

ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 12611 C.M.S. (MASTER FEE SCHEDULE), AS AMENDED, INCREASING HOURLY, DAILY AND MONTHLY PARKING FEES AND ADDING NEW PROMOTIONAL PROGRAMS FOR PARKING

FACILITIES OPERATED BY THE CITY OF OAKLAND

AND,

RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$412,706 TO THE MULTIPURPOSE RESERVE FUND (FUND 1750) FOR PARKING FACILITIES OPERATED BY THE CITY OF OAKLAND

SUMMARY

An ordinance has been prepared increasing hourly, daily and monthly parking fees for off-street parking facilities operated by the City of Oakland. Concurrently, a resolution has been prepared to appropriate \$412,706 to the Multipurpose Reserve Fund for the operation of these parking facilities. The parking fee increases result from the passage of Measure Y, and are also needed to cover projected increases in parking management fees and personnel costs.

Parking rates were last increased in 2003, as part of the 2003 - 2005 budget process. The parking rates proposed would be competitive with those currently charged at other facilities adjacent to the City's parking facilities.

The proposed ordinance also includes promotional programs that are currently not in the Master Fee Schedule. These new programs include "Roof Top Special", "Early Bird", "Flat Rate (after 4 pm)" and "Valet Parking" programs. Inclusion of these programs will allow the City to offer incentives and rates flexibly to maximize the occupancy and revenues to its parking facilities.

The proposed parking fees increase is consistent with the following Mayor and City Council goals and citywide objective # 5:

Model Best Practices to Improve Customer Service and to Be a Fiscally Sound and Efficiently Run City of Oakland

Staff recommends approval of the ordinance and resolution.

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FISCAL IMPACT

The parking fee increase is projected to generate approximately \$1,650,000 annually for the Multipurpose Reserve Fund (1750), Off-Street Parking Fees Account (45312). This revenue projection is based on the anticipated increase for each garage, and the amount of revenue received by each garage. In fiscal 2003-2004, the City's parking facilities generated approximately \$5,159,000 in gross revenues. The proposed fees represent an overall increase of approximately 32% to gross off-street parking revenues.

A summary of the proposed hourly and monthly reserved fee increases is attached (see Attachment A).

Fee revisions would take affect with one quarter remaining in the fiscal year, generating \$412,706. Approval of the attached resolution will authorize \$412,706 to be appropriated as both revenue and expenditure in the Multipurpose Reserve Fund, non-project. Of this amount, \$289,411 will be budgeted to pay for the parking tax increase required by Measure Y, in the Taxes and Assessments Account (53511), from January 1, 2005 through June 30, 2005. An additional \$53,740 will be budgeted for projected increases in parking management fees in Miscellaneous Contract Services Account (54919). The remainder will be budgeted for ongoing increased utility and miscellaneous service costs (accounts 53100 and 53700).

BACKGROUND

In January 2005, the 8.5% surcharge on the parking tax went into effect and many private parking facilities enacted substantial fee increases at that time. Staff was planning to propose parking fee revisions earlier this year, but first took the opportunity in January 2005 to survey and analyze rates at parking facilities in proximity of the City-owned and operated parking facilities. Staff grouped garages by geographic area (Area A, B, C etc.) for this analysis. Staff also analyzed trends in the garage operating expenses and other financial aspects of the garage contracts. The results of the survey indicated that the rates charged at the City facilities were well below the average of the competing facilities (see attached Parking Survey, Attachment B). The results also highlighted opportunities to develop incentive programs to increase garage use in off-peak hours.

The proposed ordinance will enable the City to implement parking fees that are competitive with privately-owned facilities, will cover the 8.5% increase in the parking tax that was imposed through Measure Y, and will allow the City to fully cover increases in personnel and operating costs associated with the garages.

The inclusion of promotional parking programs, similar to those offered by competing facilities, will allow flexibility in offering incentives and services to maximize occupancy and revenues.

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Many competing parking facilities offer "Early Bird" and "Rooftop Special" rates where occupancy, especially on the top level of multi-story structures, is below capacity. Occupancy of many garages decreases late in the afternoons, and the addition of a flat rate after 4 pm can be used as an incentive to attract additional parkers. The ability to include valet parking and special event rates adds flexibility to accommodate specific situations that are currently not addressed in the Master Fee Schedule. These specific proposals are included in the Master Fee Schedule Ordinance amendment.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

Parking rates at the City's parking facilities are currently low when compared with nearby privately owned facilities. Increasing rates at the City's facilities will boost revenues needed to keep pace with increasing personnel and management costs, and will cover payment of the additional 8.5% parking tax for Measure Y violence prevention programs and police staffing, while keeping the City's parking facilities competitive.

Analysis of the parking rates at privately operated garages in the vicinity of the city-owned garages indicates that this increase will not adversely impact the competitiveness of the City-owned garages. In addition, the additional promotional programs are expected to increase parking usage over current levels and better serve garage customers.

Failure to enact a rate increase will result in a decrease in net revenues of approximately \$438,000 annually, as the result of the additional 8.5% parking tax levied for program costs.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic</u>: The proposed parking fees increase will have a positive impact on the local economy by generating additional revenue for the City. The additional revenue will be used to fund violence prevention programs and public safety staffing, and improve the levels of service and management at the City's parking facilities.

<u>Environmental</u>: There are no environmental opportunities as the result of the proposed parking fee increase.

<u>Social Equity</u>: The parking fees increase will support violence and crime prevention programs that will benefit all City residents, and improve the perception of the City as a safe place to reside and conduct business.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

There is no impact to disabled or senior citizen access.

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RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the ordinance and approve the resolution authorizing the City Administrator to implement a competitive parking fee increase, to generate revenue to support Measure Y programs and to cover increasing personnel and parking management costs.

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the ordinance and the resolution.


