

I have commuted by bike in Oakland for over ten years and used a bicycle as my primary form of transit for all of my adult life. I am a passionate enthusiast of a well-connected bicycle and pedestrian network. While traveling, I seek out dedicated, non-vehicular trails and greenways for the experience of connecting destinations on foot or on two wheels. I frequently utilize Oakland's bicycle boulevards and dedicated bike routes, and I take longer rides up into the East Bay hills and around the Bay. In my professional capacity as a landscape architect, I specialize in multi-modal trails and open space projects, so I understand the complexities of planning, designing, and constructing pedestrian and bike networks. I have worked on bicycle and green streets projects within the City of Oakland and neighboring cities, including segments of the San Francisco Bay Trail. Within my office, I have organized the annual Bike to Work Day committee to host an energizer station. I help to promote bicycle transit within our office by advocating for additional bicycle storage space and promoting bicycle programs to our team. I believe that Oakland has much to offer the pedestrian and bicyclist and want to see the City become a leader in non-vehicular transportation and public safety. I have lived and traveled to other cities with better, more connected networks and had experienced locations with poorly planned infrastructure. I believe that I have the capacity to thoughtfully consider transit projects from the bicycle and pedestrian standpoint and would be a strong addition to the Commission. Thank you for the opportunity to potentially serve on the Bicycle & Pedestrian Advisory Commission. I have been interested particularly in pedestrian safety issues ever since I was a high school youth and volunteered with Asian Health Services when due to a pedestrian hit and run fatality of a senior in Chinatown led to the advocacy for the first pedestrian scramble crosswalk in Oakland. That experience was what propelled me to study political science in school and eventually earn a Master's in Public Policy. One of the main things making me want to serve on this Commission was the recent hit and run outside Garfield Elementary and I hope this Commission through working with city agencies and advising the city leadership can help make a difference in improving safety for all modes of transportation in and around our City. For the last few years as a D4 resident, there has been similar concerns around bike and pedestrian safety in and around parks and schools. In my 11 years working in Oakland for different organizations and institutions, I have focused on improving access and equity for under-served communities. While much of my work has been focused on District 2 and 3, all of them have been analyzed in a citywide context when looking at regional planning processes like the Lake Merritt BART Redevelopment, Downtown Oakland Specific Plan, and Oakland Alameda Access Project which impact more than their immediate neighborhoods. My career has focused on looking at how to reduce the gaps of traditionally underserved communities including but not limited to communities of color, immigrants, limited English speaking, LGBT and formerly incarcerated and I would welcome the opportunity to explore bicycle and pedestrian access issues from those lenses, Thank you for your consideration, Michael Lok



RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT OF JESSE JONES, MICHAEL LOK AND DAVID RALSTON AND REAPPOINTMENT OF ANDREW CAMPBELL TO THE BICYCLIST AND PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COMMISSION

WHEREAS, Section 601 of the City Charter provides that members of City boards and commissions shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the affirmative vote of five members of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 18815 C.M.S., adopted February 4, 2014, created the Oakland Bicyclist and Pedestrian Advisory Commission to advise City Council and staff on bicyclist- and pedestrian- specific policies, projects, and programs, and on the accommodation of bicyclists and pedestrians in all transportation plans, policies, projects and programs, and to provide annual reports to the Public Works Committee of the City Council, to summarize the Commission's work over the course of the year, and to identify key policy issues affecting the safety of and access for bicyclists and pedestrians in Oakland; and

WHEREAS, the Bicyclist and Pedestrian Advisory Commission consists of nine members serving three-year staggered terms with no more than six consecutive years of service by any Commissioner; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Mayor Libby Schaaf has appointed Jesse Jones, Michael Lok, and David Ralston to each serve on the Bicyclist and Pedestrian Advisory Commission subject to confirmation by the City Council; now therefore be it
