# **TOWN ALIVE: ECONOMIC ACTIVATION ZONES**

The **Town Alive** initiative establishes **Economic Activation Zones**—designated areas that re-energize Oakland's public spaces, strengthen small businesses, and connect residents to innovation opportunities.

The program launches with two pilot components:

- Entertainment Zones to activate commercial corridors with family-friendly outdoor events and cultural festivals
- 2. **Responsible Artificial Intelligence (Al) Activation Zones** to foster equitable, community-based innovation and create hubs for community-based Al programming

Together, these pilots make Oakland's economy more vibrant, inclusive, and future-ready.

# Why This Matters

Since the COVID-19 pandemic, Oakland has been rebuilding its local economy. Yet, many of our commercial corridors still need structured opportunities for economic and cultural activation.

**Town Alive** bridges that gap by:

- Reviving local commercial corridors through safe, family-friendly programming.
- Partnering with community institutions to expand access to the growing responsible Al economy.

Oakland's economic recovery depends on reconnecting people to places—and ensuring innovation benefits every neighborhood.

# The Zones

## **Entertainment Zones**

By ordinance, these zones will create opportunities for outdoor gatherings, performances, and cultural festivals in Oakland's commercial corridors.

- Utilizes **SB 969**, allowing adjacent bars and restaurants to sell alcohol in to-go containers for on-site consumption within the zone.
- Supports community-led programming that celebrates Oakland's diversity and creativity.

#### Pilot Entertainment Zone Locations:

- Jack London District
- Broadway Valdez/Northlake District
- Temescal District
- Uptown Downtown

# Management Plans:

- Management Plans are tailored plans for each Entertainment Zone that establish location-specific requirements for operations, public health, and public safety during events
- Produced by the Economic & Workforce Development Department (EWD) in collaboration with community partners, OPD, OakDOT, OPW, and other relevant departments

## Becoming An Entertainment Zone:

- Contact your Councilmember and EWD to begin the process
- Receive City Council approval by ordinance establishing the Zone
- Develop a Management Plan with EWD outlining programming, safety, and operations
- Apply for Entertainment Zone event funding through the Oakland Fund for Public Innovation (if desired)

## Responsible Al Activation Zones

These are physical hubs for **community-driven Al education and innovation**, ensuring Oakland leads with equity in emerging technologies.

Led by the **Oakland Fund for Public Innovation (OFPI)**, first-year programming will include:

- Public education events and professional conferences
- Civic technology pilots and student internships & showcases
- Small business support for responsible Al adoption
- Workforce development programs

## Locations:

- Laney College (Downtown)
- The Unity Council's Unity Tech Hub (Fruitvale)
- Mills College at Northeastern University (East Oakland)

# **Budget & Timeline**

- **Funding:** \$1 million startup allocation approved in the FY 2025-27 budget, and managed by OFPI, to support Entertainment Zones and Responsible AI Activation Zones.
- Sustainability: Future funding expected through private and philanthropic partnerships
- Council Consideration: November 2025
- Launch: Spring/Summer 2026
