RESOLUTIONS AUTHORIZING SIX (6) PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENTS FOR AS-NEEDED CIVIL ENGINEERING SERVICES WITH DKS ASSOCIATES, DMJM & HARRIS, MOFFATT AND NICHOL ENGINEERS, HQE, INC., CH2M-HILL, AND RAJAPPAN & MEYER CONSULTING ENGINEERS, INC., FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED

TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) EACH

SUMMARY

Resolutions have been prepared authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to enter into professional services agreements to provide as-needed civil engineering services with each of the following six (6) local, civil engineering firms:

- DKS Associates, Oakland
- DMJM & Harris, Oakland
- Moffatt and Nichol Engineers, Oakland
- HOE, Inc., Oakland
- CH2M-Hill, Oakland
- Rajappan & Meyer Consulting Engineers, Inc., Oakland

Each professional service agreement is for a not-to-exceed amount of \$250,000 over a threeyear period. The Public Works Agency, Project Delivery Division, will manage the contracts.

These as-needed civil engineering services are needed to provide site evaluations, programming, design services and construction support services for various City projects. Typical projects include roadways, drainage facilities, streetscape improvements, landslide repairs, waterfront structures, and other civil engineering related projects.

The as-needed civil engineering services for various improvement projects are consistent with the Mayoral and City Council goals of "Improving Oakland Neighborhoods" and "Maintaining and Enhancing Oakland's Physical Assets" by improving traffic, bike, and pedestrian safety and repairing and maintaining the City's infrastructure and roadways.

FISCAL IMPACT

Each agreement is for a total amount not to exceed \$250,000 or \$1,500,000 total for all six (6) contracts. The as-needed civil engineering services will be required for projects funded by Measure DD (Oakland Trust for Clean Water & Safe Parks), Propositions 12 and 40 (2000 & 2002 State Bonds for Clean Air, Clean Water and Safe Parks), and various other capital improvement funds and grants.

The approval of these contracts will not result in additional appropriation of funds. The services will be funded through the various individual projects. Funds will be identified prior to the performance of the civil engineering services.

BACKGROUND

In September 2003, the City issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for as-needed civil engineering services. Twenty-one (21) firms responded to the RFP. The Public Works Agency, Project Delivery Division, reviewed the proposals and short-listed thirteen firms based on the quality and content of the proposals. The short-listed firms were then interviewed and evaluated by a selection panel. The evaluation criteria included the following:

- 1. Relevant experience;
- 2. Qualifications of project team and project manager;
- 3. Organization of firm, availability of resources and capability to meet project schedules;
- 4. Understanding of the design requirements for City projects; and
- 5. Ability to provide high quality customer service to the City and the community.

The top ranked six firms are as follows:

- DKS Associates, Oakland
- DMJM & Harris, Oakland
- Moffatt and Nichol Engineers, Oakland
- HQE, Inc., Oakland
- CH2M-Hill, Oakland
- Rajappan & Meyer Consulting Engineers, Inc., Oakland

The six firms selected are the most qualified to provide as-needed civil engineering services. All six firms are certified local or small local businesses and the City's Local/Small Business Enterprise (LBE/SLBE) program requirements of 50% total local participation have been met. The Contract Compliance Division of the City Manager's Office has verified the LBE and SLBE information for each firm as shown on Attachment A.

The six selected firms have the technical expertise to perform the work required, and clearly demonstrated their understanding of the technical complexities and regulatory issues involved in implementing capital improvement projects.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

It is anticipated that several capital improvement projects funded by Measure DD, Proposition 12, and Proposition 40 will require the as-needed civil engineering services agreements. Additionally, unscheduled projects will occur throughout the three-year period and will most likely require or benefit from the as-needed civil engineering services agreements. As-needed professional services agreements allow the City to promptly respond to and provide the necessary design services in an efficient and timely manner. The agreements will also reduce staff time and costs when compared to an individual project-by-project request for proposals process.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic:</u> The projects will generate business tax, sales tax, and other revenues for the City by those firms who work on the project.

<u>Environmental</u>: Environmental factors and opportunities will be considered and incorporated to the extent feasible. Consultants will be required to consider the use of recycled materials in the products specified and integrate other environmental opportunities, waste reduction and conserving energy.

<u>Social Equity:</u> The proposed design services to the various projects will enhance the usage and quality of existing infrastructure and roadways.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

Consultants will be required to design the City improvements in compliance with the physical access requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

As-needed professional services agreements will expedite the design of capital improvement projects. The time and costs currently expended in selecting consultants on a project-by-project basis will be reduced.

It is recommended that the City Manager, or her designee, enter into professional services contracts to provide as-needed civil engineering services with each of the following six firms:

1) DKS Associates, 2) DMJM & Harris, 3) Moffatt and Nichol Engineers, 4) HQE, Inc., 5)

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Public Works Committee

CH2M-Hill, and 6) Rajappan & Meyer Consulting Engineers, Inc. Each contract is for an amount not to exceed \$250,000.

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that City Council approve the resolutions.


