

Supplemental Report to the October 26, 2004 Status Report on the FY 2003-08

Capital Improvement Program, through June 30, 2004

SUMMARY

This report supplements the Status Report on the FY 2003-08 Capital Improvement Program through June 30, 2004, which was originally presented at the October 26th Finance and Management Committee meeting. This supplemental report responds to issues and questions raised by Council that required more complete elaboration than what staff could provide during the committee meeting. It also includes staff responses to questions posed by Councilmember Brunner's (District 1) Office prior to the presentation on October 26th.

Attachment A has been revised to reflect staff responses, and is included in this report as Attachment A-1. This revised matrix also includes updated Council District information.

FISCAL IMPACT

This is an informational report that does not have a direct fiscal impact. Project balances shown in this report are supported by appropriations approved by the City Council for FY 2003-04, as well as prior years.

DISCUSSION

Revised Summary of Spending

Tables 1-1 and 2-1 update Tables 1 and 2 included in the original October 26, 2004 status report. These tables reflect updated totals by category and grand totals based on staff responses to Council questions.

Responses to Council Questions

Although staff responded to many councilmember questions during the October 26th committee meeting, there were many more to which staff committed to respond in this supplemental report. These questions and answers are included below. Responses to questions posed by Councilmember Brunner's office prior to the report presentation are also included below in a separate section.

Question:

[Councilmember Brunner] Are projects approved by Council after the FY 2003-08 Adopted Capital Improvement Program Budget included in this report?

Response:

The universe of projects included in the FY 2003-04 CIP Status Report include the following projects: 1] projects included in the FY 2002-03 CIP Status Report and 2] projects adopted in the first year of the FY 2003-08 Adopted CIP Budget. Staff is developing a system to include the status of all active capital improvement projects in the FY 2004-05 CIP report.

Question:

[Councilmember Brunner] I understand that relocation is an issue for the Studio One rehabilitation project. Why can't Measure DD funds be used for relocation? What is being done about relocation and continuing programs during the rehabilitation project? Where are we on the schedule?

Response:

Measure DD funds can only be used for capital improvements; temporary relocation costs are not eligible costs. Public Works Agency staff is working with the Office of Parks and Recreation to assist OPR in developing plans to address temporary relocation and continue programs. Alternative locations being considered include moving programs to existing OPR facilities. The Oakland Unified School District has been contacted, along with other local agencies and facilities, to identify potential space that can accommodate the types of programs currently operating out of Studio One.

With respect to the schedule, staff anticipates that design will be complete and bids initiated by May 2005. Construction would then start in fall 2005.

Ouestion:

[Councilmember Nadel] Where are the Grand Avenue Bulb-Out and West Oakland NCR Miscellaneous Improvement projects?

Response:

The Grand Avenue Bulb-Out project in District 3 is active. Project status information is provided in Attachment A-1 on page 11. NCR Miscellaneous Improvement projects are targeted toward areas that are not eligible for redevelopment support. Since West Oakland is a redevelopment project area, its many projects receive redevelopment funding. Up to this point, projects funded with redevelopment money have not been typically included in the Capital Improvement Program Budget, although they are also capital improvement projects. However, beginning with the FY 2004-05 CIP Status report, staff will provide a status report on all active capital improvement projects, irrespective of funding source.

Question:

[Councilmember Wan] Are budget and spending for ADA Transition Plan projects fully reflected?

Response:

Only financial figures for the "parent" (or overarching) project were captured in the original Attachment A. Full budget and spending are now reflected in the revised Attachment A-1, on page 19.

Question:

[Councilmember Nadel] Why doesn't the Bertha Port/Willow Park playground project reflect the Pay-Go funds I'm contributing to the project?

The data included in the report are as of June 30, 2004. The project number included in the report is for a grant that was rescinded. Pay-Go funds contributed to this project occurred after FY 2003-04 and remain within the respective Council members' project appropriation. The Pay-Go funds are committed to the project and will be used for that purpose.

Responses to Questions from Councilmember Brunner's Office regarding Capital Improvement Program Status Report as of June 30, 2004; provided October 25, 2004

Question:

Have there been any capital improvement projects done with CIP money since the Program was passed in 2003 that are not contained within the CIP Budget? If so, what are they?

