Informational Report in September 2016 re: New methods for processing Cultural Arts and Other Small Grant Programs, such as reducing demands unnecessary for such grants and re-creating the grant management process that are online and paperless in order to maximize efficiency [6/30/15, Council President's 2015-17 Policy Directives]
- 2. As a result of the Report and Resolution Decreasing Estimated Revenue And Offsetting Expenditures From The 2014 Raiders Ticket Surcharge To Reflect Actual Revenues Collected And Authorizing A Transfer Of \$162,101.38 Which Is The Actual Revenue Collected, From The Non-Departmental Citywide Activities Budget To The Oakland Parks And Recreation Budget To Benefit Citywide Youth Activities (14-1164) at the 9/29/15 LEC: The Committee directed staff to return in November 2015 for formal adoption of criteria for equitable distribution of funds/programs throughout all Council Districts of the City.
