Made by the City to the Oak Center Project Area; and

A City Resolution Accepting and Appropriating a Contribution of \$1,000,000 in Agency Funds Under the Cooperation Agreement for the Purposes of Job Training and Housing Programs, and to Serve as Partial Repayment of a Loan Made by the City to the Oak Center Project Area

SUMMARY

Staff requests Agency Board and Council approval of two resolutions: 1) to contribute \$1 million from the Agency to the City under the Cooperation Agreement to fund various job training and housing programs; and 2) to accept and appropriate \$1 million from the Agency to fund various job training and housing programs. The \$1 million will constitute partial repayment from the Agency to the City for a loan made to the Agency for the Oak Center Redevelopment Project Area.

Funds proposed for transfer were originally contributed to the Agency by the developers over a period of years under the City Center Disposition and Development Agreement (DDA), for the purposes of job training and housing. This \$1 million transfer was approved by the Council on February 16, 2010, as part of the City's FY 2009-10 General Purpose Fund balancing measures (Resolution No. 82582 C.M.S.). This action specifically allocates these funds to particular City job training and housing program.

FISCAL IMPACT

The contributions will be made from the Agency's West Oakland Planning/Coliseum Community Investment Fund (#9103), non-project cash balances, and will be used to fund various General Purpose Fund housing and job training projects that had already been funded for FY 2009-10, thus freeing up an additional \$1 million. BACKGROUND

Beginning as far back as 1993, contributions have been made to the Agency under the Disposition and Development Agreement (DDA) for the City Center development located in the Central District Redevelopment Project Area. The primary source of the contributions were the City Center project's two main developers, Shorenstein Realty and Bramalea Pacific. The DDA specified that "the Developer shall contribute to the Agency one percent (1%) of the actual direct (i.e. "hard") construction costs on new buildings constructed by Developer for job training or housing."

The contributions were made over a period of years to the Agency's West Oakland Planning/Coliseum Community Investment Fund (#9103), which currently has a cash fund balance of approximately \$1.3 million. The transfer of these funds from the Agency to the City was approved by the City Council on February 16, 2010 as part of the City's FY 2009-10 General Purpose Fund balancing measures.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The \$1 million transfer from the Agency to the City was approved by the Council on February 16, 2010 as part of the City's FY 2009-10 General Purpose Fund balancing measures (Resolution No. 82582 C.M.S.). If the attached resolutions are not approved, an additional \$1 million in savings for the General Purpose Fund would have to be found. The \$1 million will constitute partial repayment from the Agency to the City for a loan made by the City to the Agency in the amount of \$3,285,131 in 1966 under a Repayment Contract for redevelopment of the Oak Center Redevelopment Project Area.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES
