Status Report on the City of Oakland and the Oakland Redevelopment Agency

Capital Improvement Projects, through June 30, 2005

#### **SUMMARY**

This report provides the status of the City of Oakland and the Oakland Redevelopment Agency Capital Improvement Program (CIP) projects that were active through June 30. 2005. Projects reported are listed by CIP category, as defined in the 2003-08 Capital Improvement Program Budget.

Status on 226 projects is provided in this report. These include: (a) projects approved by the City Council/Agency Board at FY 2003-05 budget adoption; (b) projects approved by the City Council/Agency Board throughout FY 2004-05; and (c) projects approved by the City Council/Agency Board in prior years that were active in FY 2004-05.

Attachment A contains the detailed status information for each project by category. For each project, staff provides the project title and description; initial project sponsor who can be considered the "client;" funding source; project manager responsible for implementation; target completion date; FY 2004-05 adjusted budget and expenditures; project-to-date budget and spending<sup>1</sup>; and project status as of June 30, 2005. A reference guide, included in the beginning of Attachment A, more fully describes each field.

Attachment B provides a legend of funding sources used to support the CIP projects.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

This report does not have a direct fiscal impact. Project balances shown in this report are supported by appropriations previously approved by the City Council and/or the Oakland Redevelopment Agency Board.

#### **BACKGROUND**

This report includes status on projects either begun during FY 2004-05 or continuing from prior years.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Project-to-Date budget and spending are based on data collected beginning in FY 1988-89. Budget and expenditure data presented in this report are from the latter of project inception or FY 1988-89, since FY 1988-89 is the carliest project data available in the City's financial records.

Projects are organized into eight major categories, following the 2003-08 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) structure. Though "Unfunded Requests" were included in the 2003-08 CIP, this section is not included in this report, because projects therein received no funding and thus had no activity during FY 2004-05. Further, two categories that did not appear in the 2003-08 CIP are nonetheless presented in this report, because they contain active projects funded in prior years.

Specifically, Attachment A lists projects by the following categories:

- Buildings and Facilities. The Building and Facilities category includes repairs and upgrades to community centers, City-owned structures and leased properties.
- Parks and Open Space. This category reflects the City's substantial commitment to facility improvements throughout Oakland's parks system.
- Sewers and Storm Drains. These projects include rehabilitation of sewer mains throughout the City as required by the Infiltration/Inflow (I/I) Correction Program.
- Streets and Sidewalks. This category includes street resurfacing, street safety improvements, widening of various streets, construction of curb ramps for disabled access, enhanced street lighting, and sidewalk repairs.
- Traffic Improvements. This category includes installation of new traffic signals, modernization of traffic signals and signal controllers, and signal synchronization. The Traffic Improvements category also includes annual funding for traffic studies, as well as analyses and implementation of various traffic safety measures and traffic calming strategies.
- Technology Enhancements. Projects in this category include computer hardware
  acquisitions and software licensing agreements that benefit the entire City, as well
  as computer and technology upgrades for community-serving City of Oakland
  agencies.
- Miscellaneous. The Miscellaneous category includes funding of the City's
  federally mandated ADA Transition Plan (physical access improvements) and
  ADA Accommodations Program (employment and programmatic access
  accommodations). Also included is discretionary capital improvement funding
  for the Mayor and each City Council member to address specific district priorities
  and support larger citywide projects (i.e., "pay-go" funds).
- Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization (funded in prior years, but not included in the 2003-08 CIP). This category includes funding for MacArthur and International Streetscape projects.

#### DISCUSSION

### Summary of Spending

The Capital Improvement Program is an aggressive undertaking, with more than 200 active projects. It includes projects approved in the 2003-08 CIP, as well as those from prior years.

<u>Table 1</u> below summarizes and compares the FY 2004-05 Adjusted Budget to FY 2004-05 Year-to-Date Expenditures. On the following page, <u>Table 2</u> compares Project-to-Date (PTD) Budget to PTD Expenditures. <u>Table 1</u> presents the total number of projects and describes adjusted appropriations and actual spending that occurred through FY 2004-05, while <u>Table 2</u> provides the lifetime project appropriation and spending.<sup>2</sup> Both tables provide data by category.

