

**RESOLUTION HONORING PETER W. DUNBAR FOR HIS 24 YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE CITY OF OAKLAND AND CONGRATULATING HIM ON HIS RECENT SELECTION AS CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE CITY OF PLEASANT HILL**

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar was born and raised in Oakland and graduated from Bishop O' Dowd High School in 1978; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar began his career with the Oakland Police Department, while in High School, as an Oakland Police explorer from 1976-1978; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar graduated from the Oakland Police Academy 105<sup>th</sup> Recruit School in 1982; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar worked as a Field Training Officer and was a member of the Special Duty Unit, whose main objective was to go after suspects involved in felony crimes; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar was promoted to Sergeant of Police in September 1988 where he worked in the Criminal Investigations Division and the Patrol Division where he received the OPD Medal of Merit for his services during the 1991 Oakland Hills Fire; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar was promoted to Lieutenant of Police in November 1991, where he was assigned to the Patrol Division and served as the Training Division Commander; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar was promoted to Captain of Police in February 1996, where he served as Commander of the Criminal Investigations Division and Area 2 Commander in the Patrol Division; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar was promoted to Deputy Chief of Police in October 1999, where he has served as Bureau Commander in the Bureau of Services and the Bureau of Field Operations; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar has been involved with many charities, including the Salvation Army, the Oakland Police Officers Emergency Network and the Oakland Police Foundation; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter W. Dunbar is the director of the Special Olympics, Northern California Law Enforcement Torch Run, and was the first person in Northern California to be inducted into the Richard LaMunyon Hall of Fame; and

**WHEREAS,** Peter W. Dunbar has dedicated 24 years of service to the City of Oakland, now therefore be it

**RESOLVED:** that the Oakland City Council commends Peter W. Dunbar for his leadership and dedication to the City of Oakland over the past 24 years; and be it


