RESOLUTION NO. 90897 C.M.S.

RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 90767 C.M.S., WHICH AWARDED OAKLAND FUND FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH (OFCY) GRANTS TO SEVENTY-FOUR (74) NONPROFIT AND PUBLIC AGENCIES FOR ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-FOUR (144) DISTINCT GRANT PROGRAMS PROVIDING DIRECT SERVICES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026, TO:

1. CORRECT THE TOTAL AWARDED AMOUNT FROM EIGHTEEN MILLION TWO HUNDRED FIFTY-TWO THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-TWO DOLLARS (\$18,252,282), TO EIGHTEEN MILLION FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-TWO DOLLARS (\$18,527,382); AND
2. CHANGE THE LEAD AGENCY WITHOUT CHANGES TO THE GRANT AMOUNTS FOR THE FOLLOWING:
 1. REPLACE ASIAN PACIFIC ENVIRONMENTAL NETWORK (APEN) WITH THE CENTER FOR EMPOWERED POLITICS EDUCATION FUND (CEPEF) AS THE FISCAL SPONSOR FOR AYPAL BUILDING API COMMUNITY POWER YOUTH LEADERSHIP AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
 2. REPLACE THE OAKLAND LEAF FOUNDATION WITH GIRLS INC OF ALAMEDA COUNTY AS THE GRANTEE AGENCY FOR LEARNING WITHOUT LIMITS EXPANDED LEARNING PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Kids First! Oakland Fund for Children and Youth (OFCY) was established by voter-approved ballot Measure K in 1996 to set money aside for programs and services benefiting children and youth; and

WHEREAS, OFCY was extended for 12 years by voter approval in 2009 (Measure D);
and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority provided in Charter section 1307, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 13588 C.M.S. on March 3, 2020, which extended OFCY for an additional twelve (12) years, beginning July 1, 2021, and continuing through June 30, 2033; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Oversight Committee was established pursuant to Measure K to provide oversight and direction for the OFCY planning and funding review process; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2025, the Planning and Oversight Committee approved the renewal of the grant agreements with 145 private non-profit and public agencies programs in the specified amounts for a total amount not to exceed \$18,612,382 for a fourth term beginning June 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2025, for summer programs, and beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026 for year-round programs; and

WHEREAS, on June 4, 2025, the Planning and Oversight Committee approved an updated list of 74 agencies and 144 programs that reflected programmatic changes for a total amount not to exceed \$18,252,282 for a fourth term beginning June 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2025, for summer programs, and beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026 for year-round programs; and

WHEREAS, on June 9, 2025, OFCY staff was notified that Asian Pacific Environmental Network (APEN) transferred fiscal sponsorship of the AYPAL program to the Center for Empowered Politics Education Fund (CEPEF); and

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2025, the City Council adopted Resolution 90767 C.M.S. awarding OFCY grants for FY 2025-2026, after which OFCY was informed of programmatic and other changes to grant awards at certain locations; and

WHEREAS, on June 25, 2025, OFCY staff received notice that administration of the Learning Without Limits afterschool program would change from the Oakland Leaf Foundation to Girls Inc. of Alameda County; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 90767 C.M.S. incorrectly listed the total amount of the grant awards to be given and this Resolution will revise the listed amount without amending any individual grants awards; and

WHEREAS, on July 23, 2025, the Planning and Oversight Committee unanimously approved the correct award allocation amount and two programmatic changes for 74 agencies and 144 programs and submits these changes to City Council for approval; and

WHEREAS, all programs seeking lead agency changes were selected through an open and fair application process to receive OFCY funding; and

WHEREAS, the appropriation for FY 2025-2026 to the Kids First Oakland Fund for Children and Youth in the amount of \$22,744,353 is included in the Mayor's FY 2025-2026 Adopted Budget, and 90% of the appropriation in the amount of \$ 20,469,918 is available for grants and is located in Kids First Oakland Children's Fund (1780), OFCY 2025-2026 Project (1007729), Youth Services Organization (78251), OFCY 2025-2026 Account (54912), OFCY Program (YS04); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Charter section 1300, any interest earned and amounts unspent or uncommitted by the fund at the end of any fiscal year are to be made available for future grants; and

WHEREAS, the interest income earned by the Kids First (OFCY) from April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025, is available in the amount of \$1,071,522 for selected grant awards; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That Resolution No. 90767 C.M.S. is hereby amended to increase the awarded amount from Eighteen Million Two Hundred Fifty-Two Thousand Two Hundred and Eighty-Two dollars (\$18,252,282) to Eighteen Million Five Hundred Twenty-Seven Thousand Three Hundred and Eighty-Two Dollars (\$18,527,382); and be it

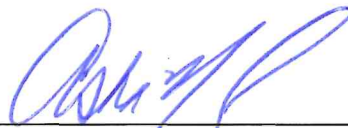
