

## REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND

RESOLUTION No. 2003 - 17 - C.M.S.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING AGENCY RESOLUTION NO. 02-17 C.M.S., WHICH AUTHORIZED AN AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT LOAN NOT TO EXCEED \$1,000,000 FOR THE SISTER THEA BOWMAN MANOR II PROJECT LOCATED AT 6400 SAN PABLO AVENUE, TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF UNITS FROM 46 TO 44

**WHEREAS**, on March 12, 2002, the Redevelopment Agency passed Resolution No. 02-17 C.M.S. authorizing a housing development loan not to exceed \$1,000,000 for the Sister Thea Bowman Manor II project, a 46 unit affordable housing project at 6400 San Pablo Avenue in the City of Oakland (the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 02-17 C.M.S. stated that 45 Project units will be rented at prices affordable to households earning no more than 60% of area median income; and

WHEREAS, the Project has now been redesigned to include a total of 44 units; and

WHEREAS, all 44 units will be rented at prices affordable to households earning no more than 60% of area median income; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED:** That the Redevelopment Agency hereby amends Resolution No. 02-17 C.M.S. to authorize the reduction in Project units from 46 to 44.
