RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AWARD OF A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT TO THE RESPONSIBLE LOW BIDDER, RAY'S ELECTRIC, IN AN AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY-FOUR DOLLARS AND TWENTY FIVE CENTS (\$1,502,884.25) FOR LAUREL STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENT ON MACARTHUR BLVD. (BETWEEN 35TH AVE. AND

HIGH ST.)

SUMMARY

A resolution has been prepared for Council to authorize award of a construction contract to Ray's Electric in the amount of \$1,502,884.25 for Laurel Streetscape Improvement on MacArthur Blvd. (Between 35th Ave. and High St.) project. The project is located in Council District 4.

Ray's Electric is the responsible low bidder and has met all the contract requirements.

Funds are available for the contract work.

This project is consistent with the Mayor and City Council Goal to Improve Oakland's Neighborhoods and to Maintain and Enhance Oakland's Physical Assets.

Staff recommends that the resolution be approved.

The construction contract is in the amount of \$1,502,884.25, and the construction contingency is \$150,288.43, 10% of the contract amount. The project budget has sufficient funds to cover the construction, contingency and construction management costs of the project.

There is 1.5% (\$22,543) of the contract amount allocated and available in Fund No. 5500, Account No. 56915 for Public Art. There is 3% (\$45,086) of the contract amount allocated and available in Fund No. 5500, Account No. 56918 for Public Works Agency, Contract Compliance.

There will not be any ongoing maintenance costs anticipated for the project.


BACKGROUND

On February 6, 2004, Notices to Bidders were sent to 385 contractors holding an "A" License in the City's database and the Builders Exchange. In order to bid on engineering projects in the State of California, contractors are required to hold an "A" License. February 9 and 16, 2004, advertisement soliciting bids was placed in the Oakland Tribune newspaper. On March 15, 2004, the City Clerk received three bids for the project as follows:

The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal required for this federally funded project is zero percent. The City has reached its required annual DBE goal for the City-wide DBE program. Thus, a zero DBE goal was set for this project. However, contractors were encouraged to include DBE participation in the contract.

Ray's Electric has 24% DBE participation in its bid, which exceeds the zero percent DBE goal. Contract Compliance has determined that Ray's Electric meets the DBE requirement and is the



responsible low bidder. Although the City's SLBE/LBE Program does not apply to this project, the low bidder meets these program goals also.

The project location, MacArthur Blvd. between 35th Avenue and High Street, has small businesses along both sides of the street and a high volume of both foot and vehicular traffic. The project seeks to integrate and enhance pedestrian and transportation facilities and to promote pedestrian safety. The project includes elements to calm traffic, create safer pedestrian crossings, improve bus stop areas and enhance the walking and shopping environment in the area. The project elements consist of widened sidewalks and bus stops areas (bulb-outs) at intersections in colored concrete, colored concrete crosswalks, landscaping, pedestrian level lights, gateways at the intersections of MacArthur Blvd./35th Avenue and MacArthur Blvd./High Street, and a new traffic signal at MacArthur Blvd./Loma Vista intersection.

The project meets the City Council Budget Priorities to Maintain and Enhance Oakland's Physical Assets by improving the physical appearance, livability and integrity of this neighborhood, and supports the City Council Budget Priority to Improve Oakland's Neighborhood by improving pedestrian and public access areas, and the general aesthetics of the neighborhood commercial district.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

On June 19, 2003, Department of Transportation (DOT), Local Assistance, and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) approved the required environmental documents for the project.

On July 28, 2003, DOT Local Assistance and FHWA authorized the City to advertise, award and construct the project.

The Transportation Development Act (TDA) grant required that funds must be spent by June 30, 2004.

The project was originally advertised and bids received exceeded the funds available. The contract work was re-scoped in consultation with the community to fit the available budget and then re-bid.

The project should break ground before summer 2004 and construction should be complete September 2004 to take advantage of anticipated good weather conditions. The construction duration for completing the contract work is 70 working days. The contract stipulates \$900 in liquidated damages for each day that the contract work is delayed.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic:</u> This contract will generate jobs in the local economy. The prime contractor and subcontractors are local companies. The enhanced streetscape will help support the local businesses.

