

## OAKLAND CITY COUNCIL

INTRODUCED BY COUNCILMEMBER PATRICIA KERNIGHAN AND  
COUNCILMEMBER REBECCA KAPLAN

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**RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 83444 C.M.S., PASSED JUNE 30, 2011, WHICH AUTHORIZED THE CITY OF OAKLAND'S 2011-2013 BIENNIAL BUDGET, TO AMEND THE FY 2011-2013 GENERAL FUND BUDGET TO DIRECT THE ALLOCATION OF THE PROCEEDS OF THE FIVE YEAR TEMPORARY FISCAL EMERGENCY SPECIAL PARCEL TAX, (MEASURE I), TO TAKE EFFECT IF MEASURE I IS APPROVED BY THE VOTERS IN THE NOVEMBER 2011 SPECIAL ELECTION**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Oakland has experienced a substantial reduction in revenues over the past three years due to the national recession; and

**WHEREAS**, the declining revenues to the General Fund and other funds have necessitated a series of budget cuts in every City department for the past three years; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 30, 2011, the City Council passed a General Fund Budget for Fiscal Years 2011-12 and 2012-13, which budget was balanced by reducing the number of City jobs and public services as well as by City employees agreeing to reduce their salaries and benefits; and

**WHEREAS**, the budget cuts have resulted in eliminating hundreds of jobs of City employees and severely reducing the level of public service that was previously provided to Oakland citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 19, 2011, the City Council voted to set a Special Election to take place on November 15, 2011, and to place before the voters a Five Year Temporary Fiscal Emergency Special Parcel Tax for the purpose of generating revenue that would restore several of those public services (per Resolution No. 83503 C.M.S., passed July 19, 2011); and

**WHEREAS**, the language of the Special Parcel Tax measure (denominated Measure I on the November 15, 2011 ballot) listed several categories of City services to be restored via the tax proceeds; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the responsibility of the City Council under the City Charter to set the budget for the City of Oakland; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**: That the City Council hereby amends Resolution No. 83444 C.M.S., passed June 30, 2011, which authorized the City of Oakland's 2011-2013 biennial budget, to amend the FY2011-2013 General Fund budget, contingent on the passage of the Five Year Temporary Fiscal Emergency Special Parcel Tax, to augment that budget with the proceeds of the Special Parcel Tax; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED**: That the proceeds of the Five Year Temporary Fiscal Emergency Special Parcel Tax for Fiscal Years 2011-12 and 2012-13 shall be allocated as set forth in the following matrix:

<b>Parcel Tax Budget</b>	<b>Dollars per fiscal year</b>
Restore funding to Police Department budget to increase number of sworn officers and purchase needed equipment.	<b>\$5,100,000</b>
Restore staff to fix potholes and repair streets	<b>\$1,500,000</b>
Restore gardeners (at least 8), and tree trimming staff, for park and tree maintenance	<b>\$1,200,000</b>
Restore hours to Senior Centers	<b>\$350,000</b>
Improved Street Lighting for crime prevention	<b>\$700,000</b>
Restore Information Technology staff (police & library IT)	<b>\$800,000</b>
Youth summer jobs program	<b>\$500,000</b>
Youth Violence Prevention	<b>\$300,000</b>

Restore hours to Libraries over winter break.	\$100,000
Crime analysis software contract	\$100,000
TOTAL	\$10,850,000
Shot Spotter, including expansion of geographic area	\$200,000

Further Resolved: That the City Administrator is authorized to take all actions necessary to carry out the aforementioned designated parcel tax allocations.
