A Resolution Authorizing A Contract With Design, Community & Environment In An Amount Not To Exceed \$200,000 To Prepare Design And Engineering

Documents For The 66th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project

SUMMARY

Staff requests the Redevelopment Agency approve a resolution authorizing the Agency Administrator to negotiate and execute a contract with Design, Community & Environment (DCE) for an amount not to exceed \$200,000 to prepare streetscape design and engineering documents for 66th Avenue from San Leandro Street to International Boulevard.

FISCAL IMPACTS

The cost of the professional services contract is capped at \$200,000. The Coliseum Redevelopment Area will allocate \$200,000 for the 66th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project from Coliseum Tax Allocation Bond Series 2006 Fund (9455), Capital Improvement Projects - Economic Development Organization (94800), 66th Avenue Streetscape Project (T315310) as budgeted in the FY 2007-09 Proposed Redevelopment Agency Budget.

BACKGROUND

The 66th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project grew out of a Transportation for Livable Communities (TLC) Housing Incentive Program (HIP) award. In June 2005, based on five Oakland housing projects, the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) qualified the City to receive HIP funding. The grant program rewards local governments for approving new housing near transit by providing funding for capital projects that support increased pedestrian, bicycle and transit activities and safety.

Lion Creek Crossings (formerly Coliseum Gardens, HOPE VI) was one of the qualifying residential developments. When complete, it will comprise 382 residential units near the Coliseum BART station. The project submitted to MTC for HIP funding proposed improving

pedestrian and bicycle access between Lion Creek Crossings and the AC Transit hub and BART station on San Leandro Street.

Because only \$530,000 is available through HIP, the improvements initially focused on the segment of 66th Avenue directly fronting Lion Creek Crossings from the Union Pacific tracks to the City of Oakland Fire Station at 1016 66th Avenue. Since receiving the federal Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) number for the project, the Agency has identified potential sources of additional grant funding and is extending the project area west to San Leandro Street and east to International Boulevard.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The project must receive authorization from Caltrans before it can proceed to construction. The HIP is a Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) program, and Caltrans is responsible for administering the implementation of FHWA aided programs and projects. The deadline to obtain authorization is March 2008. Caltrans must receive by that date a "Request for Authorization to Proceed" package, which includes a complete set of plans, specifications, and estimates (PSE). Otherwise the City will lose \$530,000 in HIP funding.

Construction of the streetscape improvements will be phased. The initial phase will cover only what can be constructed with the HIP funds. The Agency will use the plans completed under this contract to apply for additional funding to construct the rest of the proposed improvements.

Consultant Selection Process

On March 16, 2007, the Agency issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) seeking proposals from design consultants to develop design and engineering documents for streetscape improvement of 66th Avenue. The proposals were due on April 16, 2007. Three consultant teams submitted proposals. On April 23, 2007, the Redevelopment Agency, in cooperation with the Public Works Agency and the office of Council District 6, interviewed all three teams. The interview panel reviewed the qualifications and presentations of the consultant teams and evaluated them according to a broad range of criteria, including their project management capacity, construction knowledge, and experience with community participation. Evaluation points were assigned to the criteria and totaled for each consultant team. The DCE team received the highest score.

Consultant Team

DCE is a multi-disciplinary firm of landscape architects, urban designers, public meeting facilitators, and environmental planners. Although based in Berkeley, DC&E will lead an experienced consultant team entirely composed of Oakland-based firms. Dowling Associates (LBE) will serve as the team's traffic engineer. Moffat and Nichol (LBE) will be responsible for civil engineering. Zeiger Electrical Engineers (SLBE) will provide electrical engineering expertise. PLS Surveys (WBE, SLBE) will conduct the necessary surveys for the project. Finally, David Widelock Landscape Design (SLBE) will serve as the irrigation specialist for the

project and provide state-of-the-art water conserving design. The City's Contract Compliance Division has reviewed the consultant team's proposal and has determined that it is in compliance with the City's LBE/SLBE goals (see Attachment A).

