Re: A Report and Proposed Resolution Authorizing the Re-Designation of Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) in Domestic Violence Restraining Order System Funds for the Development of Two Official Recognition Applications for Submission to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Executive Office for Weed and Seed, for the Establishment of New Weed and Seed Sites in East and West Oakland, and Authorizing a Professional Services Agreement with Resource Development Associates in an Amount Not to Exceed Thirty-Three Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$33,980) for the Development of the Official Recognition Applications

SUMMARY


The Police Department proposes the re-designation of \$35,000 from the State of California, Domestic Violence Restraining Order System fund account to facilitate the development of two Official Recognition applications for submission to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs (USDOJ/OJP), Executive Office for Weed and Seed, for the establishment of new Weed and Seed sites in both East and West Oakland. The report also authorizes a Professional Services Agreement in an amount not to exceed \$33,980 with the Resource Development Associates (RDA) for the development of the Official Recognition applications. Acceptance/approval of the City's Official Recognition applications will confer Weed and Seed status on the proposed sites, which in turn will permit the City to apply for competitive Weed and Seed grants from the USDOJ/OJP

This initial minimal investment of \$35,000 will afford the Police Department an opportunity to acquire grant funds of up to \$1,125,000 for each of the two, newly proposed Weed and Seed sites (\$225,000 annually per site for up to five years).

FISCAL IMPACT

The State of California, Domestic Violence Restraining Order System Fund, previously allocated funds to the Oakland Police Department for domestic violence abatement services. These funds are held in the State of California Fund: 2159; Org.: 102410; Project Account: G236410. Funds for the proposed initiative will be allocated as follows:

BACKGROUND

For the last three years, the State of California has issued discretionary domestic violence abatement funds to the Police Department. These funds are allocated based on the number of restraining orders issued to perpetrators of domestic violence during the calendar year preceding each year's distribution. Although the State does not mandate any specific use(s) for the funds, agencies are encouraged to use the proceeds in a manner conducive to domestic violence abatement efforts.

Incidents of domestic violence often lay at the root of many other violence-related offenses, including drug use/abuse and gun-related crimes. Accordingly, the proposed re-designation of the domestic violence restraining order funds retains the Police Department's basic tenets of domestic violence abatement efforts.

Of the original 2002 funding allocation of \$27,599.78 (Resolution 77093 C.M.S., dated April 30, 2002), a total of \$6,645.80 remains unspent. For the 2003 funding allocation of \$28,575.20 (Resolution 77772 C.M.S., dated April 29, 2003), a total of \$28,575.20 remains unspent. The combined available balance totals \$35,221. The Police Department proposes to re-designate \$35,000 of these funds to facilitate the development of Official Recognition applications for submission to the USDOJ/OJP for new Weed and Seed sites in both East and West Oakland.

Operation Weed and Seed

The USDOJ/OJP established Operation Weed and Seed in 1991 as a community-based, multiagency partnership approach to law enforcement, crime prevention and neighborhood restoration. The goals of Weed and Seed are to control violent crime, drug trafficking, and drugrelated crime in targeted high-crime neighborhoods, thereby providing a safe environment for residents.

In February 2002, the City received Official Recognition status for a new Weed and Seed site in West Oakland. The target area is comprised of portions of Community Policing Beats 6 and 7. The Department now proposes the development of two additional Weed and Seed sites in both East Oakland (encompassing Community Policing Beats 33 and 34) and an additional site in the "Lower Bottom" portion of West Oakland (encompassing Community Policing Beats 2Y and 2X).

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

Police Department staff, working in collaboration with the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Northern District of California, the Neighborhood Service Coordinators assigned to each of the respective target areas, and the chairpersons for Beat 33, Beat 34, Beat 2Y, and Beat 2X Neighborhood Crime Prevention Councils (NCPC), are focusing on the development of Weed and Seed Steering Committees. The Steering Committees will consist of NCPC representatives,

Item: <u>5</u> Public Safety Cmte. June 8, 2004 community residents, and representatives of local community organizations and public agencies serving the target areas. The steering committees will have responsibility for overseeing the implementation of the Weed and Seed strategy and will meet (at a minimum) bi-monthly, to ensure effective coordination in establishing the program's strategic plan.

Preliminarily, law enforcement planning efforts will focus on the following communityidentified concerns within each of the newly proposed Weed and Seed target areas in East and West Oakland:

- Domestic Violence Victim Advocacy and Batterer Intervention Services
- Prostitution Abatement
- Prevention of Drug-Related Crimes
- Gun Violence Abatement
- Motorcycle Gang Violence Abatement

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The four basic components of the Weed and Seed strategy are Law Enforcement, Community Policing, Prevention, Intervention and Treatment, and Community Restoration. Program goals to be developed in relationship to each newly proposed Weed and Seed sites shall be in keeping with the following:

Law Enforcement

- Reduce the level of domestic violence within the community
- Reduce the level of drug-related crime within the community
- Reduce the level of prostitution crimes within the community
- Reduce the level of gang violence within the community

• Community Policing

- Reduce occurrences and increase safety for family victims of domestic violence
- Reduce the number of locations considered "hot spots" for drug sales and use

• Prevention, Intervention, and Treatment

- Establish of a community center where all children, youth, and families feel safe
- Support and recruit parents to take an active role in their child's education, school governance, and support activities
- Provide children with safe afterschool environments
- Neighborhood Restoration
 - Restore the community by encouraging home ownership and the rehabilitation of substandard properties


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Resource Development Associates

Resource Development Associates (RDA), based in Lafayette, CA, has over 20 years of proven experience working with both public and nonprofit agencies as a consultant in areas inclusive of planning and grant-writing, program evaluation, data analysis and integration, as well as organizational development. RDA staff will work collaboratively with the Police Department and community-based stakeholders within each of the proposed target areas to develop the strategic plan for the Official Recognition applications. This process shall include concrete definition of the issues of crime and other community-based concerns, formulation of the proposed strategies, recruitment of program partners, and the development of processes for monitoring and evaluating results.

