**SUBJECT: Action On A Request From The Family Of Tomás Melero-Smith,  
Who Was Fatally Shot On September 1, 2007, For A Response By The  
City Council On The Petition Sent On September 10th On Behalf Of  
The Family**

---

Tomás Melero-Smith was fatally shot on September 1, 2007 in Oakland. Melero-Smith had been working as a youth recreation leader at the Carmen Flores Community Center in Oakland and worked hard to improve the Fruitvale community where he grew up.

Tomas Melero-Smith's family wrote a petition to the Mayor, City Councilmembers, City Administrator, Director of Office of Parks and Recreation and Police Chief asking the City to invest in its youth and to memorialize the contributions to the community made by Tomás Melero-Smith. This report was scheduled for the Public Safety Committee in response to the petition.

The petition stated the following:

*On September 1<sup>st</sup>, Tomás Melero-Smith, a young community leader and a 2007 graduate of St. Joseph Notre Dame, was fatally shot ending his hopes, dreams and future as one of Oakland's most promising future community leaders. The City of Oakland needs to invest in its youth. Tomás Melero-Smith's contribution to the city and his legacy must not be reduced to a dismal number the media assigns to its many innocent victims.*

***This is a call to action for the City of Oakland. We're demanding that you invest in the protection of our Oakland youth. As concerned citizens we are demanding the following:***

- 1. To solve the murder of Tomás Melero-Smith.*

2. *A memorial to be named after Tomás Melero-Smith to commemorate his contributions to the city; so his life will not be reduced to a number in the city's dismal statistics and records.*
3. *An immediate city resolution with a clear timeline addressing the measures that will be taken to ensure the safety of the youth in our community.*
4. *An immediate community forum including the city council members, Congresswoman Barbara Lee, Mayor Dellums and the Oakland Chief of Police Wayne G. Tucker.*
5. *An immediate investment in outreach programs, after school programs and community centers that provide alternatives for Oakland youth, especially in underserved areas.*
6. *A public response from the Oakland Police Department outlining steps that will be taken to assure the safety of Oakland's youth, which includes the immediate assignment of Oakland's best and most experienced officers to the areas in Oakland that pose the greatest threat to the safety of Oakland's youth.*
7. *Match the existing reward for information regarding the homicide and provide outreach to the citizens of the community where Tomas' life was taken, urging them to come forward with any information they may have.*

*Immediate attention to this matter would be appreciated. We demand that steps be taken by October 1, 2007.*

This report includes responses to items 1, 2, 5, 6 and 7 and allows Chairperson Reid and the members of the Public Safety Committee to address items 3 and 4.

1 and 7) On October 2, 2007 an individual was caught and made admissions to the murder of Tomás Melero-Smith. This same individual was charged with the murder on October 3, 2007.

2) The Office of Parks and Recreation planted a tree and has ordered a plaque to be placed in Josie de la Cruz Park as a memorial of Tomás. The dedication of the memorial took place at the Parks for Peace event on Saturday, October 13, 2007.

5) The Office of Parks and Recreation and the Department of Human Services run a variety of programs and centers and contract with a multitude of community-based organizations to run programs that provide alternatives for youth in underserved areas. Attachment A shows details on the following programs and services sponsored by the City of Oakland for youth in underserved areas:

6) The Oakland Police Department takes the safety of the City's youth seriously. The Department has or participates in a number of proactive programs intended to prevent youth from coming into harms way. Those programs include:

- The Cadet Program
- Campus Life and School Security
- Truancy Intervention
- The Alameda County Family Justice Center
- Internship Program
- Midnight Basketball

The Department also has successful partnerships with Measure Y funded community based organizations such as Youth Uprising and the Youth Employment Partnership as well as the Peace Makers Program. OPD is also working to develop relationships with Catholic Youth Organizations and Catholic Charities who have been funded by Measure Y to render services to families traumatized by violence and gang intervention.

Assignments to specialized units of the Department that address youth issues are considered "preferred." Seasoned and experienced officers gravitate toward these assignments because of the opportunities they present.

**OAKLAND PARKS AND RECREATION JOINS NEIGHBORHOOD PARTNERS TO LAUNCH “PARKS FOR PEACE” PROJECT**

*Year-Long Peace Pole Installation Project Designed to Build Community and Address Street Violence in Oakland*

**OAKLAND, CA** In response to the increase of street violence in Oakland, the City of Oakland’s Office of Parks and Recreation, in partnership with residents of the High Street neighborhood and various community groups, have developed *The Community of Spirit Program*, a consortium designed to develop constructive, creative ways to address the violence plaguing communities throughout Oakland. *The Community of Spirit Program* is comprised of two phases: Phase I, the “**Parks for Peace**” Project and Phase II, Project Mosaic.

Phase I, “Parks for Peace,” calls for communities across Oakland to reclaim neighborhoods that have been struck with violence, beginning with the symbolic action of rededicating 23 parks and recreation centers, neighborhood by neighborhood, over the next year. The project kicks-off on **Saturday, August 11, 2007** at Brookdale Park, located at 2535 High Street. During each rededication, the park will be declared a “Drug Free Zone,” proclaimed a safe environment for peaceful uses only, and a Peace Pole will be installed. Following the kick-off event, two parks will be dedicated to peace each month, culminating on **Sunday, September 21, 2008** on the International Day of Peace with a “Parks for Peace Festival.” Plans for the final dedication event and festival include a major procession from the four corners of Oakland, joining at San Antonio Park, complete with live music, food, community resources and guest speakers. The rededication of each park will involve the neighborhood schools, local businesses, places of worship, and the neighborhood associations in each area.

**“Parks for Peace” Park Dedication/Peace Pole Installation Schedule**

Radical Roving Recreation (RRR) is a program initiative of the Office of Parks and Recreation (OPR) with the purpose of empowering misguided and misdirected youth and young adults ages 14 to 21. The program is designed to reach young people who traditionally have not participated in structured programs. The mission of RRR is aligned with the overall mission of OPR and 2004 Council goals: To build communities and foster livable neighborhoods and to ensure that all Oakland Youth have the opportunity to be successful. The RRR program attempts to achieve these goals by addressing the attitudes of the youth who engage in the services provided.

RRR core programs include Field trips, Sports activities, workshops, team-building, health information, career planning, tutoring, community gardening and Teen Advisory Boards. Current specialized roving programs include: Yoga Night, Footwear Design 510, Cooking Class, Student in Training (SIT), Learn How to Start Your Own Business, Literacy Program, Job Readiness, Sewing, Studio Music Production, Creative Writing, Learn How To Swim, Broadcasting, Filmmaking, Airbrushing, Open Microphone, and Poetry Slams.



**Phase II: Project Mosaic**

Project Mosaic calls upon the faith community, working with the Oakland Coalition of Congregations and other faith-based groups, to join neighborhood associations, the Oakland business community, schools, recreation centers, and all youth-serving organizations to work together in a co-coordinated effort in renewing the human services needed to transform Oakland from a city plagued by violence into a model city of co-operation and peace.
