

RE: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REJECTION OF ALL BIDS FOR ON-

CALL CURB RAMPS PROJECT (FY 01-02) (PROJECT NO. C209110), AND FORMALLY RE-BID THE PROJECT WITH RETURN TO COUNCIL FOR

**AWARD** 

#### **SUMMARY**

A resolution has been prepared authorizing the City Manager to reject all bids for On-Call Curb Ramps Project (FY 01-02) (Project No. C209110) and to allow staff to formally re-hid the project, and return to Council for award.

#### FISCAL IMPACTS

Funding for this project is available in Fund (5500); Organization (92242); Account (57411); Project C209120. The engineer's estimate for the work is \$88,000.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On July 14, 2003 the City Clerk received two (2) bids for the project. Bids were \$81,690 and \$94,820.00 as shown on *Attachment A*. The lowest bidder, Spencon Construction Inc. with a bid amount of \$81,690, and J.W. Riley & Sons, Inc. with a bid of \$94,820 are recommended for rejection. Both bids were determined to be non-responsive. (*Attachment B*)

In general, the proposed work consists of the construction of 38 concrete wheelchair ramps, 2,000 square feet of concrete sidewalk and 220 linear feet of concrete curb and gutter. This project meets the City Council and Mayoral Budget Priorities for Renewed Infrastructure – repair and maintain the City's infrastructure, including streets, sidewalks, sewers and storm drains, buildings, and vegetation management.

#### KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The list of bids is shown in *Attachment A*.

Staff has reviewed the submitted bids for this work and determined that the bids should be rejected and re-bid

#### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic:</u> This contract will generate jobs in the local economy. The contractor is required to have 50% of the work hours performed by Oakland residents and 50% of new hires to be Oakland residents.

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<u>Environmental</u>: There will be utilization of recyclable materials within the concrete construction materials to the extent possible. Improvements to pedestrian facilities will aid in making walking a more attractive mode of transportation, thereby encouraging reduction in automobile usage and reducing vehicle emissions and improving air quality.

Social Equity: The construction of wheelchair ramps will benefit the immediate neighborhood

#### DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

Seniors or people with disabilities will benefit from the improved access this project provides.

#### RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

It is recommended that all the bids be rejected because they did not meet the LBE/SLBE requirements.

### ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

**Staff** recommends that the City Council approve the resolution.
