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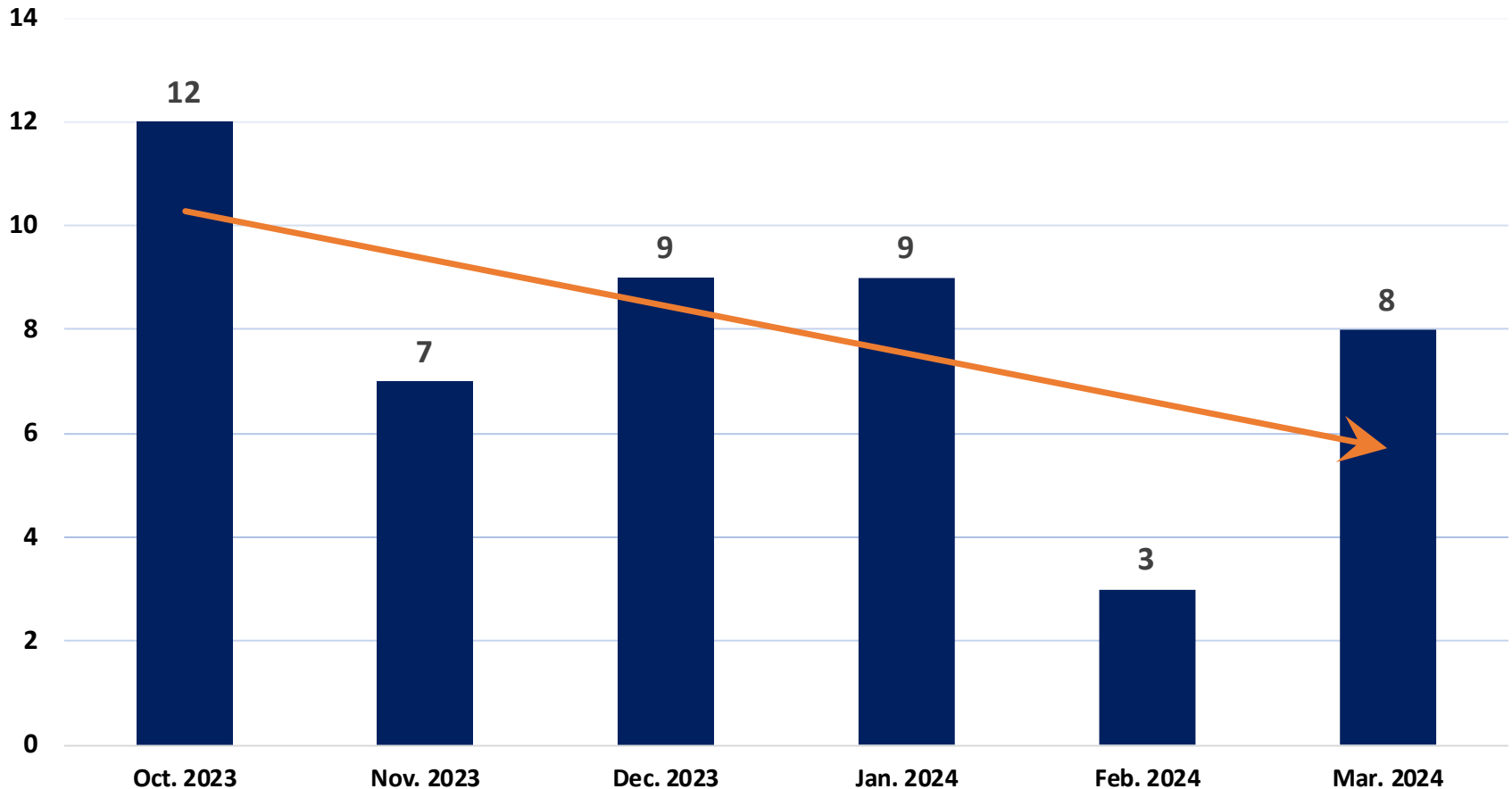

