## ATTACHMENT A: ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY April 2012 Actions

Timeline	Goal	Actions/Outcome
February – June 26, 2012	An Economic Assessment Report will provide an updated comprehensive overview of Oakland's current economic performance. Selected economic indicators such as: Socio-Economic demographics, employment data (labor market characteristics, unemployment and job growth); standard market performance analysis (retail, office, industrial, hotel industries); understanding of overall direct and indirect employment and business activities. The purpose of report is to identify strengths and weaknesses in Oakland's economy to grow business and attract capital in ways that create quality jobs.	Preparation of Overall Economic Assessment & Indicators Report for Oakland Actions: Staff will present the Oakland Economic Development Strategy Project at UC Berkeley on Wednesday, May 2 <sup>nd</sup> to identify Student Interns for Summer 2012. Staff has prepared an initial Economic Indicators Summary that will serve as baseline information for the initial Economic Indicators Dashboard. The economic information will be available to the public, and will also serve as baseline information for the development of the industry action plans.
April 2012	Create a Citywide Economic Development Staff Team.	Economic Development Strategy Project Team Actions: The development and implementation of a successful Economic Development Strategy requires a citywide staff input - Key City units include Marketing & Cultural Arts, Workforce Development; Business Tax; Departments of Housing and Community Development and the Planning, Building & Neighborhood Preservation and the Office of Neighborhood Investment. Staff is conducting various internal outreach meetings.
April 2012	Expand City of Oakland's access to alternative funding sources. Identification and implementation of new funding sources to support or supplement economic development efforts.	Development of Economic Development Tools: Local/State/Federal and Private Actions: Staff continues to obtain information about alternative financing tools available to cities. Based on participation in the 2012 EDA Regional Conference, staff is preparing a grant application to fund West Oakland infrastructure improvements. Staff has begun the review of current City incentives and is planning to present an updated business incentives program to City Council.

April – June 2012	Creation of strategic actions plans to support and strengthen Oakland's key existing industries.	Oakland's Key Economic Industries Work Plans Actions: Staff is underway with the development of the Specialty Food Production Industry Cluster Strategy. Staff has formed partnership with Hope Collaborative, Oakland Food Policy Council to collaborate and share resources and data to develop a comprehensive cluster study, modeling nationwide processes, including ICIC Food Cluster Initiative. Staff is participating in the East Bay Broadband Consortium and will be working with the City's Department of Information Technology to look at Oakland opportunities. The Oakland Shines Program, an important component of the Green Industry Outreach efforts, has successfully concluded. The Program was a collaborative effort of PWA Environmental Services, Economic Development and Quest Partners.
April - June 2012	Coordination and Partnership with Workforce Investment Board and Workforce Development Program efforts.	Review & Coordination with Oakland Workforce Development Actions  Actions: Economic Development and Workforce Development Units are meeting monthly to coordinate efforts, especially major attraction and industry development efforts. Group has agreed to share resources such: 2012-2014 Excellence in Workforce Development, Strategic Plan for the Oakland Workforce Investment Board; Building on Our Assets: Economic Development & Job Creation in the East Bay, October 2011; Putting the East Bay To Work, Sustainable Jobs for the Underemployed, 2009; and the previous Oakland Industrial Business Survey.
April 2012	Overview of Current Key Economic Development Program Activities	Office of Economic and Workforce Development: Economic Development Unit Activities Activity: Business Development Efforts The Office of Economic and Workforce Development is comprised of Marketing & Cultural Arts, Workforce Development and Economic Development units. Unit work plans are under review and priority projects are being defined. Economic Development staff is involved in a number of direct business development services as well as strategic programmatic initiatives.
	City Administrator's Economic Development Cabinet & Oakland Retail Advisory Committee, Oakland Chamber of Commerce	Activity: City Administrator's business advisory committee for input on the business Conditions/Economic Development Strategy Staff participated in the first meeting of the Economic Development Cabinet. Quarterly meetings will be held.
·	Business Development Services	Activity: New & Existing Business Services During the month of April staff held six group meetings with developers, owners and businesses concerning major new business development opportunities. Staff is currently working on 15 new business attraction cases; 6 business expansion cases and 5 business retention cases. The Business Assistance Center had contact with 154 prospective or small businesses in the past month. Services included business licenses, financing referrals, SLBE/DBE certification, and site location queries.

