Ordinance Authorizing A Fiscal Year 2010-11 Increase To A Special Tax Imposed For Library Services In Accordance With The Library Services Retention And Enhancement Act Of 2004 (Measure Q) And Setting June 15,

2010 As The Date For A Public Hearing

#### **SUMMARY**

Attached for City Council consideration is an ordinance authorizing a FY 2010-11 adjustment, consistent with the Consumer Price Index, to the special parcel tax for the Library Services Retention and Enhancement Act of 2004.

In March 2004, the electorate of Oakland approved, by more than a two-thirds majority, the extension of the Library Services and Retention Act, Measure Q (formerly known as Measure O). The act re-authorized and increased a special parcel tax on residential and non-residential parcels for the purpose of raising revenue to retain and enhance library services. The term of the tax is 20 years, commencing July 1, 2004 and ending June 30, 2024.

The Measure Q legislation also authorizes the City Council to increase the tax annually, consistent with the San Francisco Bay Area CPI changes. A 0.7 percent increase to the Measure Q special parcel tax rates is proposed for FY 2010-11, reflecting the 2009 CPI increase for the San Francisco Bay Area.

A public hearing on the proposed ordinance to increase the Measure Q special parcel tax is scheduled for June 15, 2010 at 6:30 p.m.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The FY 2010-11 estimated parcel tax revenue from Measure Q is \$13.0 million, including the proposed rate increase. The proposed rate increase represents approximately \$94,338 of the FY 2010-11 estimated revenue.

The Measure Q legislation stipulates that the City Council may collect this tax only if the General Fund appropriation for Library services is maintained at a level that is no lower than the General Fund appropriation for FY 2000-01, which was \$9,059,989. The Library's amended FY 2010-11 General Purpose Fund budget is \$10,905,207, thereby meeting this mandated minimum.

## **BACKGROUND**

The Measure Q legislation allows the City Council, upon making proper findings, to increase the tax rate based on cost-of-living changes in the San Francisco Bay Area to a maximum level of five percent over the immediately preceding fiscal year.

The following table summarizes the historical tax rate increases that have been authorized pursuant to City Council action since the legislation was enacted:

#### **KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS**

The proposed ordinance applies an adjustment of 0.7 percent to the current Measure Q special parcel tax amount, effective July 1, 2010. This increase is per the actual change in the San Francisco Bay Area CPI during 2008. The proposed increase applies on a fiscal year basis (i.e., July 1<sup>st</sup> – June 30<sup>th</sup>).

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A FISCAL YEAR 2010-11 INCREASE TO A SPECIAL TAX IMPOSED FOR LIBRARY SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LIBRARY SERVICES RETENTION AND ENHANCEMENT ACT OF 2004 (MEASURE Q) AND SETTING JUNE 1, 2010 AS THE DATE FOR A PUBLIC HEARING

WHEREAS, the voters of Oakland in 2004 approved Measure Q, the Library Services Retention and Enhancement Act of 2004, which extended the original Measure O Library Services Retention and Enhancement of 1994, through June 30, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Measure Q continued imposition of this special tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by Section 6 of the ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Measure Q legislation allows the City Council to increase the tax annually upon a finding that the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as shown on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all items, has increased since the 1994 index year; and

WHEREAS, the Measure Q legislation further provides that any tax rate adjustment imposed by the City Council pursuant to the ordinance shall not exceed five percent of the tax rate imposed during the immediately preceding fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on this ordinance to increase the Measure Q special parcel tax was held on June 15, 2010 at 6:30 p.m. in City Hall, One Frank H. Ogawa Plaza, Oakland, California; now, therefore,

## THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Oakland City Council hereby finds that the Consumer Price Index for all items in the San Francisco Bay Area was 222.8 for calendar year 2008 and 224.4 for calendar year 2009.
- 2. The cost-of-living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area as shown by the Consumer Price Index, has increased 0.7 percent between calendar year 2008 and calendar year 2009.
- 3. The Measure Q special tax rate upward adjustment shall be 0.7 percent, effective July 1, 2010.
- 4. The following rate structure will be imposed on parcels within the City of Oakland effective July 1, 2010 for FY 2010-11:

# ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A FISCAL YEAR 2010-11 INCREASE TO A SPECIAL TAX IMPOSED FOR LIBRARY SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LIBRARY SERVICES RETENTION AND ENHANCEMENT ACT OF 2004 (MEASURE Q)

## **NOTICE AND DIGEST**

This Ordinance authorizes an increase to a special tax imposed by the Library Services Retention and Enhancement Act of 1994 (Measure O) continued by the Library Services Retention and Enhancement Act of 2004 (Measure Q), the latter of which was approved by the voters in March 2004. The Act allows rates to be adjusted for changes in the Consumer Price Index, in an amount not to exceed five percent (5.0%), as provided in Section 7(b) of the original Measure O legislation (Resolution No. 70776 C.M.S.) and continued in the Measure Q legislation (Resolution No. 78223 C.M.S.). The proposed changes are a total increase of 0.7 percent for FY 2010-11. Effective July 1, 2010 the Single Family Residential rate would increase from \$85.07 to \$85.69, the Multiple Unit Residential rate would increase from \$58.11 to \$58.53, and the Non-Residential rate would increase from \$43.57 to \$43.89.

On June 15, 2010, the City Council of Oakland, California will consider an ordinance authorizing an increase to the special parcel tax imposed for library services in accordance with the Library Retention and Enhancement Act of 2004 (Measure Q). The ordinance proposes an increase, effective July 1, 2010, of 0.7% consistent with the Consumer Price Index for the San Francisco Bay Area. The Public Hearing is set for Tuesday, June 15, 2010 at 6:30 p.m., to be held before the City Council in the Council Chambers located on the Third Floor of City Hall, #1 Frank H. Ogawa Plaza, Oakland, California.
