A Report and Proposed Resolution Authorizing the City Administrator to Accept and Appropriate Grant Funds in the Amount of Twenty-Nine Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-Three Dollars (\$29,973) from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, to the Police Department for the Continued Implementation of the Gang Resistance Education And Training (GREAT) Program

SUMMARY

A resolution has been prepared authorizing the City Administrator, on behalf of the City of Oakland, to accept and appropriate grant funds in the amount of \$29,973 from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, to continue the Gang Resistance Education and Training (GREAT) program. The proposed program period is January 1, 2004 through December 31, 2004. (Please note that notification of this award was issued by the U.S. Department of Justice on September 7, 2004, and is attached as Appendix A.) The funds will support the GREAT program at Cole, Frick and Havenscourt Middle Schools.

FISCAL IMPACT

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, approved the Police Department's GREAT application and awarded the City of Oakland \$29,973 in Federal grant funds. Revenues and appropriations will be allocated in the Federal Grant Fund: 2112; Campus Life And School Safety (CLASS) Org.: 105530; Youth and Community Services Program: PS04, in a Project Account to be determined. The program will be managed by the CLASS Section Commander, and the program liquidation period is 90 days following the program end date. There is no match requirement. BACKGROUND

In the Fall/Winter of 2004, for the third consecutive year, officers from the Police Department's Gang Unit will teach a U.S. Department of Justice approved GREAT curriculum during thirteen single-period classes. The curriculum will be presented to sixth and seventh grade students at Cole, Frick and Havenscourt Middle Schools.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The success of the GREAT program is founded on a mutual commitment by law enforcement and education agencies uniting to help students achieve success by:

- 1. Providing children with the skills necessary to combat the pressures that set the stage for gang involvement
- 2. Offering children accurate knowledge about gang involvement
- 3. Providing children with the skills to resolve conflicts peacefully
- 4. Assisting students to identify and understand the need to set goals.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The GREAT program is a structured, school-based program implemented in areas where gang activity either exists or is emerging. The curriculum is taught by certified uniformed police officers to the sixth and seventh grade levels. The type and location of program-sponsored field trips and the number of students attending each outing will be determined collaborative by sworn personnel administering the GREAT program and school-site personnel.