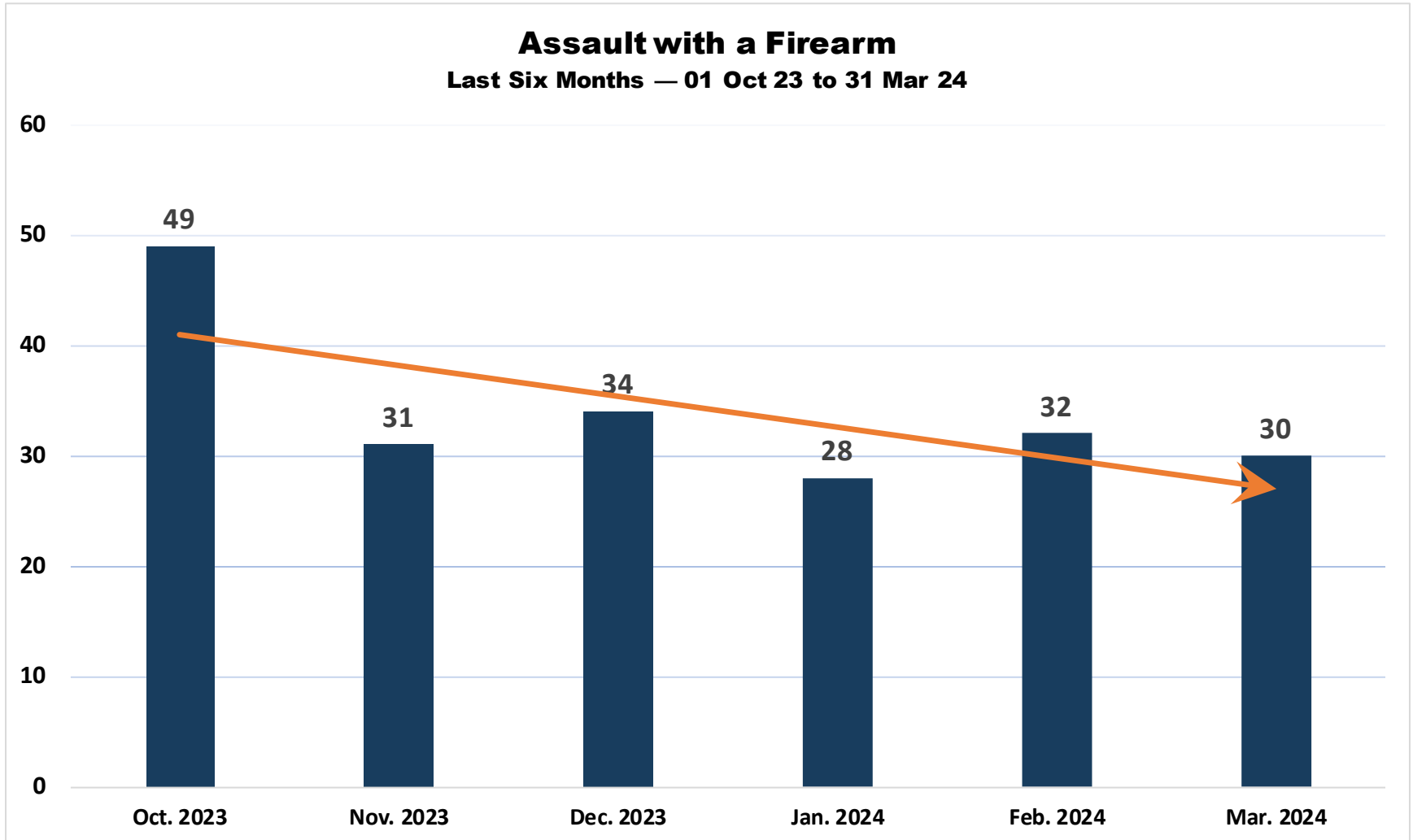

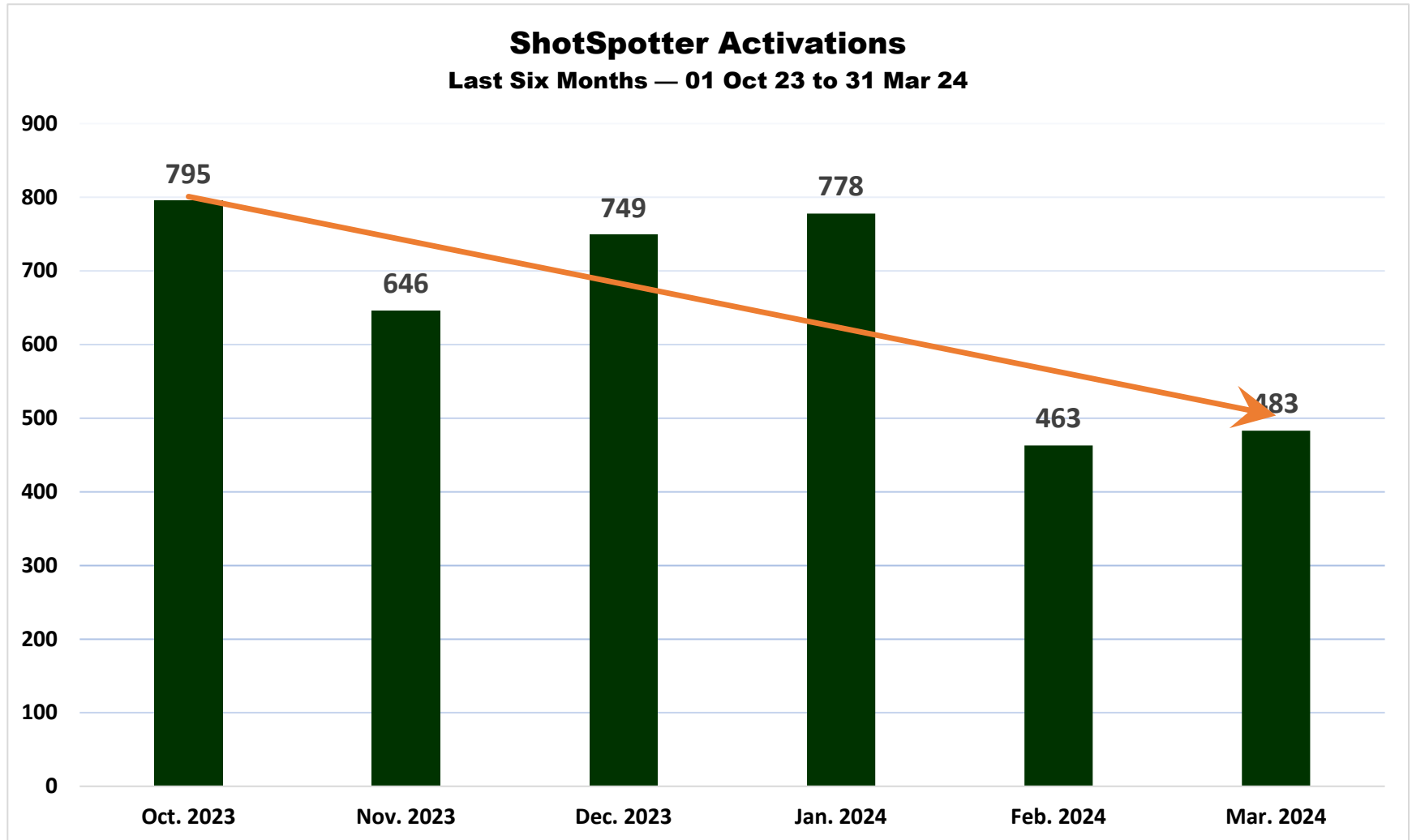

