RE: A FOLLOW-UP REPORT TO PROVIDE FURTHER DIRECTION TO THE

CITY ADMINISTRATOR FOR ALLOCATION OF THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDING FOR FY 05-07, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO ALLOCATIONS TO ALICE STREET

LEARNING CENTER AND CENTRO LEGAL DE LA RAZA.

SUMMARY

On May 3, 2005, the City Council considered and passed a resolution approving recommendations for CDBG funding for FY 05-07, with the exception of \$20,000 originally recommended by staff for Centro Legal de La Raza, which remains unallocated.

The City Council requested staff to come back to allow for further discussion on whether the unallocated \$20,000 should be awarded to Centro Legal de La Raza for the provision of legal services to Latino low-income residents or to Alice Street Learning Center to cover the deficit needed to honor the City's prior commitment to cover the second year of the Center's lease cost.

FISCAL IMPACT

This action would appropriate \$20,000 of FY 2005-06 CDBG grant funds that are currently unallocated. No new revenue is required.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

Based upon the discussions which took place, staff is providing the following options:

- Direction to allocate and expend the unallocated \$20,000 to Alice Street Learning Center to ensure that adequate funding is in place to cover the lease cost. The City has entered into a two-year lease (through June 30, 2006) for the facility, and as the lessee of the facility is legally obligated to pay these costs. The resolution adopted by the City Council at its May 3, 2005 meeting awarded \$53,140 to Alice Street Learning Center, leaving a shortfall of \$20,000.
- Direction to allocate and expend the unallocated \$20,000 to Centro Legal de la Raza for the
 provision of legal services to Latino low-income residents. Under this option, the City
 would need to find other funding to pay for the remainder of the Alice Street Learning
 Center lease.

Item: ______ City Council May 17, 2005 • Direction to amend the Consolidated Plan to fund both Alice Street Learning Center and Centro Legal de la Raza by reducing the Housing and Economic Development allocations an additional \$20,000 and utilizing the above outstanding \$20,000.

There are no disability and senior citizen access issues associated with this follow-up report. The original report and resolution addressed the disability and senior citizen access issues.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends City Council select an option regarding the recommendation of the outstanding \$20,000 in CDBG funds for FY 05-07. Staff will revise accordingly the lists of Consolidated Plan Projects and CDBG contracts that were included in the Supplemental Report on May 3, 2005 based upon the option selected.
