we have the resources to vaccinate our citizens, however many immigrants. especially those from Asia and the Pacific Islands, have not received the vaccination; and

WHEREAS, this is especially pertinent as Alameda County has one of the fastest growing Asian populations in the Bay Area; and

WHEREAS, the Jade Ribbon Youth Council will partner with several other organizations to implement outreach events throughout Oakland; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Oakland City Council does hereby declare the week of May 16 through 22, 2010 as Hepatitis B Awareness Week in the City of Oakland, and be it