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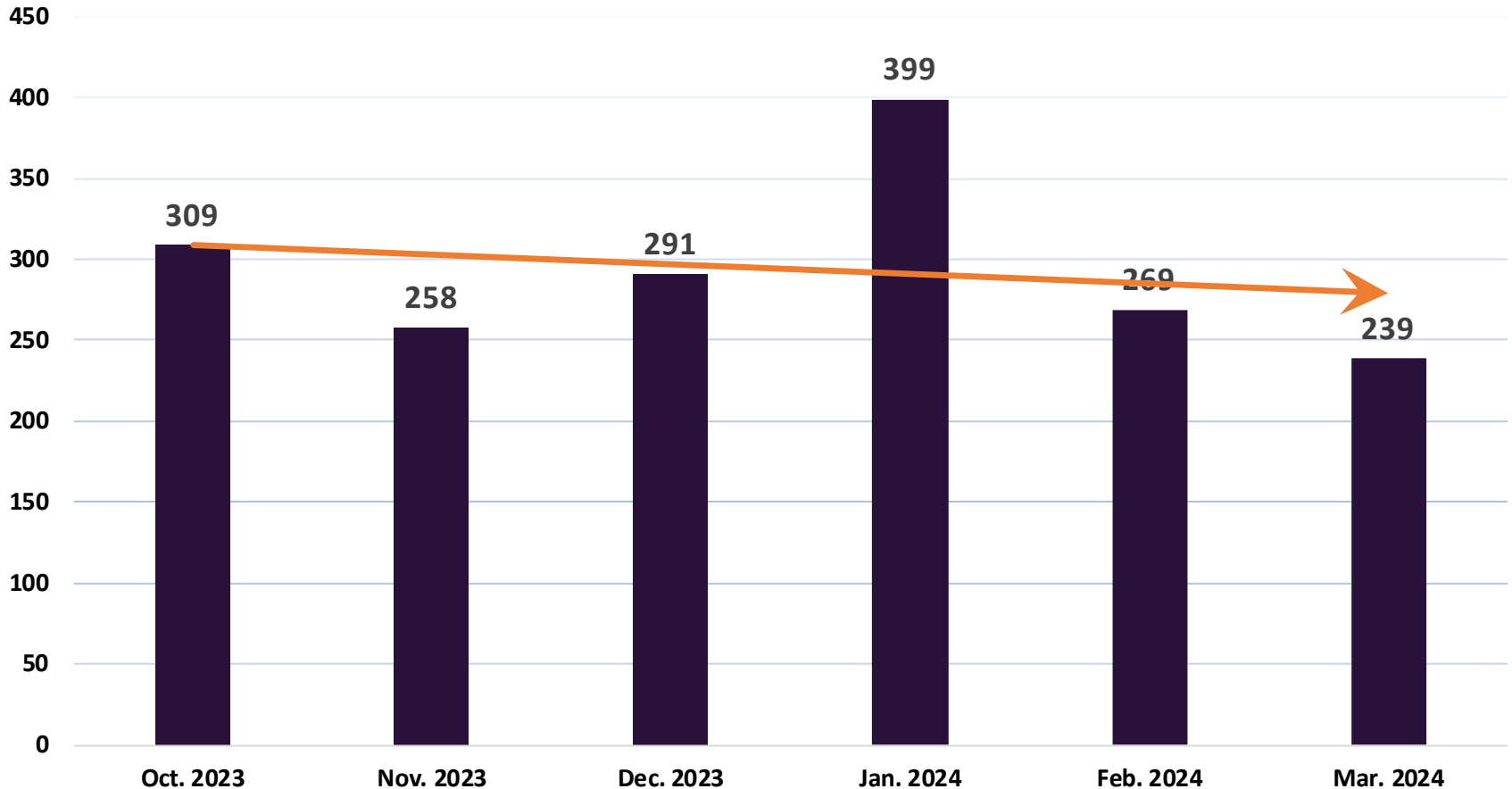