Response:

Yes, there are capital improvement projects that have been approved by the City Council since the CIP budget was passed. The City Council approves these projects through the agenda process. These projects would likely appear as part of resolutions to apply for and accept grant awards, or to award a contract using existing budget appropriations. Another situation is the Measure DD projects that were approved by Council outside of the CIP budget process. There is no automated mechanism to easily capture all of these additional projects. However, staff is now exploring ways to track the creation and status of capital projects that Council approves after budget adoption.

Ouestion:

Station 8: I thought this project was complete, but the update says there is additional work to be done. What is this work and why was the project deemed complete ("ahead of schedule and under budget")?

Response:

(from PWA) The main project of the re-building of the new Fire Station 8 was complete in March 2003 (ahead of schedule and under project budget). There are several additional items, which were not part of the original scope of work, and were identified by the Fire Department after the completion of the station as necessary for the satisfactory operation of the station. A small amount of funding was left in the project for the work. Lieutenant Bob Young of the Fire Department is taking the lead on getting the work done and anticipates that the work will be completed by March 2005.

Ouestion:

What are the historic and neighborhood issues with the Head Start at San Antonio project?

Response:

(from DHS) The issues originated with the construction of the Head Start Center at San Antonio Park that pre-dated the existence of park zoning regulations. Neighbors objected to the loss of open space in the park. After

many community meetings, the neighbors and the City arrived at an agreement that the Head Start Center would be built and the City would replace the open space loss in another location. The issue led to Council adoption of interim park controls until the completion of OSCAR and formal adoption of park zoning guidelines, including the no net loss of open space policy.

Head Start at San Antonio currently needs to address State Child Care Licensing requirements, involving the addition of a sick child room, adult bathroom and office for the Family Advocate. The design for the improvements has been completed. However, such physical changes could have open space impact and could be a delicate issue with neighbors.

To complete the project, staff would need to conduct the community process, obtain Planning Commission approval and then complete construction. Coordination is also required with the adjacent OPR Recreation Center operations. Staff continues to work with Councilmember Wan's Office, OPR, CEDA-Planning, and PWA to carefully consider the options.

Question:

Fleet update: The balance of this account is \$5.4 million. The update says that the money can be used for acquisitions required in the 05-07 budget, but this money can also be reprogrammed, right? Also, I cannot find the Equipment section in the adopted 2003-2008 CIP. Where is it?

Response:

(from PWA) The 2001-06 CIP budget includes funding for the fleet/equipment replacement. The more recent 2003-08 CIP budget did not include an Equipment section because no new funding was provided for equipment in that cycle.

Equipment acquisitions follow a replacement schedule that considers the age, usage, and condition of the City's fleet/equipment. Funding for these acquisitions comes directly from a lease-purchase bond issuance. The funding source is restricted for replacement and acquisition of fleet/equipment, and can not be reprogrammed for other uses.

Question:

Can you explain why the balance of the Façade Improvement Program is going to Fruitvale Avenue? When did Council make that decision?

Response:

(from CEDA) Funds were appropriated in FY 2002-03 CIP budget to fund Façade Improvement Projects on upper Fruitvale Avenue. CEDA staff was asked how much funding would be required to complete certain streetscape improvements (benches, trees, lights, etc) and 10 - 12 façade improvement projects on upper Fruitvale Avenue which had become the focus of the SDS Team and the City Council Office. An estimate of \$250,000 was provided.

The CIP Budget for FY 2001-02 and 2002-03 was developed and included \$250,000 for the Façade Improvement Program. The budget did not reflect that the funds were allocated to a geographic target area. However, based on the discussions that occurred between staff and the former City Manager's Office, it was understood that the Façade Improvement Program funds in the CIP budget were allocated to projects on upper Fruitvale Avenue. Due to organizing efforts on upper Fruitvale applications for the Facade Program were submitted before the FY 2002-03 funds became available. To accommodate the interest in the Façade Improvement Program, NCR staff began to work with applicants and funded projects that were ready to move forward using NCR's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. Approximately six projects were completed.

In addition to interest in the Façade Improvement Program, businesses and residents requested streetscape improvements on upper Fruitvale. Staff provided a list of improvements totaling \$150,000 for upper Fruitvale Avenue. Around this same time Fruitvale Avenue was awarded an Environmental Justice (EJ) grant to analyze traffic conditions on Fruitvale Avenue from I-880 to MacArthur Boulevard. Staff and the City Council Office discussed postponing streetscape improvements until the EJ grant project is complete in 2005 at which time the CIP funds would be used to implement recommended streetscape improvements.