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The 66th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project will focus on pedestrian safety measures along approximately 2,800 lineal feet of 66th Avenue from San Leandro Street to International Boulevard. Project features include bulb-outs, crosswalks, and signage, and may include bot dots or Santa Rosa lights, roadway resurfacing, new pedestrian-scaled streetlights, and landscaping. These improvements are intended to enhance the pedestrian environment and encourage people to walk and bike to the area's local destinations such as the new park at Lion Creek Crossings, the Carter Gilmore Sports Complex between 66th and 69th Avenues, and the transit facilities on San Leandro Street and International Boulevard.

As a major east-west arterial and one of a limited number of thoroughfares to cross San Leandro Street, 66th Avenue connects Interstate 880 with International Boulevard and consequently experiences heavy traffic flow. Trucks traveling to and from San Leandro Street, a primary trucking route, contribute to the traffic. As the neighborhood becomes increasingly residential, the need to mitigate vehicle/pedestrian conflicts, along with the potential for vehicle/pedestrian collisions, intensifies.

In addition to City staff, this project will involve coordination with the local community, local business owners, MTC and Caltrans.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic

The implementation of this project would support long-term efforts to revitalize the Coliseum Area by addressing problems related to the public safety and comfort of pedestrians in the area.

Environmental

Improving the pedestrian environment would help reduce auto dependency and increase the number of walking and public transit trips. The project complements larger redevelopment efforts in the area to create transit-oriented development that includes new residential and commercial uses easily accessed by public transit.

Social Equity

The Project, if implemented, would provide basic service levels and quality of life amenities to the community's residents, who are largely low-income.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

The planning study being undertaken in this contract will directly address the issue of disability and senior citizen access as part of the analysis of pedestrian safety and access on 66th Avenue. Any proposed improvements identified under the plan will be required to comply with state and federal accessibility requirements, including Federal ADA Accessibility Guidelines and the State of California's Title 24 Accessibility regulations.

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE COUNCIL AND AGENCY MEMBERS

Staff recommends that the Agency approve the resolution authorizing the Agency Administrator to negotiate and execute a contract with DCE for an amount not to exceed \$200,000, to prepare design and engineering documents for the 66th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH DESIGN, COMMUNITY & ENVIRONMENT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$200,000 TO PREPARE DESIGN AND ENGINEERING DOCUMENTS FOR THE 66TH AVENUE STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Five Year Implementation Plan for the Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area, adopted on June 23, 1995, encourages streetscape improvements to major streets within the Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area, which includes 66th Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Agency prepared and distributed to design consultants a Request for Proposals seeking a team to prepare design and engineering drawings for the streetscape enhancement of 66th Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Agency received three responses to the Request for Proposals and an Agency Selection Committee interviewed all three respondents; and

WHEREAS, the Selection Committee scored the respondents on their interview and awarded Design, Community & Environment (DCE) and their associated team the highest score; and

WHEREAS, the Selection Committee recommends DCE and their associated team for the 66th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, the Agency wishes to enter into a contract with DCE in an amount not to exceed \$200,000 for the preparation of design and engineering documents for the 66th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, the Agency finds that the design and engineering contract will be for services of a professional nature, and the services under this contract will be temporary; and

WHEREAS, the Agency finds that the design and engineering contract will not result in the loss of employment or salary by any person having permanent status in the competitive service; and

WHEREAS, the proposed study area is within the boundaries of the Coliseum Redevelopment Project Area; and

WHEREAS, the contract's cost of \$200,000 will be allocated from Coliseum Tax Allocation Bond Series 2006 (9455), Capital Improvement Project – Economic Development Organization (94800), 66th Avenue Streetscape Project (T315310) now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the Agency authorizes the Agency Administrator or her designee to negotiate and execute a contract with DCE in an amount not to exceed \$200,000 to prepare design and engineering drawings for the 66th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Agency hereby allocates \$200,000 from Coliseum Tax Allocation Bond Series 2006 (9455), Capital Improvement Project – Economic development Organization (94800), 66th Avenue Streetscape Project (T315310) as budgeted in the FY 2007-09 Proposed Redevelopment Agency Budget for this contract; and be it