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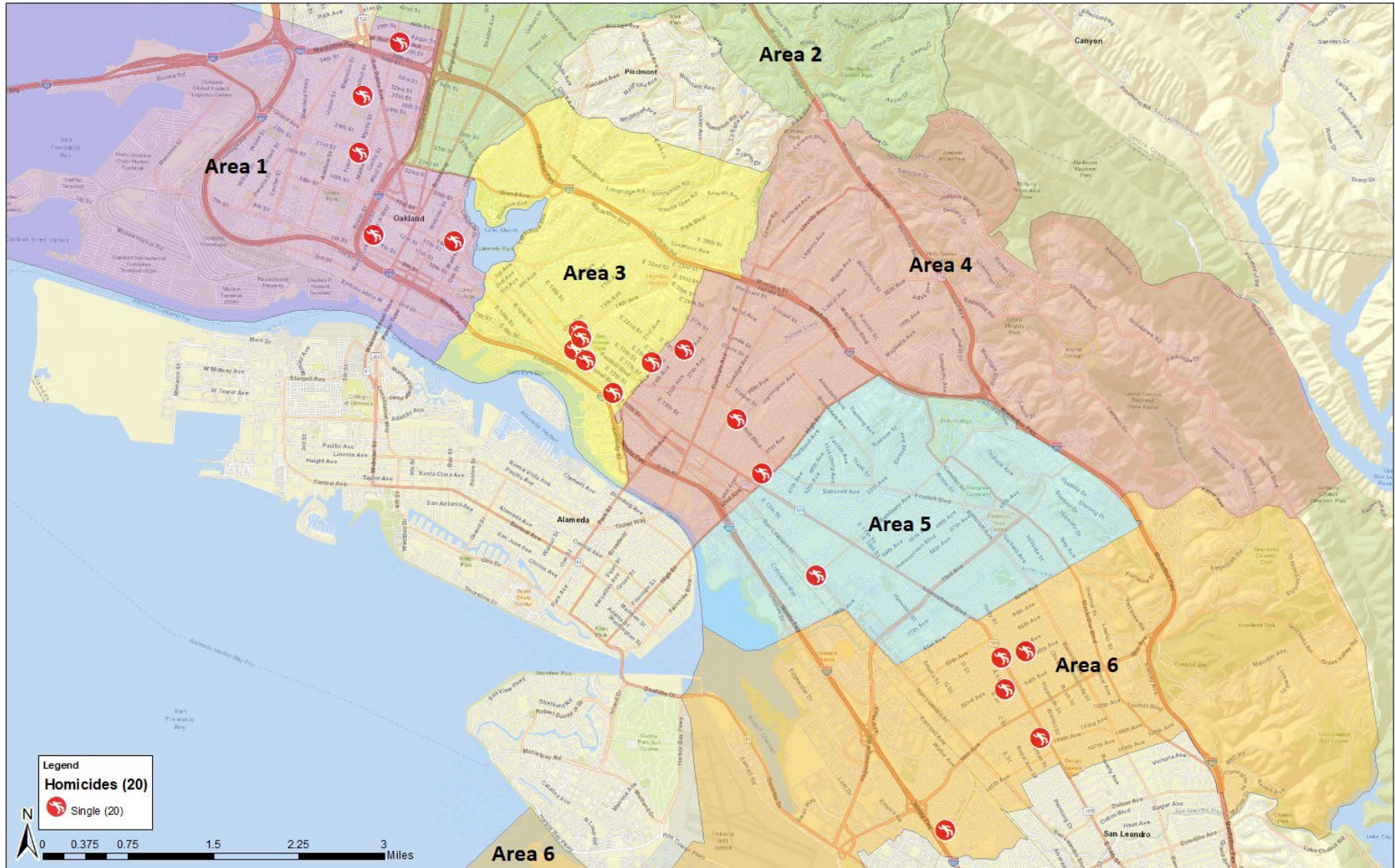
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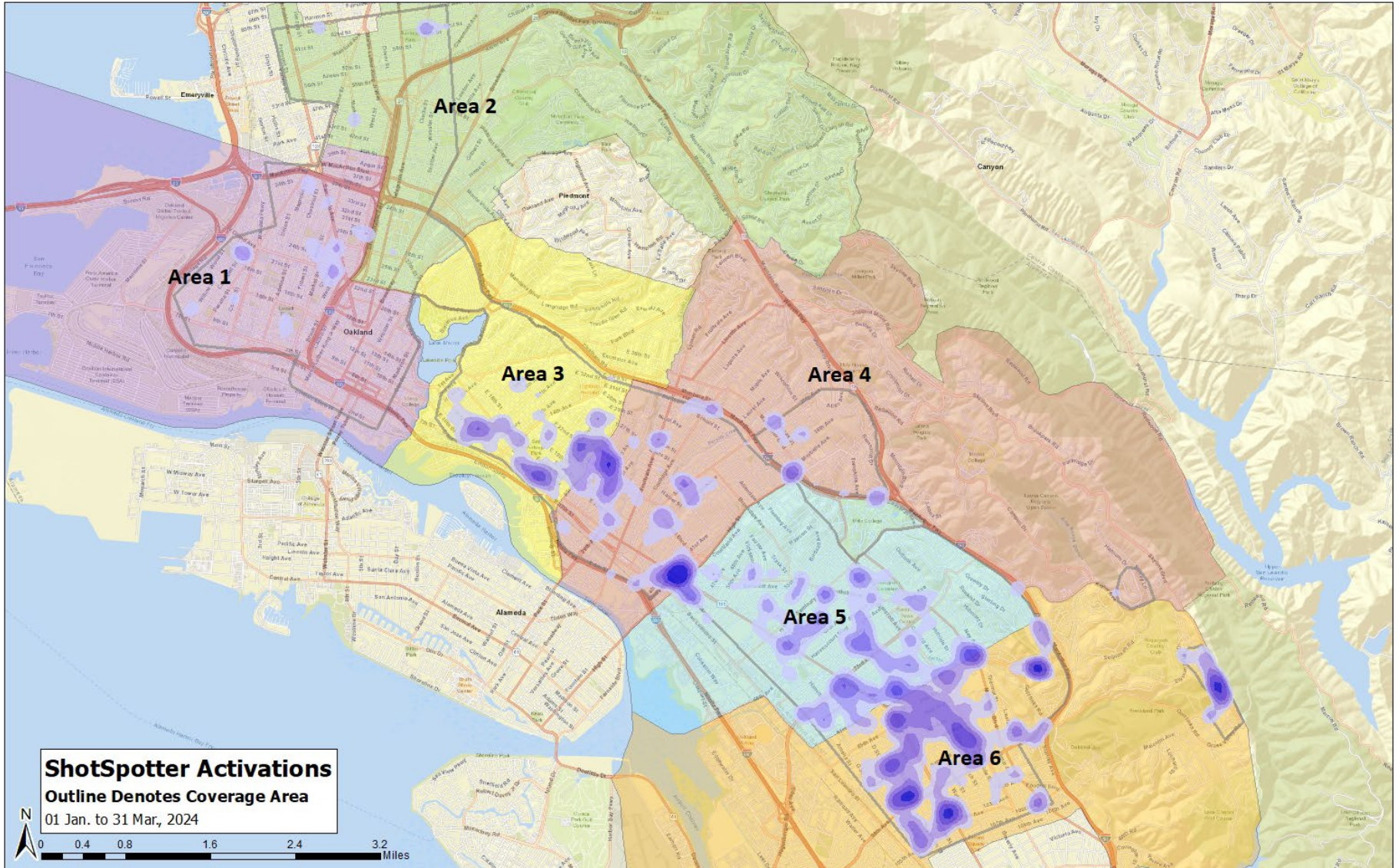
Citywide Homicides – All Investigated Incidents

