RESOLUTION DECLARING MAY 2006 AS NATIONAL OLDER AMERICANS MONTH

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland is joining other cities, towns, and communities across the United States in acknowledging the countless contributions older Americans make to enrich and improve the quality of life for individuals and families of our nation; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland Department of Human Services promotes health, education, employment, and community wellness, and this month is hosting Oakland's 4th Annual Older Americans Month on May 19, 2006; bringing awareness to both the needs and contributions of older Americans; and
