I took advantage of the shelter and transitional house system and finally Oakland's section 8 home ownership program. Though my neighborhood is impacted by poverty, I am very proud to own a home in a West Oakland neighborhood I spent the last 15 years working as a service provider and organizer for my unhoused neighbors with a strong emphasis on senior issues. (please see my resume for details) I have served on the Oakland Housing Authority board for the last ten years protecting and expanding our city's affordable housing. I chair the OHA Special Needs Committee where we are instrumental in designing creative programs to bring individuals and families out of homelessness and into permanent affordable housing. 

#### INTRODUCED BY MAYOR SHENG THAO

# RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S REAPPOINTMENTS OF JANNY CASTILLO AND YOLANDA ANDERSON AS MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON HOMELESSNESS

**WHEREAS,** Section 601 of the City Charter provides that members of City boards and commissions shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the affirmative vote of five members of the City Council; and

**WHEREAS,** Oakland Municipal Code Section 4.56.060 established the Commission on Homelessness to advise the Mayor and City Council and make recommendations on Measure W and Measure Q homelessness funds received by the City of Oakland for homelessness programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the Commission on Homelessness consists of nine (9) members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council, the composition of which must include no less than half of the commissioners being residents of heavily impacted neighborhoods, no fewer than two (2) commissioners being currently or formerly homeless, no fewer than three (3) commissioners having professional expertise with housing or homeless services, and no fewer than one (1) commissioner having financial expertise; and

WHEREAS, the appointed commissioners listed herein meet the aforementioned requirements; and

**WHEREAS,** members serving initial appointments shall serve staggered terms of one (1), two (2) or three (3) years, all appointments for subsequent terms shall be for three-year terms; and all member terms shall begin on the date of the first six (6) appointments and future terms shall begin and end on that date; and

**WHEREAS,** the Honorable Mayor Sheng Thao has reappointed Janny Castillo and Yolanda Anderson, to the Commission on Homelessness, to the terms listed below; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the City Council hereby confirms the Mayor's reappointments of the following individuals to the Commission on Homelessness as set forth below:

**Janny Castillo,** to serve a three-year term that began December 2, 2023 and ends December 1, 2026, filling a seat previously held by herself.

**Yolanda Anderson,** to serve a three-year term that begins December 2, 2023 and ends December 1, 2026, filling a seat previously held by herself.