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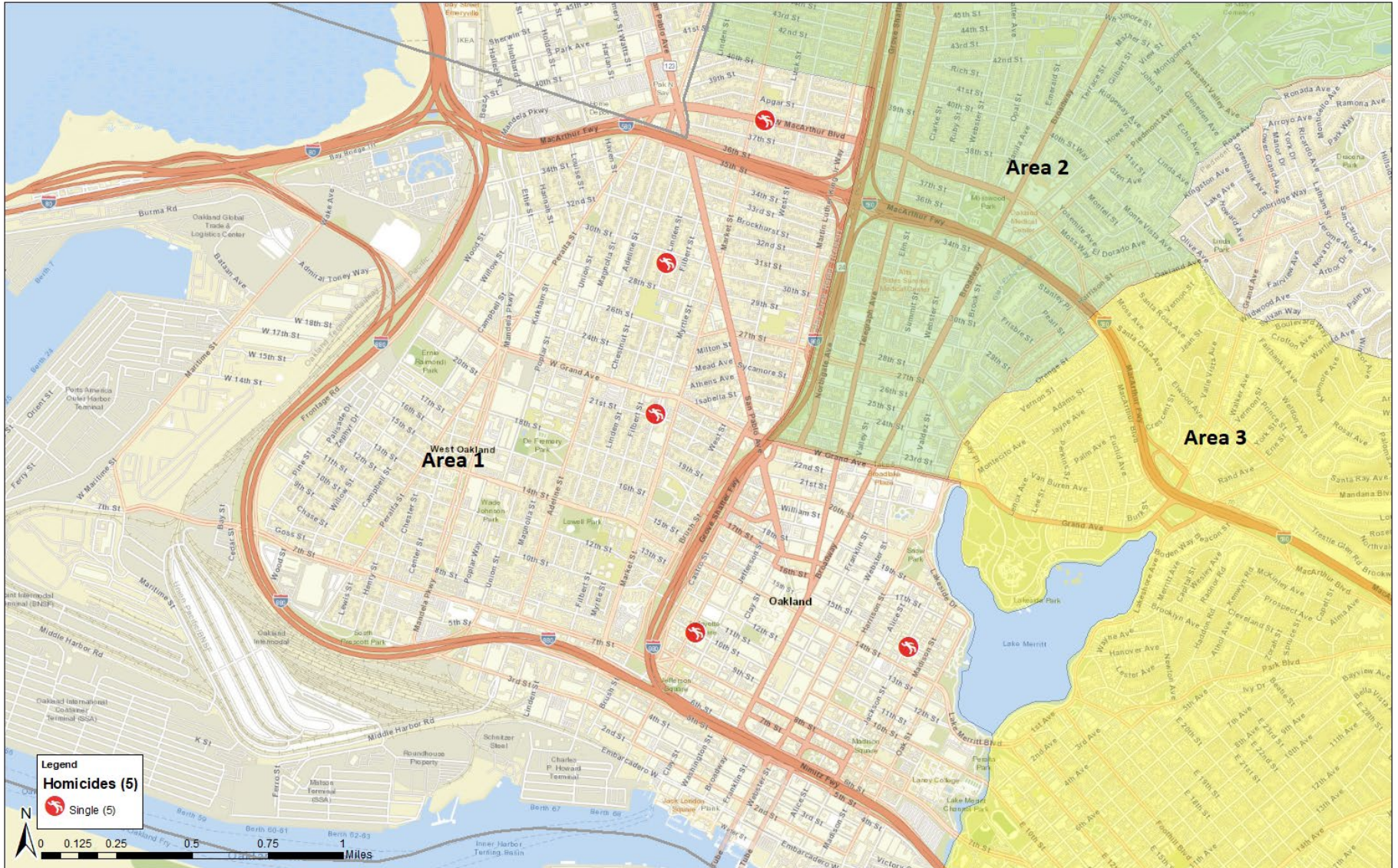
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Area 1 Homicides – All Investigated Incidents

Area 1- Acting Captain Robert Muniz

- Robberies, shootings, homicides, and burglaries remain priorities of focus for Area 1
- Since the beginning of 2024, total Part 1 crimes in Area 1 have decreased 38% from 2023. There has been a 43% decrease in firearms related aggravated assaults in Area 1 and an overall 53% decrease in burglaries compared to 2023.
- There has been a 10% increase in robberies in 2024 compared to 2023.
- Area 1 robberies, shootings and burglaries (commercial and auto) are being addressed through collaboration and operations conducted with our Special Resources Section, Ceasefire and our Criminal Investigation Division.
- As part of the 2023 Crime Plan, high visibility patrols, foot patrols, traffic enforcement, and security checks will be focused throughout Area 1 and in the downtown areas such Jack London Square, Chinatown and the business districts.

Area 1- Acting Captain Robert Muniz

- Patrol Teams are directed to focus on serious and violent crime incidents through preventative patrols, collaborative community efforts, and focused enforcement and investigations.
- Patrol teams are directed to complete thorough preliminary investigations, video canvassing recovery, dissemination of intelligence, and partnering with our Special Resources Section, and working with DVP and Ceasefire strategies.
- Problem-solving projects continued to address public safety, quality of life issues, and crimes committed in the violence-concentrated areas. Additionally, the Community Resources Officers focused their efforts on Wood Street, Raimondi Park, and 2300 MLK Street Encampments. These projects emphasize prevention and conflict resolution through community partnerships in conjunction with the Encampment Management Team.
- Area 1 Captain continues to work with our business leaders and community groups to address various issues throughout Area 1.

