## AUTOMATED LICENSE PLATE READER (ALPR) UPDATE CITY COUNCIL – JULY 16<sup>TH</sup> 2024

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## <u>UPDATES</u>

No direct master services agreement with Flock:

- CHP and Flock entered into Master Services Agreement (MSA) includes 180 cameras for CHP and 290 cameras for OPD
- MOU between CHP and the City of Oakland (OPD) stipulates that we own the data and are administrators – addresses how cameras will be installed – allows data sharing between OPD and CHP – outlines that Flock will work with OPD to place cameras and that OPD will reimburse CHP for ALPR costs related to OPD within 12 months of MOU signing – (Costs on next slide)
- MOU between Flock and the City of Oakland (OPD) states that the terms and conditions of the CHP/Flock MSA apply to the City of Oakland – outlines the camera deployment plan – allows OPD to work directly with Flock for the cameras in Oakland

## <u>UPDATES CONTINUED</u>

The City of Oakland (OPD) appropriated \$1,500,000 USD towards the procurement of an ALPR system

The agreement currently only covers installation and one year of service at a cost of \$970,600 USD - OPD is also allocating a budget of \$23,200 USD for camera replacement or repair – costs will initially be covered by CHP

Year one will be pro-rated based on the installation date of the camera

Continued use of the FLOCK system after year one will require the execution of a new master services agreement between the City of Oakland (OPD) and FLOCK