The Enterprise Zone Program statistics for April 2012: 308 tax voucher requests. Of the 308 vouchers: 117 were for new positions and 191 were for existing positions, with an average hourly rate of \$15.21. Employee categories included: 33 were economically disadvantaged, 3 dislocated workers, 10 individuals on public assistance, 7 WOTC individuals, 2 veterans, 2 exoffenders, and 254 TEA residents. Activity: Business Development Meetings **Business Climate Development** Staff continues to participate in the East Bay Economic Development Alliance regional committees on Business Climate and recently attended the East Bay Broadband Consortium meeting. Current coordination activities include meetings with brokers in preparation for the ICSC conference. Preparation for the Mega Region Summit - Broadway Corridor Mobile Tour. Economic Development staff will be leading two bus tours of the Broadway Corridor as an extension of the ULI project as well as efforts to increase developer and business interest in Downtown Oakland. Economic Development staff will be involved in several activities related to the May 3-6<sup>th</sup> California Preservation Conference to be held in Oakland. Activity: Industry Stakeholder Input Staff is conducting an outreach campaign to the 250 respondents to the 2010-2011 Industrial Survey, and will incorporate additional questions about Workforce and Energy Efficiency needs April 2012, in the follow up .A Food Industry Focus Group meeting will be scheduled in later Spring to continued focus on three aspects of operation: Supply Chain Networking, Distribution, and Facility Needs. A web-based Oakland Food Trail will result from the outreach, and be produced along with a new presence on the web for the Office of Economic & Workforce Development, by late Spring, 2012. Staff is working with leaders of Oakland 2.0 (formerly known as In Oak tech cluster) on their launch of a new identity and spring event. Staff will provide outreach to more software/tech companies to grow the cluster. Staff is working with 10 businesses on permitting guidance, expansion or retention issues, within the Food, Engineering, and Non-Profit sectors. Staff made visits on basic retention and permitting issues with over 25 businesses, mainly larger commercial-industrial Broadway Shuttle ridership is currently 2,600 each weekday Monday-Friday 7am-7pm, with an additional 800 passengers using the shuttle on Friday and Saturday nights. In support of efforts **Broadway Shuttle** to maintain and expand the program, staff: • Has submitted SIM Lifeline Transportation grant to cover loss of funds from the elimination of Redevelopment, and potentially expand service until 10pm on weekdays (service currently ends at 7pm). Is developing \$170,000 grant proposal to Alameda County Transportation Commission to operate Friday and Saturday night service for an additional year.

	<ul> <li>Is working to renew Broadway Shuttle funding agreements with Jack London Square, Downtown &amp; Lake Merritt/Uptown Community Benefit Districts, Forest City and the Water Emergency Transportation Authority.</li> <li>Is developing Request for Proposals to complete Broadway Transit Line study using \$300,000 Caltrans grant secured by Economic Development. Study will assess feasibility of different transit modes – bus and rail – to expand the Broadway Shuttle route north to the Kaiser Hospital and MacArthur BART station. Staff is planning for a Downtown Stakeholders meeting in June. Economic Development staff participates in the Broadway Valdez Specific Plan and the West Oakland Specific Plan meetings. Staff also participated in community meetings related to the Coliseum City Specific Plan project.
CBD Program Development	Activity: Assistance to Existing Districts and District Formations Staff attended meeting of the Oakland CBD/BID Managers Council meeting. Work is underway to support renewal of the Lakeside-Lakeshore BID. Staff is providing ongoing assistance with new 2 CBD formations. Staff is working with PWA and Building staff regarding public right of way improvement projects and the development of a district master encroachment permit program.