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Area 2 – Captain Lisa Ausmus

- Robberies (“Bipping” and Street) and Burglaries (Commercial and Auto) are the main focus of Police Area 2.
- The strategic plan for Area 2 underscores our commitment to addressing the main focus areas. It includes high visibility patrols, foot patrols, traffic enforcement, and security checks in the business districts (Valdez, Montclair, Telegraph, College, Piedmont, and San Pablo).
- Patrol teams are directed to focus on responding to 9-1-1 calls, serious and violent crime incidents:
 - Complete thorough preliminary investigations, video canvassing recovery, dissemination of intelligence, partnering with DVP and Ceasefire strategies,
 - Area 2 robberies (“Bipping” and Street) have increased due to organized robbery teams. This is being addressed with the Special Resource Section (SRS) West team conducting operations targeting these teams.
 - To supplement the efforts of the SRS West teams, the Area 2 Captain will work with BID leaders and utilize patrol overlaps, walking officers, and high visibility units to create directed patrols to deter crime.

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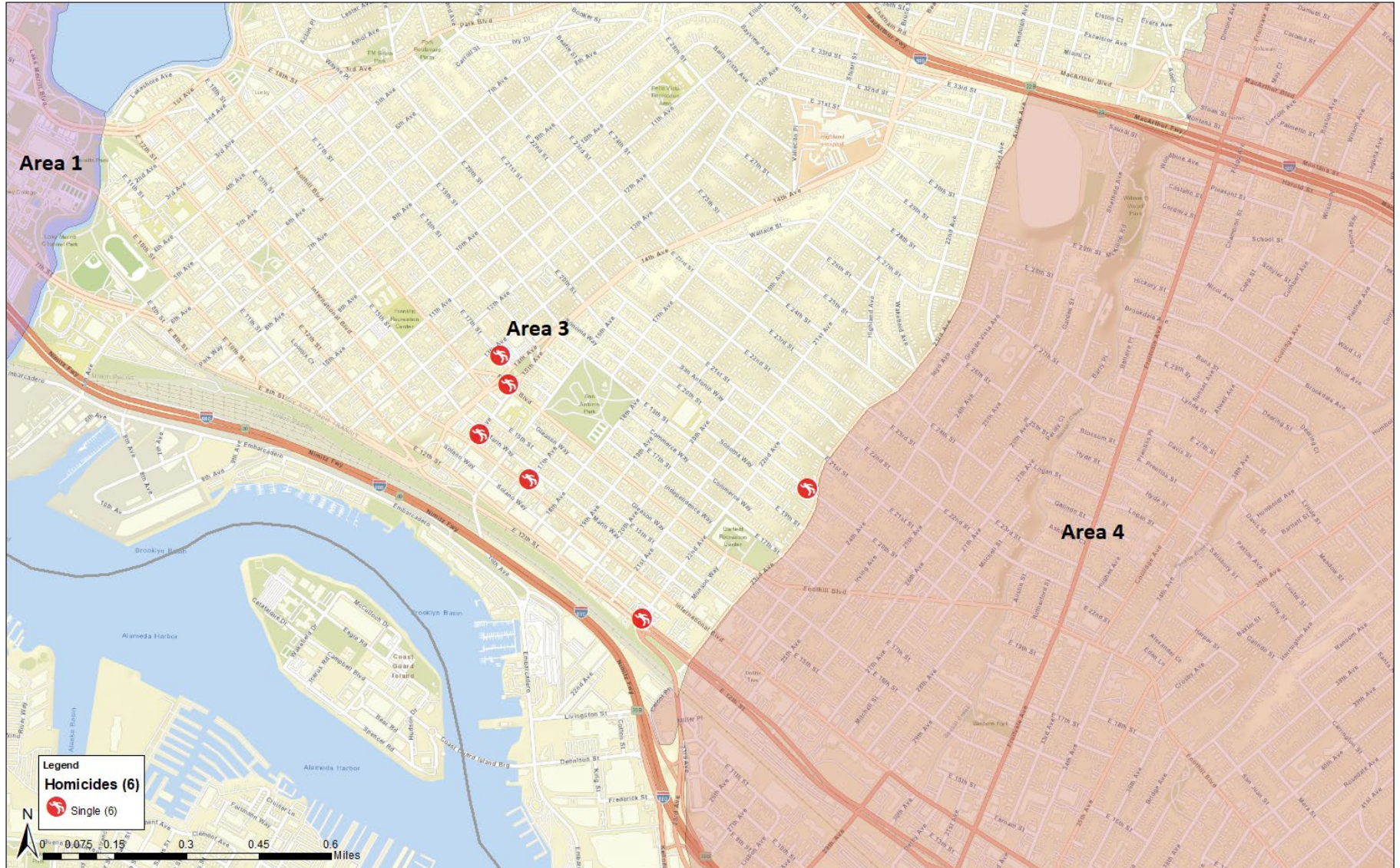
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Area 3 Homicides – All Investigated Incidents

Area 3- Captain Alan Yu

- We are dedicated to collaboratively reducing incidents of gun-related violence, robberies, and human trafficking by working closely with the Department of Violence Prevention, Department of Transportation, Vice Unit, United States Marshals, FBI Task Force, and the Community to implement intelligence-driven policing strategies aimed at ensuring safety.
 - Homicides have seen an increase of 2 compared to 2023.
 - Shootings were increased by 5 percent (95 - 100)
 - Robberies have seen a significant increase of overall 79 percent; however recent enforcement efforts have decreased the robberies since March 2023.
- The Crime Reduction Team (CRT) have concentrated their efforts on addressing incidents of robberies and "Bipping," executing enforcement operations that have led to successful arrests of individuals associated with these crimes. As a result, there has been a significant decrease in robberies and burglaries during March and April 2024.
- The Community Resource Officers (CRO) have persisted in their beat projects, which include addressing concerns such as gambling establishments, drug-related problems, and blight along the 600 block of Bellevue, as well as providing support for Human Trafficking operations.

