**A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 85277 C.M.S.  
WHICH AUTHORIZED FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015 CULTURAL  
SERVICES GRANTS TO CORRECT THE NAME OF INDIVIDUAL  
ARTIST GRANTEE RAMON RAMOS ALAYO**

**WHEREAS**, in 1985, City Council adopted the first arts funding policies and procedures for the City of Oakland, establishing a panel system of evaluating funding proposals and distributing City funds to the arts; and

**WHEREAS**, the Cultural Funding Program is the City's funding mechanism to support Oakland-based nonprofit organizations and artists providing arts and cultural activities to the public; and

**WHEREAS**, the mission of the Cultural Funding Program is to fund Oakland-based art and cultural activities that reflect the diversity of the city for citizens of and visitors to Oakland, focusing on the key areas of General Support, Neighborhood Arts, and Arts Education, through four grantmaking categories for Individual Artist Projects, Organization Projects, Organizational Support, and Art in the Schools; and

**WHEREAS**, during August, 2014, three funding review panels convened and forwarded recommendations to award eighty-six (86) grants to seventy-one (71) organizations and individual artists proposing to provide arts and cultural programming in the city of Oakland; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 10, 2014, the City of Oakland Funding Advisory Committee met to review the grant recommendations received from the review panels, and voted unanimously to recommend to City Council that these grants be funded in the amounts listed herein; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 12, 2014, the Life Enrichment Committee of City Council approved specific funding recommendations to nonprofit organizations and individual artists, and forwarded these recommendations to the full City Council for approval; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 18, 2014, the Oakland City Council approved the funding recommendations to nonprofit organizations and individual artists as follows:

**WHEREAS**, after adoption of Resolution No. 85277 C.M.S., City staff become aware that the name of Individual Artist grantee Ramon Ramos Alayo had been incorrectly listed as “Ramon Ramos Ramos” and therefore the grant agreement with Mr. Alayo could not be executed; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Oakland Funding Advisory Committee met on March 11, 2015 and voted unanimously to recommend to the City Council that a correction to Mr. Alayo’s name be made through an amendment to Resolution No. 85277, in order that the agreement could be executed and the intended grant awarded to Mr. Alayo; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED:** That the Oakland City Council hereby amends Resolution No. 85277 C.M.S. to correct the name of individual artist grantee Ramon Ramos Alayo, and authorizes a grant to the individual artist listed below, not to exceed the amount detailed:

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the above grant shall be paid from the Fiscal Year 2014-15 funds budgeted in the amount of \$3,799.24 in General Purpose Fund (1010), CCAD-Cultural Programs Org (90523), Undetermined Project (0000000); and in the amount of \$1,199.76 from the Transient Occupancy Tax surcharge in the Measure C: Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) Surcharge Fund (2419), Cultural Arts & Marketing Org (85511), Cultural Funding Program TOT Project (P391850); and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That in the event the above grant is not encumbered, that the funds shall revert to the Cultural Funding Program for use in support of the next highest ranking application; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the City Council hereby appoints the City Administrator or his designated representative to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents, including but not limited to agreements, amendments, modifications, payment requests, and related actions which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned grant, without returning to Council; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the Office of the City Attorney will review the grant agreements for form and legality, and a copy will be filed in the Office of the City Clerk.