Generally, the level of spending for most CIP projects starts out low and increases as the construction phase is implemented. While Percent Expended gives a true financial picture, it is not a true indicator of project status. For most projects, up to 80 percent of the total project appropriation is associated with actual construction. These funds must be available prior to advertising for public bids on such projects. Since the bid and award process may be up to five months long and the construction period another four to twelve months, on average, project appropriations are typically not fully expended in the fiscal year in which they are appropriated. Also, the Percent Expended is dependent upon the actual construction cost. If bids are under the budgeted amount, the net savings will also decrease the percent expended.

### Program Description:

The primary purpose of the City's Building and Facilities program is to repair, renovate or construct libraries, community and recreation centers, police and fire facilities, and various other City facilities and structures. Projects within this category involve new construction, structural renovation and repairs to existing buildings, facility improvements for compliance with the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act, abatement of environmental issues and other hazardous conditions, and various minor and major tenant improvements.

Many of Oakland's existing facilities suffer from deferred maintenance and require numerous capital improvements. Also, some of the older facilities in the City need renovation or replacement because they are out of date and cannot meet the current program needs of the users.

## Funding:

Funding for projects under this program comes from a combination of sources including federal and state grants, Redevelopment Agency funds, the multipurpose reserve fund, and the Measure DD Bond program. Numerous unfunded Building and Facilities projects are identified in the 2003-08 Capital Improvement Program document.

### Program Highlights:

In FY 2004-05, the following significant events occurred:

- The new Carmen Flores Community Center construction was completed.
- The Oakland Public Library Children's Room Renovation was completed.
- The new Coliseum Intercity Rail Station was completed.
- The Franklin Street Garage Elevator Renovation project was completed.
- The Police Administration Building major retrofit construction project commenced in November 2004.
- Design for the Studio One Art Center Expansion and Rehabilitation has been completed and construction is to start at the end of 2005.
- Design for the Municipal Boathouse Renovation project is near completion and construction will start in early 2006.

## Program Description:

The primary purpose of the City's Parks and Open program is to implement capital improvements throughout the Oakland's park system, including Lake Merritt, to plan, coordinate, and assist in prioritizing future capital park projects, to pursue and administer grant funding opportunities, and to coordinate the efforts of non-profit agencies. Projects within this category involve designing and constructing new and existing parks, fields, trails, and various facilities.

In addition, this program includes the efforts to protect and improve Oakland's watersheds through preservation, restoration, education and outreach, and the implementation of the Creek Protection Ordinance. Miscellaneous acquisitions of open space also are supported within this program.

### Funding:

Funding for projects under this program comes from a combination of sources including federal and state parks grants, the Measure K, I, and DD Bond programs, and capital improvement funds. Some funding is also provided through private donations.

#### Program Highlights:

In FY 2004-05, significant highlights for the Parks and Open Space program are as follows:

Measure DD funds a variety of projects related to parks and clean water. At Lake Merritt, projects in the design stage include park expansion and roadway reconfiguration along Lakeshore Avenue, 12<sup>th</sup> Street, and Lakeside Drive. Construction of these projects, including the renovation of the Municipal Boathouse, will begin in 2006. Several Water Quality projects at the Lake are completed or in construction, including storm drain filters and aeration fountains. At the Lake Merritt Channel, design of bridges and trails has begun, with construction planned to begin in 2007. Along the Estuary, several portions of the Oakland Waterfront Trail are in the design stage, and Union Point Park is completed. Construction of some trail projects will begin in 2006, but significant real estate and permitting issues are creating challenges for implementation of many sections of the trail. Four creek restoration projects are in the design stage, and the first acquisition of watershed land is nearly complete. Finally, design of