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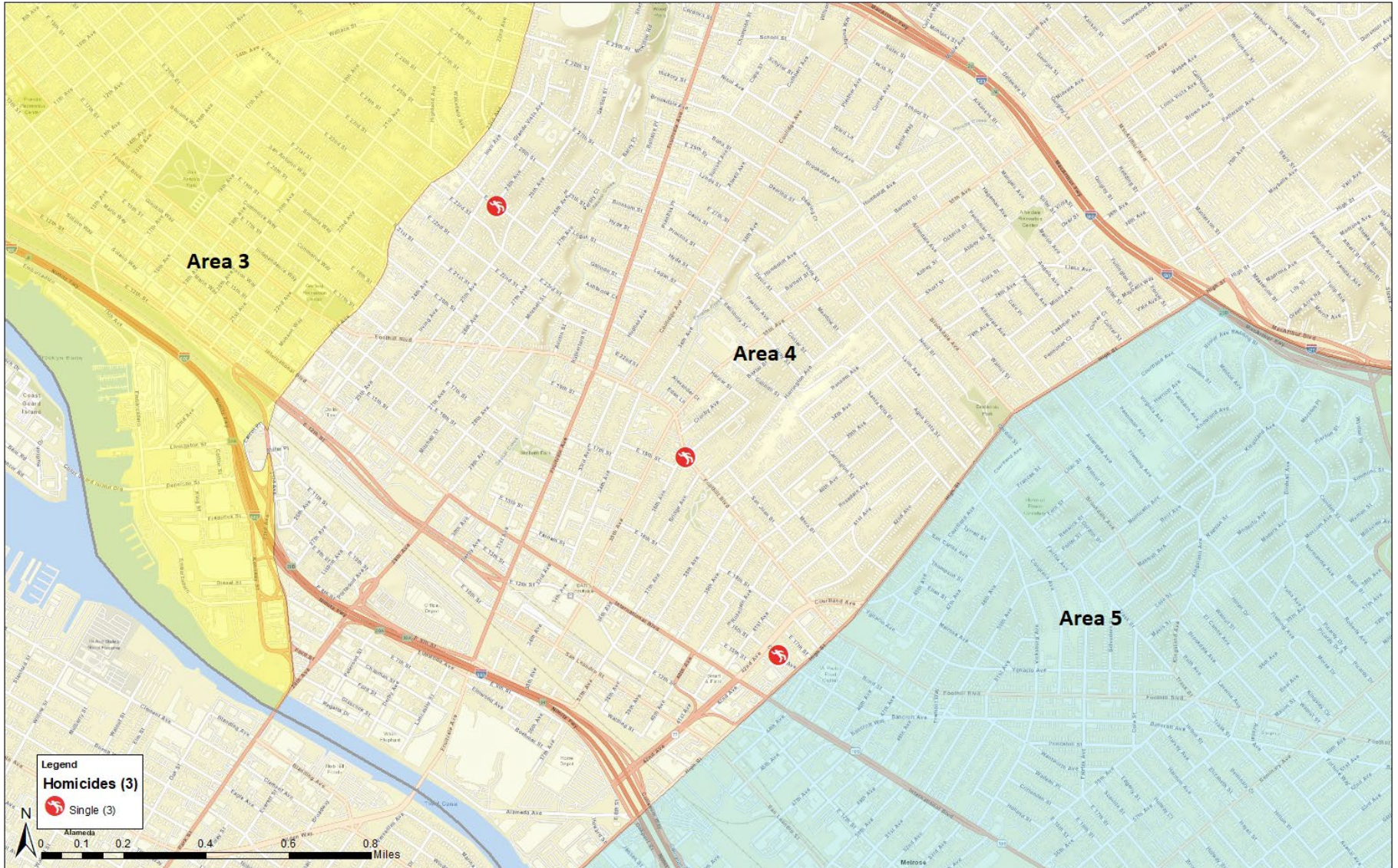
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Area 4 Homicides – All Investigated Incidents

Area 4 — Acting Captain Brandon Wehrly

- Shootings, Robberies (both residential and street), and Burglaries (commercial, residential, and auto) are the primary focus of Police Area 4.
- Overall, Part 1 crimes are down 10% YTD, but Robberies are up 20% YTD and Residential Burglary is up 42%.
- As part of the 2024 Strategic Plan, directed OT will be utilized to supplement Patrol in high traffic shopping areas within the district (Fruitvale Village, Dimond, Lincoln Square, and the Laurel). This detail will utilize disseminated intelligence on crime patterns to conduct foot patrols, traffic enforcement, and security checks.
- Area 4 will liaison with our law enforcement partners (CHP, ACSO, OHA, and BART) to increase an overall law enforcement presence along International Blvd., E. 12th St., and San Leandro St. to assist with traffic enforcement within Area 4's HIN.
- Area 4 Patrol will focus on serious and violent crimes:
 - Conduct thorough preliminary investigations, canvass and recovery of video, disseminating intelligence gathered, partnering with DVP and Ceasefire
 - Patrol overlap units in BFO 2 (if any) will be deployed in Area 4 hot spots to further deter crime.
 - Area 4 Captain will work with Area 4 BID leaders, and coordinate with Foot Patrol and the Trust Building Officer to continue to deter crime within the shopping districts in Area 4.