<u>Environmental</u>: The enhancement of the general aesthetics of the environment provided by landscaping (trees and shrubs), street furniture (benches and trash receptacles) and the gateways

will make walking a more attractive mode of transportation, thereby encouraging reduction in automobile usage and reducing vehicle emissions.

<u>Social Equity:</u> The project elements including the colored bulb-outs at the intersections and bus stop areas, and colored concrete crosswalks and low level pedestrian lights will aid in making walking a safer and more pleasant experience. The landscaping and the gateways will enhance the aesthetics of the community and thereby encourage residents to shop in their neighborhood. This will improve the local economy and support small commercial businesses.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

This project will reconstruct curb ramps and detectable warning tiles that meet the federal Americans with Disabilities Act, making them safe and usable for senior citizens and persons with disabilities. The traffic calming elements of this project will add to this benefit.

RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the resolution authorizing award of a construction contract to Ray's Electric in the amount of \$1,502,884.25. Ray's Electric has met DBE requirements, and the project budget has sufficient funds to cover the contract work.

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that the resolution be approved.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AWARD OF A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT TO THE RESPONSIBLE LOW BIDDER, RAY'S ELECTRIC, IN AN AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY-FOUR DOLLARS AND TWENTY FIVE CENTS (\$1,502,884.25) FOR LAUREL STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENT ON MACARTHUR BLVD. (BETWEEN 35TH AVE. AND HIGH ST.)

WHEREAS, the Laurel Streetscape Improvement on MacArthur Blvd. (Between 35th Ave. and High St.) is a community-requested project which is consistent with the City Council Budget Priorities to **Maintain and Enhance Oakland's Physical Assets** by improving the physical appearance, livability and integrity of this neighborhood, and supports the City Council Budget Priority to **Improve Oakland's Neighborhood** by improving pedestrian and public access areas, and the general aesthetics of the neighborhood commercial district; and

WHEREAS, the Laurel Streetscape Improvement on MacArthur Blvd. (Between 35th Ave. and High St.) consists of widened (bulb-out) and colored concrete sidewalk at intersections and bus stop areas, colored concrete crosswalks, landscaping, pedestrian level lights, gateways at the intersections of MacArthur Blvd./35th Avenue and MacArthur Blvd./High Street, street furniture, and new traffic signal at MacArthur Blvd./Loma Vista intersection. These elements provide sustainable opportunities to the local economy, environment and social equity for the Laurel District neighborhood. The project also meets the federal Americans with Disabilities Act requirements; and

WHEREAS, on February 6, 2004, Notices to Bidders were sent to 385 contractors, which consist of the License "A" contractors, and Outreach and Builder Exchange in the City's database. On February 9 and 16, 2004, the project was advertised in the Oakland Tribune to solicit bids; and

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2004, the City Clerk received three bids and determined that Ray's Electric's Disadvantage Enterprise Business participation exceeds the zero percent requirement for the project. A zero DBE goal was set for this project because the City has reached its required annual DBE goal for the City-wide DBE program. Ray's is the responsible low bidder with the amount of \$1,502,884.25; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient funds available to cover the construction contract including 10% contingency and construction management costs for the project; and

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WHEREAS, the City lacks the equipment and qualified personnel to perform the necessary work; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the performance of this contract is in the public interest because of economy; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that services under this contract will be temporary; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the performance of this contract shall not result in the loss of employment or salary by any person having permanent status in the competitive services; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Manager is authorized to award a contract for the Laurel Streetscape Improvement on MacArthur Blvd. (Between 35th Ave. and High St.) to the responsible low bidder, in accordance with the terms of its bid therefore, for an amount of One Million Five Hundred Two Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-Four Dollars and Twenty Five Cents (\$1,502,884.25); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the plans and specifications prepared by the Director of Public Works for this project are hereby approved; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the amount of the bond for faithful performance is one hundred percent (100%) of the bid amount, and the amount for a bond to guarantee payment of all claims for labor and materials furnished and for the amount due under the Unemployment Insurance Act, equal to the bid amount, with respect to such work are hereby approved; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Contract shall be reviewed and approved by the City Attorney and placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the approval of this Resolution requires a two-thirds vote of the Council members.
