A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE CITY OF OAKLAND'S POSITION ON THE FOLLOWING 2003 STATE LEGISLATION:

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland or its residents would be affected by the pending State Legislation; and

WHEREAS, SB 916 (\$1 Toll Increase on Bay Area Bridges) by Senator Perata would authorize voters to impose a \$1 toll increase on the Bay Area's seven state-owned toll bridges to fund a variety of new transit services, safe routes to transit for pedestrians and bicyclists, and other improvements to freeways connecting to the bridges; and

WHEREAS, ACR 39 (Alexander Zuckermann Bicycle-Pedestrian Path) by Assemblywoman Chan would designate the bicycle-pedestrian path on the new Oakland-San Francisco Bay Bridge east span as the "Alexander Zuckermann Bicycle-Pedestrian Path" in recognition of this Oakland resident' many years of successful advocacy on behalf of bicyclists; and

WHEREAS, AB 1409 (Bike Racks on Commuter Buses) by Assemblywoman Wolk would allow a public transit agency to operate buses that exceed 45 feet in length when the excess length is caused by a folding bicycle rack mounted on the front to the bus; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City of Oakland declares its **support** for SB 916 (\$1 Toll Increase on Bay Area Bridges) by Senator Don Perata, ACR 39 (Alexander Zuckermann Bicycle-Pedestrian Path) by Assemblywoman Wilma Chan, and AB 1409 (Bike Racks on Commuter Buses) by Assemblywoman Lois Wolk; and be it