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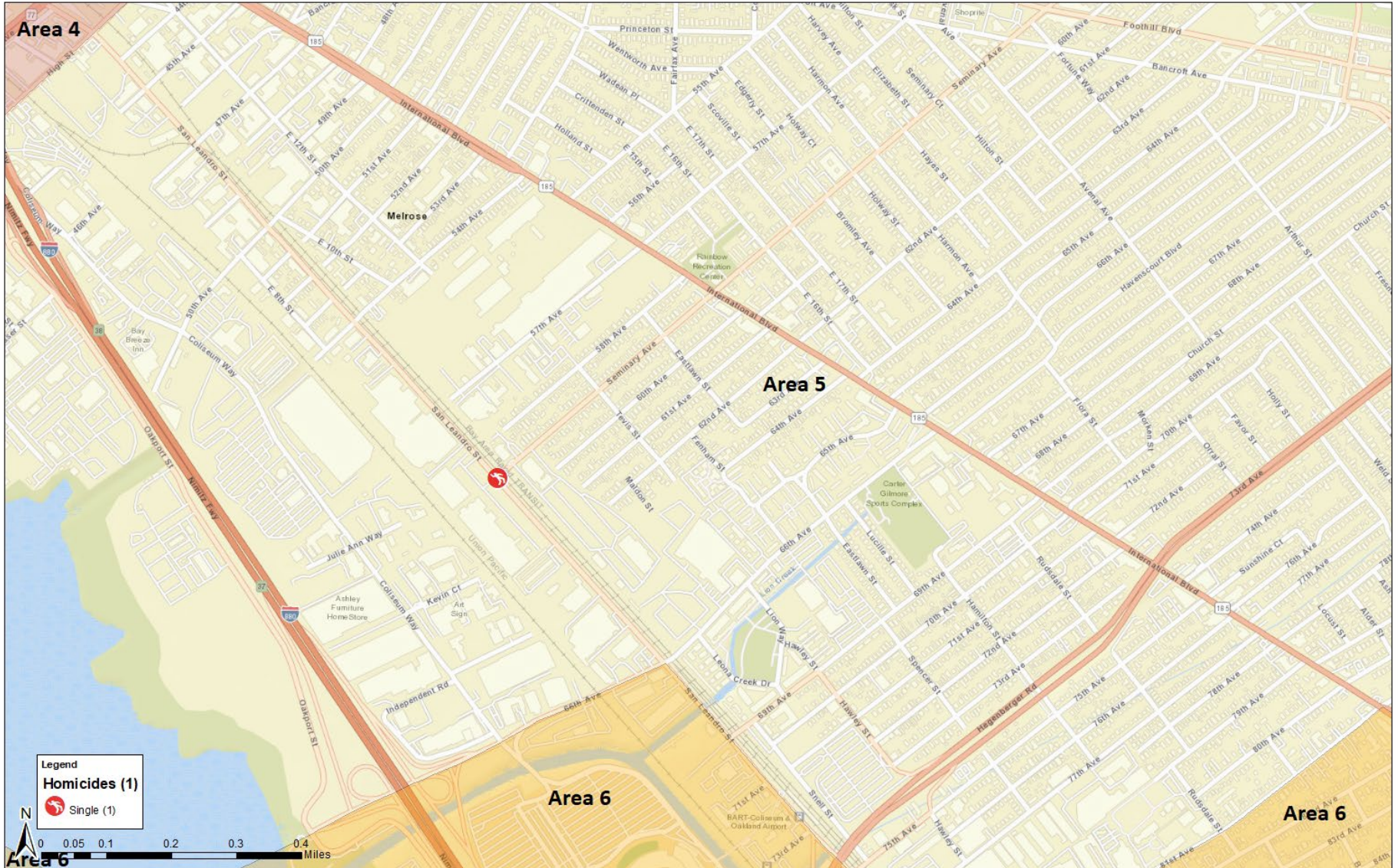

Area 5 – Captain Kevin Kaney

- Area 5's main focus is preventing violent crime, primarily Murders, Shootings, and Robberies.
- Currently Area 5 is down 86% in murders, from 7 last year at this time to 1 this first quarter.
- Area 5 is currently up 10% in Aggravated Assault and 42% in Robberies.
- In response, Area 5 staff deployed the **following measures** to continue to reduce the increase in Shootings and Robberies:
- Continued intelligence briefings to identify possible groups or gangs escalating violence.
- Continued Patrol briefings to ensure all stakeholders have timely and relevant information of the conflicts driving the violence in Area 5.

Area 5 – Captain Kevin Kaney

- Reviewed ShotSpotter activity while gathering intelligence and deploying available resources to those areas.
- Continued Violence Suppression operations that are laser focused on groups, gangs, and/or areas of known violence.
- Proactive collaboration with DVP (Department of Violence Prevention) who assists with reaching out to involved parties to prevent further violence.
- Prioritized Ceasefire strategies and referrals with requests for outreach and prevention.
- Ensure quality preliminary investigations are being completed in the field and in partnership with CID (Criminal Investigations Division).

Area 6 — Acting Captain Casey Johnson

Part 1 crimes for Q1 for 2024: The two largest increases:

- Aggravated Assaults are up by 13% but are still down by 1% compared to the three-year average.
- Homicides are down by 20% compared to 2023.
- Auto Burglaries are down by 76%. Compared to 2023

In response, Area 6 staff deployed the following measures in an attempt to continue to reduce this rise in violence:

- Continued Data intelligence to identify possible groups or gangs escalating violence.
- I worked closely with the SRS East Teams and Ceasefire, which will continue to focus on individuals driving the violence.
- Prioritized Ceasefire strategies and referrals with requests for outreach and prevention.
- Increased partnership with DVP (Department of Violence Prevention), who will assist with reaching out to involved parties to prevent further violence.

Area 6 — Acting Captain Casey Johnson

- Conduct weekly meetings with all stakeholders, law enforcement partners, and city leaders including Councilmember Reid's office.
- Work with local merchants and stakeholders to conduct CPTED evaluations for long-term burglary mitigation solutions.
- Run overtime details such as Burglary Suppression to focus on the Hegenberger and 98th Ave corridors.
- Reviewed ShotSpotter activity while gathering intelligence and deploying available resources to those areas.
- Continue to enforce thorough preliminary investigations (Patrol Officers) while working with our Criminal Investigations Division on follow-up requests.

Ceasefire – Director Davis-Howard

Ceasefire conducted 78 direct communications with individuals at highest risk for violence or their family members in Q1 2024:

- 67 by custom notifications
- 11 individuals at a call-in
- 54 individuals were referred to DVP for services.

Ceasefire hosted one (1) call-In meeting in Q1 2024.

There have been 5 community engagement events; with 4 partners.
