

A Supplemental Report and Proposed Resolution Waiving the Competitive Request for Proposal/Qualifications Process and Authorizing the City Administrator to Enter into Grant-Funded Agreements with Law Enforcement Agencies for Allied Traffic Enforcement Operations and Other Law Enforcement Services Needed to Support Routine and Emergency Police Functions and Operations in an Amount Within the City Administrator's Purchasing Authority on Behalf of the Police Department

The Police Department presented a report and proposed resolution authorizing a waiver of the competitive request for proposal/qualifications process relative to entering into agreements associated with allied enforcement operations and other law enforcement services needed to support routine and emergency police functions and operations. Said legislation appeared before the Public Safety Committee on April 24, 2007.

Per the direction of the Public Safety Committee, the authorizing resolution associated with this pending legislation has been revised to clarify that the funding source(s) associated with the proposed agreements is limited to those matters which are funded through federal, state, and local grants funds; with said funds previously approved and accepted by City Council.



WHEREAS, the Police Department periodically requires assistance from other law enforcement agencies to conduct routine and emergency functions and operations necessary for police work such as forensic analysis, latent print comparisons, and other identification services; and


