\$8.22 Million Deficit in the General Purpose Fund.

An Ordinance Amending Ordinance Number 12880 C.M.S. (Master Fee Schedule), as Amended, to Establish, Modify, and Delete Fees Assessed by the

Office of Parks and Recreation.

SUMMARY

At its March 17th meeting, the City Council directed staff to return with appropriate legislation with a balancing proposal to address the projected \$8.22 million deficit in the General Purpose Fund (GPF). The attached resolution is necessary to implement position reductions, funding changes and revenue increases.

Attached legislation includes amendments to Ordinance Number 12880 C.M.S. (Master Fee Schedule) to increase fees assessed by the Office of Parks and Recreation.

Responses to Council questions from March 17, 2009 City Council meeting will be included in a supplemental report next week.

FISCAL IMPACT

This report provides balancing options to address the \$8.22 million current-year shortfall, through a combination of spending reductions, revenue enhancements (e.g., increased user fees). The implementation of measures is assumed by <u>April 1</u> for vacancies and most personnel reductions / transfers, and <u>April 18</u> for layoffs. Council action on March 31st is essential to meet these timelines.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

On March 17, 2009, the City Council reviewed the informational report providing additional balancing measures to address the anticipated year-end GPF shortfall. The City Council directed staff to return with appropriate legislation for Council authorization:

A. Resolution on FY 2008-09 options to address the year-end GPF shortfall

The Second Quarter Revenue and Expenditure Report presented at the February 24th Finance and Management Committee projected a year-end deficit of \$8.22 million in the General Purpose

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Fund. The components of this shortfall are:

- \$0.75 million net revenue under collection; and
- \$7.47 million projected overspending in expenditures.

A comprehensive balancing plan has been developed based on direction received from the City Council on March 17, 2009. Generating these savings would require elimination of **13.25 FTEs**. These reductions are summarized below and detailed in Exhibit A.

- Citywide savings of \$0.01 million are anticipated as follows:
 - Suspending auto allowances for unrepresented non-sworn staff positions If auto allowances are suspended for unrepresented positions, a savings of \$0.01 million are anticipated from April 1 to June 30, 2009. Please note that auto allowances for agency / department heads were suspended as part of the October 2008 budget revisions for savings of \$0.04 million. Suspension of additional auto allowances would impact 9 employees who are not represented by a union.
- Freeze expenditures on select projects to yield current-year under-spending of \$4.21 million:
 - > Specific GPF project balances would be carried forward to the next fiscal year, thereby shifting the deficit burden to FY 2009-10. Given the time constraints and the pressing need to avoid using the City's diminishing reserves these temporary measure totaling \$4.21 million are essential to address the year-end projected deficit of \$8.22 million. Exhibit A provides a detailed discussion for each of these projects. Per City Council direction deferral of payments for the Red Light Camera Enforcement project to the next fiscal year has been withdrawn.
- Departmental savings of \$4.18 million are proposed as follows:
 - > Contract and Purchasing proposes reduction of a full time Compliance Officer position to a part time position (0.50 FTE) (\$0.02 million).
 - ➤ If approved, Police Services would charge 14 of their Problem Solving Officers to Measure Y to reflect the work that these officers perform; additional overtime savings; overtime claim from BART shooting protests and transferring O&M to State Asset Forfeiture (\$2.98 million). Per City Council direction, elimination of 5.0 non-sworn FTEs has been withdrawn.
 - > Museum proposes savings from authorized leave and freezing current vacancy. (\$0.08 million).
 - ➤ Parks and Recreation proposes parking and pool fee increases; elimination of Public Service Representative, PPT position (0.75 FTE); and transfer of Central Reservation Unit costs to the Self Sustaining Fund (\$0.30 million).
 - > Fire Services proposes to keep the Fire Suppression District Inspector position vacant through year-end. (1.0 FTE) (\$0.02 million).
 - > Human Services proposes to keep a Program Analyst I position vacant through year-end. (\$0.07 million).
 - Library proposes savings from the closures of the Montclair Branch for two additional weeks after mold and mildew mitigation completion in mid-June (\$0.08 million).

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- Finance and Management proposes savings from insurance recoveries of City vehicles and property (\$0.37 million).
- > Personnel Management proposes elimination of 4.0 FTE vacancies: Public Service Representative (1.0 FTE) and HR Clerks (3.0 FTE) (\$0.05 million).
- ➤ Information Technology proposes elimination of 7.00 FTEs: Microcomputer Systems Specialist II (4.0 FTE), Systems Analyst I (1.0 FTE), Systems Analyst III (1.0 FTE) and Microcomputer Systems Specialist I (1.0 FTE) (\$0.21 million).

B. Ordinance Amending Master Fee Schedule for Office of Parks and Recreation Fees.

The Master Fee Schedule (MFS) changes that would be approved through the attached ordinance are summarized below and in <u>Attachment B</u>. The revenue increases are already reflected in the "Parks and Recreation" section above.

1. Office of Parks and Recreation

• The Office of Parks and Recreation (OPR) is increasing certain MFS fees and adding a new fee. Additionally, OPR proposes a change to the language of an existing fee description. Specifically:

a. Service Fees

- i. Change the description of the fee from Lakeside Park Saturday, Sunday, All Major Holidays, Special Events to <u>Lakeside Park Daily</u>;
- ii. Increase the current parking fee for cars from \$3 to \$5; and
- iii. Increase the current parking fee for buses from \$6 to \$7.

b. Aquatics, Swimming Pools

- i. Adult Lap Swim Fee: Increase from \$3 to \$4
- ii. Senior/Disabled Lap Swim Fee: Increase from \$2.25 to \$3.00
- iii. Adult Lap Swim Pass Book (10): Increase from \$27.50 to \$33.00
- iv. Senior Lap Pass Book (10): Increase from \$17.50 to \$21.00

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that the City Council accept this report and adopt the proposed legislation:

- Resolution authorizing the balancing proposal to address the \$8.22 million projected deficit in General Purpose Fund.
- Ordinance amending Ordinance Number 12880 C.M.S. (Master Fee Schedule) as Amended, to Establish, Modify, and Delete Fees Assessed by the Office of Parks and Recreation.

The implementation of measures is assumed by <u>April 1</u> for vacancies and most personnel reductions / transfers, and <u>April 18</u> for layoffs. Council action on March 31st is essential to meet these timelines.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 12880 C.M.S. (MASTER FEE SCHEDULE), AS AMENDED, TO ESTABLISH, MODIFY AND DELETE FEES ASSESSED BY THE OFFICE OF PARKS AND RECREATION

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland periodically updates its Master Fee Schedule to account for general cost of living increases and program changes or other costs; and

WHEREAS, the fee modifications and additions proposed herein have been justified by the respective agency and are identified in an "Agenda Report" dated March 31, 2009 to Dan Lindheim, City Administrator, entitled "An Ordinance Amending Ordinance Number 12880 C.M.S. (Master Fee Schedule), as Amended, to Establish, Modify, and Delete Fees Assessed by the Office of Parks and Recreation"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the herein-referenced modifications and additions are necessary to reimburse the City for the costs of performing the various municipal and regulatory functions; now, therefore

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Master Fee Schedule as set forth in Ordinance Number 12880 C.M.S., as amended, is hereby amended to modify and establish fees assessed by the Office of Parks and Recreation and as set forth in Exhibit B, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage as provided by Section 216 of the City Charter, if adopted by at least six members of Council, or upon the seventh day after final adoption if adopted by fewer votes.
