## Summary of the Bill

Proposition 1C included funding of \$100,000,000 for the Affordable Housing Innovation Fund

This bill would establish the Environmentally Sustainable Affordable Housing Program under the administration of the Department of Housing and Community Development, consisting of the Construction Liability Insurance Reform Pilot Program; the Green Building, Energy Efficiency, and Building Design Program; and the Affordable Housing for Teachers Program, all of which would be under the administration of the department.

The bill would require the department to fund these programs, with bond funds transferred to the Affordable Housing Innovation Fund that are made available to the department for that purpose.

The bill would establish the Construction Liability Insurance Reform Pilot Program under the administration of the department for the purpose of promoting best practices for residential construction quality control in housing programs sponsored by the department or by the California Housing Finance Agency, as a means of reducing insurance rates for condominium developers in California.

The bill would establish the Green Building, Energy Efficiency, and Building Design Program under the administration of the department for the purpose of promoting the use of green building to assist in the implementation of the goals established by the Climate Action Team Report to the Governor and Legislature, which identified strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, including continued implementation of the Green Building Initiative.

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The bill would establish the Affordable Housing for Teachers Program under the administration of the department for the purpose of establishing a pilot program of assistance to school districts and community college districts attempting to attract and retain district employees, including teachers, through provision of oncampus housing.

# **Positive Factors for Oakland**

This bill would provide funding for several new housing programs of benefit to Oakland:

- 1. The Construction Liability Insurance Reform Pilot Program could result in a reduction of insurance costs associated with developing condominiums, which would remove a significant barrier to the development of such housing.
- 2. The Green Building, Energy Efficiency and Building Design Program would promote green building techniques, which is also a City of Oakland objective.
- 3. The Affordable Housing for Teachers Program would provide housing incentives that might improve recruitment and retention of teachers.

# **Negative Factors for Oakland**

This is not the only legislation regarding the Affordable Housing Innovation Fund. One alternative bill would provide funding for a Housing Trust Fund matching grant program. Oakland has an existing (as yet unfunded) Housing Trust Fund tied to the Jobs/Housing Impact Fee, and if an Inclusionary Housing program is adopted, in-lieu fees could also be deposited into this trust fund. The proposal for a matching fund would allow those City funds to leverage more outside funding for housing. That provision is not contained in this bill

It is too early yet to determine which of the several bills that have been introduced regarding this funding have the best chances for success.

### Introduced by Assembly Member Garcia

February 22, 2007

An act to add Chapter 11.6 (commencing with Section 50810) to Part 2 of Division 31 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to housing, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 792, as amended, Garcia. Environmentally Sustainable Affordable Housing Program.

Existing law, the Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act of 2006, authorizes the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$2,850,000,000 pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law. Proceeds from the sale of these bonds are required to be used to finance various existing housing programs, capital outlay related to infill development, brownfield cleanup that promotes infill development, and housing-related parks. The act establishes the Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund of 2006 in the State Treasury and requires the sum of \$1,500,000,000 to be deposited in the Affordable Housing Account, which the act establishes in the fund. The act continuously appropriates the money in the account in accordance with a specified schedule that requires, among other things, the transfer of the sum of \$100,000,000 to the Affordable Housing Innovation Fund, which the act establishes in the State Treasury, to be administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development and expended for competitive grants or loans to sponsoring entities that develop, own, lend, or invest in affordable housing, and to create pilot programs to demonstrate

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innovative, cost-saving approaches to creating or preserving affordable housing.

This bill would establish the Environmentally Sustainable Affordable Housing Program under the administration of the department, consisting of the Construction Liability Insurance Reform Pilot Program; the Green Building, Energy Efficiency, and Building Design Program; and the Affordable Housing for Teachers Program, all of which would be under the administration of the department.

### The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 11.6 (commencing with Section 50810) 1

- 2 is added to Part 2 of Division 31 of the Health and Safety Code, 3 to read:

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### 1 Chapter 11.6. Environmentally Sustainable Affordable 2 Housing Program

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4 50810. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the 5 Environmentally Sustainable Affordable Housing Act.

6 50812. The Environmentally Sustainable Affordable Housing 7 Program is hereby established under the administration of the 8 department, and shall consist of the Construction Liability 9 Insurance Reform Pilot Program established under Section 50816, the Green Building, Energy Efficiency, and Building Design 10 11 Program established under Section 50818, and the Affordable 12 Housing for Teachers Program established under Section 50820, 13 all of which shall be administered by the department.

14 50814. (a) The department shall fund the programs established 15 under this chapter with any funds that are made available to the 16 department for that purpose under subparagraph (F) of paragraph 17 (1) of subdivision (a) of Section 53545.

18 (b) The department shall issue a periodic notice of funding 19 availability specifying the funds that are available for each program 20 established under this chapter, the per-project limit for each 21 program, and the competitive criteria upon which projects will be 22 selected.

(c) From the funds made available to the department as described
 in subdivision (a), the department shall make the following
 allocations:

(1) The total initial allocation to be distributed among the
programs established under this chapter shall be equal to 25 percent
of the total made available to the department as described in
subdivision (a).

under paragraph (1) shall be distributed among the programs under
 the initial notice of funding availability process.

33 (3) Funds remaining after the allocations made under paragraphs

34 (1) and (2) shall be distributed among the programs under

aggregate, distributions made under this paragraph shall be based
 on relative demand for program funds and expenditure rates.

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1 50816. (a) The Construction Liability Insurance Reform Pilot

2 Program is hereby established under the administration of the 3 department.

(b) The purpose of the program is to promote best practices for
residential construction quality control in housing programs
sponsored by the department or the California Housing Finance
Agency, as a means of reducing insurance rates for condominium
developers in this state.

9 (c) Funds shall be made available in the form of grants for 10 predevelopment costs of condominium projects funded by the 11 department or the California Housing Finance Agency that utilize 12 enhanced construction oversight and monitoring programs and 13 processes including, but not limited to, video recording of the 14 construction process, use of quality control manuals, and increased 15 quality control inspections.

16 50818. (a) The Green Building, Energy Efficiency, and 17 Building Design Program is hereby established under the 18 administration of the department.

(b) The purpose of the program is to encourage the use of green
building to assist in the implementation of the goals established
by the Climate Action Team Report to the Governor and
Legislature, which identified strategies to reduce greenhouse gas
emissions, including continued implementation of the Green
Building Initiative.

(c) Funds shall be made available in the form of grants to finance
a portion of the costs of incorporating additional energy-efficiency,
green building, and universal design accessibility features in
projects funded by the department or the California Housing
Finance Agency.

30 50820. (a) The Affordable Housing for Teachers Program is 31 hereby established under the administration of the department.

(b) The purpose of the program is to establish a pilot program
 of assistance to school districts and community college districts

34 attempting to attract and retain district employees, including 35 teachers, through provision of oncampus housing.

(c) Funds shall be made available in the form of grants to school
 districts or community college districts for predevelopment costs

38 associated with creating housing for district employees, including

39 teachers, located on campus.

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1 SEC. 2. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the 2 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety within 3 the meaning of Article IV of the Constitution and shall go into 4 immediate effect. The facts constituting the necessity are:

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5 In order to ensure that available funds for needed housing

6 programs are distributed as quickly as possible, it is necessary that 7 this act take effect immediately.

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