The Police Department previously utilized the services of RDA in the development of the current West Oakland Weed and Seed Initiative Official Recognition application. This application was subsequently approved for funding by the USDOJ/OJP, Executive Office for Weed and Seed. Other noteworthy strategic plans and/or grant proposals completed using the services of RDA include:

Application Process and Timeline

To gain eligibility for a new Weed and Seed site in both East and West Oakland, the USDOJ/OJP mandates that applicants submit an Official Recognition Application in the Fall. The timeframe for submission of the City of Oakland's applications to the point of receipt of grant funds is as follows:

October 2004	-	Official Recognition Applications Submitted
Spring 2005	-	Recognitions Awarded
October 2005	-	Competitive Grant Applications Submitted
Spring 2006	-	Grant Award Notices Issued
Fall 2006	-	Grant Funds Allocated

Preliminary Approval from the Office of the U.S. Attorney

Both of the proposed Official Recognition Applications will require written approval, prior to submission, by the Office of the U.S. Attorney, Northern District of California. Police Department staff recently contacted the U.S. Attorney's Office on this matter and have received preliminary approval to proceed with the formal application process for both of the proposed sites.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic</u>

Future funding allocations associated with the establishment of the proposed Weed and Seed sites in both East and West Oakland will ensure enhanced service delivery in the target areas.

Environmental

Environmental opportunities will be identified as part of the program implementation, addressing such issues as neighborhood revitalization and the clean-up/mitigation of blighted properties.

Social Equity

The Weed and Seed program is a "social equity" initiative. Grant funds and other resources contributed by partner agencies and the volunteer work of community residents and businesses, are directed toward achieving increased service levels and long-term benefits for the target areas. The program goals will be evaluated annually by the Weed and Seed Steering Committees and

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the committees will develop a plan of action aimed at sustaining the gains made beyond the fiveyear period of USDOJ funding.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

Both Weed and Seed sites will operate in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Older Americans Act. Meeting places will be accessible and senior citizens will be represented on the Steering Committees.

RECOMMENDATION

The Oakland Police Department recommends that the City Council authorize the redesignation of \$35,000 in Domestic Violence Restraining Order System Funds for the development of Official Recognition Applications to facilitate the establishment of new Weed and Seed sites in both East and West Oakland and authorize a Professional Services Agreement in an amount not to exceed \$33,980 with Resource Development Associates for the development of the Official Recognition applications.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REDESIGNATION OF THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$35,000) IN DOMESTIC VIOLENCE RESTRAINING ORDER SYSTEM FUNDS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT TWO OFFICIAL RECOGNITION APPLICATIONS FOR OF SUBMISSION TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS, EXECUTIVE OFFICE FOR WEED AND SEED, FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW WEED AND SEED SITES IN EAST AND WEST OAKLAND, AND AUTHORIZING A PROFESSIONAL WITH RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES AGREEMENT ASSOCIATES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THIRTY-THREE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY DOLLARS(\$33,980) FOR DEVELOPMENT OF THE OFFICIAL RECOGNITION THE APPLICATIONS

WHEREAS, the State of California Domestic Violence Restraining Order System Fund previously awarded the City of Oakland funds associated with a percentage of funds collected by the State through fines associated with the issuance of restraining orders against perpetrators of domestic violence; and

WHEREAS, in calendar year 2002 \$27,599.78 was awarded from the State and accepted through Resolution 77093 C.M.S., dated April 30, 2002, and in calendar year 2003, \$28,575.20 was awarded from the State and accepted through Resolution 77772 C.M.S., dated April 29, 2003; and

WHEREAS, unexpended funds for 2002 total \$6,645.80 and unexpended funds for 2003 total \$\$28,575.20; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department proposes the redesignation of \$35,000 of the unexpended funds to facilitate the development of Official Recognition Applications for submission to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Executive Office for Weed and Seed for the development of two new Weed and Seed sites in East and West Oakland; and

WHEREAS, the proposed redesignation of funds remains in keeping with the Police Department's basic tenets of domestic violence abatement efforts, and

WHEREAS, the Police Department desires to enter into a Professional Services Agreement with Resource Development Associates (RDA) in an amount not to exceed thirty-three thousand nine hundred and eighty dollars (\$33,980) for the development of the two Official Recognition Applications associated with this initiative; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the services provided pursuant to the agreement with Resource Development Associates authorized hereunder are of a professional, scientific or technical nature and are temporary in nature; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds the agreement with Resource Development Associates shall not result in a loss of employment or salary by any person having permanent status in the competitive service; now, therefore be it





RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby authorizes the redesignation of \$35,000 in Domestic Violence Restraining Orders System funds from the State of California Fund: 2159; Org.: 102410; Project Account: G236410, for the development of two Official Recognition applications for new Weed and Seed sites in East and West Oakland; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or her designee is hereby authorized to enter into a Professional Services Agreement with Resource Development Associates in an amount not to exceed \$33,980 for the development of the Official Recognition Applications; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby appoints the City Administrator as agent of the City to conduct all negotiations, applications, agreements, and related actions which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned professional services agreement; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Attorney shall review and approve said agreement with Resource Development Associates and a copy of the fully executed agreement shall be placed on file with the Office of the City Clerk.
