SUMMARY


At the September 27th Public Safety Committee, the Committee members asked the Oakland Fire Department to gather information on the defibrillators located throughout City facilities to ensure that they have been replaced and inspected recently.

The Risk Management Division manages the contract for the City's defibrillators located in City facilities. Currently, the Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) in the City buildings are maintained, inspected and cleaned annually by Life Support Services. The pads and batteries of all AEDs located in City facilities were replaced and inspected on June 10, 2011. The next scheduled inspection is mid-October 2011.

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The replacement and inspection schedule is set according to maintenance guidelines set forth by the manufacturer or based results of the annual inspections. The AEDs located in City buildings are between one and six years old.