- the Studio One renovation is complete, and construction will begin in 2006. (For further details on the Measure DD program and projects, please refer to the Report on the Status of Measure DD, presented to City Council in March 2005.)
- Grant Awards: The Facilities Planning and Development section prepared applications leading to the award of three grants totaling \$6,350,000. These grants are from the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation, funded from the California Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe Neighborhood Parks and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2002 (Proposition 40).
- In addition, in November of 2004 and January of 2005, staff submitted seven grant applications for parks projects for a total funding request of \$5,300,000. Two grants are from the Murray Hayden Urban Parks and Youth Service Program; one grant is from the State Urban Parks and Healthy Communities Program; and one is from the Alameda County Waste Management Authority (ACWMA). In July 2005, the City received notice that it was awarded \$500,000 for Lion Creek Project and \$450,000 for three segments of the Waterfront Trail project. Award notifications on the other five applications are still pending.
- Grant Reimbursements: Grant reimbursement requests were submitted during the 2004-05 fiscal year for \$3,404,646 for 10 projects.
- Researched and Prepared Strategy Plan/Prioritization Report and Criteria for Council, with a Comprehensive Matrix of Oakland Parks, based on OSCAR Goals & Infrastructure Priorities.
- Construction completed on several capital projects including the San Antonio Park renovation, the Garfield Park renovation, Joaquin Miller Playground construction, the Temescal Pool renovation, and the Peralta Creek restoration.
- In addition to the numerous Measure DD park and trail projects, several other
  projects including the Memorial Park construction, the Live Oak Pool deck repair,
  the Dimond recreation center Deck repair, the Peralta Hacienda Park Phase IIIA,
  and the restoration of Lion Creek at Coliseum Gardens will be under construction

#### Program Description:

The primary purpose of the City's sewer program is to upgrade and rehabilitate key portions of Oakland's sanitary sewer system to prevent sewer overflows, especially during wet weather. Oakland has over 800 miles of sanitary sewer pipe, much of which was originally built more than 60 years ago. As with many large cities, portions of these pipes have deteriorated to the point that sewer overflows, especially during storms, occasionally occur.

Oakland is in the midst of completely rehabilitating those portions that have been identified as needing the most immediate improvement, representing up to one-third of the entire system. Under this 25-year program, each year Oakland rehabilitates or replaces up to ten miles of sewer line. The City spends over \$2 million each year rehabilitating sewer lines in coordination with the annual Street Resurfacing Program and on emergency repairs. Rehabilitating lines in advance of resurfacing is part of an effort to eliminate the need to return to newly resurfaced streets to make utility repairs.

#### Funding:

Funding for this program is from Sewer Service Fund (Fund 3100). This is an enterprise fund, for which fees are collected through the bi-monthly water and sewer bill. In 2004, Oakland issued \$60 million in Revenue Bonds in order to accelerate the sewer rehabilitation program. Funds for operating costs and the repayment of these bonds are assured through the rate increases that were initiated that year. The annual revenues for this fund are \$21 million, of which \$12 million is available for the capital improvement program. The remaining funding is used for annual operations and maintenance costs.

With the increase in sewer service fee and the revenue bonds initiated in 2004, it is anticipated that funding for sanitary sewer needs will be adequate for the foreseeable future.

There is currently no funding available for capital improvements to the storm drain system. Some projects are listed on the following pages that are funded through appropriations made for this purpose in previous fiscal years. A storm drainage master plan identified almost \$200 million in needed capital improvements to the storm drain

infrastructure. Staff is continuing to explore funding alternatives, as well as funding for improved storm water quality.

## Program Highlights:

### Program Description:

This section is responsible for planning and designing street widening, street rehabilitation and streetscape improvement and other projects such as ADA required curb ramp improvements, slide repairs, seismic retrofit of bridges, geotechnical investigations, retaining walls, and cyclic pavement resurfacing and sidewalk rehabilitation.

#### Funding:

Funding for street and sidewalk projects are from a variety of sources. Many of these projects receive federal funds. Measure B, Measure DD and the State Gas Tax fund these projects as well.

#### Program Highlights:

The City maintains 2,294 lane miles of streets; 1,500 miles of linear sidewalks (the distance from Oakland to El Paso, TX); and 150 blocks of pedestrian pathways. The City is currently on an 85-year street resurfacing cycle compared to the industry standard of 25 years. Approximately, 33 percent of streets are in Very Good to Excellent condition; 35 percent in Good to Fair condition; and 32 percent in Poor to Very Poor condition. The estimated backlog for street resurfacing is about \$140 million and the backlog for sidewalk repair is about \$100 million. In FY 2004-05, two street resurfacing projects were completed, and one project was initiated. The total construction cost for these three projects is approximately \$7.6 million. Also, a curb ramp project and two streetscape projects were completed. In addition, two sidewalk projects were in construction (a total construction cost of approximately \$4 million) and one project was started (an estimated construction cost of \$350,000).

