RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE AGREEMENT WITH THE KPA GROUP FOR ADDITIONAL AS-NEEDED ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) FOR A TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THREE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$350,000)

#### **SUMMARY**

A resolution has been prepared authorizing the City Administrator, or her designee, to amend the existing agreement with The KPA Group (Oakland) to provide additional architectural services on an as-needed basis for an additional amount not to exceed \$100,000 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$350,000.

The original as-needed professional services agreement from March 2004 with The KPA Group was for an amount not to exceed \$250,000. Tasks for various projects have fully utilized the initial contract amount. Additional architectural services are required for the evaluation, design and construction support to complete the ongoing Police Administration Building Retrofit project and the Live Oak Pool Deck Repair project. The KPA Group can provide the additional design and construction support services in the most efficient and cost effective manner because of their familiarity and current involvement in these ongoing projects.

The projects are consistent with the Mayoral and Council objective to "Maintain and Enhance Oakland's Physical Assets." The Police Administration Building is located in Council District 3 and the Live Oak Pool is located in Council District 2.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

Amendment No. 1 will allow the consultant to perform design work and provide construction support services on an as-needed basis for the Police Administration Building Retrofit project, the Live Oak Pool Deck Repair project and other ongoing projects. The contract amendment is in an amount not to exceed \$100,000. The additional services will be funded through the various individual projects. Funds for the Police Administration Building Retrofit project are available from the FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant (Fund 2146, Project No. C58691, Organization No. 92270, Account No. 54411). Funds for the Live Oak Pool Deck Repair project are available from the Proposition 40 Per Capita Grant Fund (Fund 2134, Project No. G251110, Organization No. 92270, Account 54411). Funds for other ongoing project will be identified prior to the performance of the architectural services.

#### BACKGROUND

On March 16, 2004, City Council approved Resolution No. 78393 C.M.S. awarding an asneeded architectural services contract to The KPA Group for an amount not to exceed \$250,000.

Previous task orders and assignments for The KPA Group have included the following:

- Temescal Pool Filtration Project Preparation of construction documents and providing construction support.
- Cryer Site Project Evaluation of existing building condition at 1899 Dennison Street.
- Live Oak Pool Deck Repair Project Preparation of construction documents and providing construction support.
- Woodminster Restroom Renovation Project Providing construction support.
- Police Administration Building Retrofit Project Providing supplemental design services and construction support.

Of the initial contract amount of \$249,549 that has been expended thus far, there was L/SLBE participation of \$213,449 (86%). The LBE/SLBE information has been verified by the Contract Compliance Division of the City Administrator's Office and is shown on Attachment A. As the specific scope of work of the additional architectural services are developed, the consultant will maximize the usage of small local sub-consultants to the extent feasible.

#### KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

In order to complete the Police Administration Building Retrofit project and the Live Oak Pool Deck Repair project, the following additional architectural services from The KPA Group are required:

- Police Administration Building Retrofit: Soil testing, dewatering inspection services and additional construction support during construction (\$60,000).
- Live Oak Pool: Pool leakage and drainage investigation, supplemental design work and construction support (\$25,000).

In addition, Amendment No. 1 will provide a contingency of \$15,000 for other potential services, including other ongoing City projects. The KPA Group can provide the additional design and construction support services in the most efficient and cost effective manner because of their familiarity and current involvement in these ongoing projects. Use of another consultant to complete the ongoing design services is not practical due to the existing design responsibilities and liabilities.

### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic</u>: The projects will generate jobs for Oakland residents, and business tax, sales tax and other revenues for the City by those who work on the projects.

<u>Environmental</u>: Environmental factors and opportunities will be considered and incorporated to the extent feasible. Consultants will be required to consider the use of recycled materials in the

products specified and integrate other environmental opportunities, waste reduction and energy conservation.

Social Equity: The Live Oak Pool project will enhance recreational activities to the neighborhood.

## DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

The consultant will be required to design the City facilities in full compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and to provide improvements to the access for seniors and persons with disabilities.

### RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

It is recommended that the Amendment No. 1 to the existing agreement with The KPA Group for additional as-needed architectural services be approved so that the ongoing projects can be completed. Amendment No. 1 is for an additional amount not to exceed \$100,000 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$350,000.

## **ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL**

Staff recommends that the City Council approve this resolution.
