RE: **A Report and Resolution Authorizing the City Administrator, on Behalf of the City of Oakland, to Execute an Agreement with the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) for the Purpose of Permitting the Police Department to Present the Post Certified Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) to a Maximum of Eighty (80) Police Officer Trainees and to Receive Up to Thirty-Five Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$35,600) In Reimbursement Funds, at a Rate of Four Hundred Forty-Five Dollars (\$445) Per Student**

SUMMARY

A resolution has been prepared which authorizes the City Administrator to execute an Agreement with the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) for the purpose of permitting the Police Department to present the POST certified Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) to a maximum of 80 police officer trainees and receive reimbursement funds at the rate of \$445 per full-time, on-duty employee of POST reimbursable agencies.

FISCAL IMPACT

The \$445.00 per student will cover the cost of the POST EVOC training presentations. The maximum reimbursable amount of \$35,600 will train 80 students. The term of the agreement with POST for presentation of the mandatory Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) is July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005. The OPD Training Sergeant is responsible for project administration. Reimbursement revenues shall be deposited in the General Purpose Fund (1010), to the OPD Training organization (103430), Training Program (PS09). An equal amount shall be appropriated to the same fund, organization, and program (1010, 103430, PS09).

BACKGROUND

The Police Department routinely conducts POST certified training courses for the benefit of Oakland Police Officers and trainees, as well as officers from other law enforcement agencies. The City of Oakland has been providing vehicle operations and similar training services to POST since 1995.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The requirements for the vehicle operations course are specified in the POST Training and Testing Specifications for the Regular Basic Course. The requirements include numerous

performance objectives, instructional goals, and mandated hours. The key topics covered in the training are:

- Introduction to Law Enforcement Vehicle Operations
- Principles of Defensive Driving
- Adverse Driving Conditions
- Principles of Vehicle Control
- Vehicle Pursuit Operations

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic - An emergency vehicle operations course based on best practices will provide an effective management strategy to reduce or prevent the City's exposure to incidents of civil liability and potential litigation.

Environmental - No environmental opportunities are anticipated.

Social Equity - Sound procedural operation of police vehicles enhance the safety of both officers and the public.


DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

RECOMMENDATION



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND, TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE CALIFORNIA COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND TRAINING (POST) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PERMITTING THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO PRESENT THE POST CERTIFIED EMERGENCY VEHICLE OPERATIONS COURSE (EVOC) TO A MAXIMUM OF EIGHTY (80) POLICE OFFICER TRAINEES AND TO RECEIVE UP TO THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$35,600) IN REIMBURSEMENT FUNDS, AT A RATE OF FOUR HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$445) PER STUDENT

WHEREAS, The California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) has requested that the City of Oakland Police Department present the POST certified Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) to California Law Enforcement personnel who are full-time, on-duty employees of POST reimbursable agencies; and

WHEREAS, POST will reimburse the City for each eligible student enrolled in the EVOC presentation, at a rate of \$445 per student, up to a maximum amount of \$35,600, during the period of July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City of Oakland to execute an agreement with POST for the purposes described above; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland has executed similar vehicle operations training agreements with POST since 1995; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or her designee is hereby authorized to submit and execute an agreement between the City of Oakland and POST for the purposes described above; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or her designee is authorized to accept reimbursement funds in an amount up to \$35,600 from POST for deposit into General Purpose Fund revenues, with an equal amount appropriated to the General Purpose Fund budget (1010), to the Training program (PS09), in OPD Training organization code 103430.