The Traffic Improvements program enhances vehicular, pedestrian and bicycle safety on City streets and around schools, parks and senior centers. Activities include designing, installing, and maintaining traffic signs, signals, audible pedestrian signal heads, pavement markings, residential blue zones, speed bumps, circles, barriers and other traffic calming devices. This program manages City-owned parking facilities assuring that clean, safe and affordable parking is available Citywide.

This program promotes alternative modes of transportation such as walking and bicycling. The program also fulfills Legislative Requirements, such as the state Streets & Highways Code, California Vehicle Code, and the Oakland Municipal Code. In addition, state and federal regulations mandate programs and responsibilities, which are managed by the Transportation Services Division. County mandates, such as compliance with the Alameda County Congestion Management Program, are required to continue receiving gas tax funding.

### Funding:

Funding for this program is provided from a number of sources, including the Multipurpose Reserve (fund 1750), Measure B Sales Tax (fund 2211), Measure B Bike/Ped (fund 2212), State Gas Tax (fund 2230) and Traffic Safety funds (fund 2416), as well as from miscellaneous grant sources.

### Program Description:

The primary purpose of the City's technology enhancement program is to upgrade and rehabilitate key portions of Oakland's Technology infrastructure. Oakland has over 150 application servers, 5,000 telephones, 2,000 radios, 3,300 desktop computers and miles of interconnecting copper wire and fiber.

The majority of the Technology enhancements address the ongoing maintenance, support and replacement of existing software and equipment. These enhancements have allowed the City to replace its Fire and Police dispatch systems; improve Oracle Payroll and Financial; replace the SUN server; maintain its 800 MHz radio system and upgrade and enhance its Geographic Information System (GIS).

### Funding:

Funding for these programs is primarily from the Municipal Improvement Capital Fund (fund #5500), with the exception of projects backed by the Radio Fund (#4200). This fund supports radio replacement projects. The Radio Fund receives revenue from user departments and contracting agencies that utilize the City's 800MHz radio system.

### Program Highlights:

In FY 2004-05, the City of Oakland upgraded its Oracle applications and replaced its Sun server, thus providing uninterrupted, quality service to our Personnel and Payroll functions.

Upgrades to the GIS system provide the mapping capabilities to many of the City's enterprise applications for Police, Fire, CEDA and Public Works.

Our aging 800MHz radio system was maintained and some of the oldest radios were replaced or repaired. This interim maintenance and replacement measure is being used while awaiting approval of a comprehensive radio replacement project.

### Program Description:

Miscellaneous projects are those capital improvement projects that cross multiple categories or do not intuitively fit under a single category. In the past several years, they have included in the City's capital expenditures related to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the Mayor's and Council's discretionary capital expenditures or Pay-Go.

### Funding:

Funding for Miscellaneous Projects is from the Municipal Improvement Capital Fund (MIC; #5500). In prior years, the City's MIC fund constituted the primary funding source for the City's capital improvements. The MIC fund was an ideal source of capital funding in that its prescribed uses were for the "acquisition, construction, lease or improvement of equipment, facilities, or other property (real or personal) to be owned, leased, held or controlled by the City for any of its municipal purposes." However, during FY 2003-05, funds from this source were completely exhausted

### Program Highlights:

In FY 2004-05, the ADA project appropriations provided continued funding to larger capital improvement projects to ensure access to persons with disabilities. During FY 2004-05, the Mayor and City Council committed a total of \$2.6 million for capital improvements throughout the City and for the Oakland Unified School District (Please see the Informational Annual Report on FY 2004-05 Council and Mayoral Pay-Go Commitments through June 30, 2005, presented to the October 25, 2005 Finance and Management Committee, for more information on specific commitments. Please note that while the FY 2004-05 CIP Status Report provides actual expenditures during FY 2004-05, the FY 2004-05 Annual Report on Council and Mayoral Pay-Go provides the value of commitments, which were not necessarily expended in FY 2004-05.)
