## RECOGNIZING DANIELLE JOHNSON AS CASTLEMONT HIGH SCHOOL'S FIRST FEMALE FOOTBALL PLAYER

- **WHEREAS,** This resolution seeks to recognize Danielle Johnson's outstanding performance as Castlemont High School's first female football player; and
- **WHEREAS,** Danielle is an outgoing and ambitious 16-year-old student who began playing sports at 8 years old. She currently plays tackle football, flag football, and basketball at Castlemont High School; and
- **WHEREAS,** Danielle has received numerous awards and trophies for her performance in football and basketball; and
- WHEREAS, Danielle excels academically and is committed to serving her community; and
- **WHEREAS,** Danielle works at Youth Uprising, non-profit organization dedicated to supporting the leadership development of youth in East Oakland; and
- **WHEREAS,** Danielle has goals of attending the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) or Louisiana State University after completing high school. She wants to major in engineering; and
- **WHEREAS**, Danielle aims to play college football and ultimately play professionally for the Extreme Football League (X League); and
- **WHEREAS,** Danielle's tenacity to become one of the first African American female football players for a high school team has paved the way for other young women to enter this male-dominated sport; and
- WHEREAS, Danielle played a crucial part in leading the Castlemont Knights' victory against the Los Angeles Dorsey Dons in the final minutes of the Oakland-Los Angeles Neighborhood Football Classic in September of this year; and

**WHEREAS,** Due to her amazing support of her team, Castlemont High School's football coach, Edward Washington, selected Danielle's helmet to be displayed at the new California High School Football Hall of Fame during the team's visit to the Rose Bowl Stadium in Pasadena, CA; and

**WHEREAS,** Castlemont's varsity football team became the first high school football team to visit the exhibit and witness where Danielle's helmet will be permanently showcased for years to come; now therefore be it

**RESOLVED:** That the Oakland City Council does hereby recognize Danielle Johnson, a trailblazer and inspiration to East Oakland youth, as the first female Castlemont High School.