Question:

NCR-Miscellaneous Improvements (Eastlake): Who added the "two additional blocks" to this project? How much additional money did that cost and when did Council approve the additional expenditure? If it was possible to build within the allocated budget, who decided to expand the project as opposed to returning the balance to the CIP fund?

Response:

(from PWA) The "two additional blocks" were part of the original project scope. However, when staff moved forward to award the contract, the project funding was insufficient to cover the construction improvements at these two blocks [Resolution No. 77817 C.M.S. (May 20, 2003) awarded the Eastlake Streetscape and Pedestrian Enhancement Project to Ray's Electric.]

Subsequently, additional grant funding that was specific for the Eastlake Streetscape and Pedestrian Enhancement Project was secured to fund the construction of these two remaining blocks. Specifically, resolution No. 78580 C.M.S. (June 1, 2004) authorized the City to appropriate a grant of \$191,000 from the Metropolitan Transportation Commission's (MTC) Transportation for Livable Communities Housing Incentive Program (TLC-HIP); and Resolution No. 78250 C.M.S. (December 16, 2003) authorized the City to appropriate a grant of \$262,000 from the Alameda County

Transportation Improvement Authority's (ACTIA) Bicycle and Pedestrian Countywide Discretionary Funds.

Question: Has the construction contract for Bella Vista Park been awarded yet?

Response: (from PWA) The construction contract for Bella Vista Park is now being

awarded/executed. Trust for Public Land (TPL) submitted the bid documents on October 13, 2004. The documents were forwarded to Contract Administration on October 14. TPL was to have submitted the contract to PWA/Contract Administration on Monday, October 11. The document arrived on Wednesday, October 13. The next step is for Contract Administration to issue the contract to the contractor to provide bonds and

insurance.

Question: Please provide some information about what we received for our \$697,433

expenditure for pandas.

Response: (from Budget Office) A panda exhibit at the Oakland Zoo is estimated to

cost \$40 - \$50 million over a 10-year period, according to the Director of the Oakland Zoo. Private funds are expected to support the majority of the cost. FY 2001-03 Capital Improvement Program funding for the exhibit was intended to facilitate on-going activities to support the leasing or procuring of a pair of giant pandas to be housed, studied, and exhibited at

the Oakland Zoo. The funds have been used for this purpose.

Question: Can you give a Council district-by-district breakdown of services provided

under the Emergency Repair and Cyclic Replacement of Sewers and Storm Drain project and the Emergency Storm Drains project? Also, if there could be some sense of where in the City these repairs were concentrated.

Response: (from PWA) Based on the activities related to the past three On-Call

construction contracts under which the sewer and storm drain emergency repairs were completed, a district-by-district breakdown is as follows:

Question:

Is there any option to refinance either of our State Regional Water Quality

Control Board loans?

Response:

(from PWA) These loans have very low interest rates that would not likely

benefit from refinancing.

Question:

City sidewalk repair (01-02): The update says that the balance will be used for the next On Call Sidewalk Repair Contract. Is the On-Call Contract the

same as the list of requested repairs?

Response:

(from PWA) The On-Call contract is issued in monthly work orders rather than a year long contract so there is some flexibility in the locations being repaired. This contract will be used to respond to claims and urgent repairs as determined by the sidewalk inspectors. If there are no claims or urgent repairs pending then the repair locations will be from the list of requested

repairs.

Question:

Citywide Sidewalk Repair (02-03): The update says that this project was delayed because of lack of inspection staffing. How does inspection

staffing delay the actual repair of sidewalks?

Response: (from PWA) The inspectors are needed to: identify and measure the

damaged sidewalk area prior to issuing the contract, verify that the damage

is City tree-related, and to inspect the construction work.

Ouestion: Curb Ramps, Phase V: Please provide a district-by-district breakdown of

curb ramps installed under this program.

Response: (from PWA) Under Phase V, the following number of ramps was

constructed in the different districts:

Question: Sidewalk Repair Survey: Will this survey be conducted as a joint tree-

sidewalk survey as had been discussed during the passage of the tree

legislation sponsored by Councilmember Brunner?

Response: (from PWA) At a minimum the survey will include an inventory of all street

tree / tree well locations. Staff is trying to identify a source of additional

funding to add more information regarding the street trees.

Question: Why is the Oakland Library PC project on hold?

The Oakland Library PC Project was on hold in FY 2003-04 due to lack of Response:

> funds from the original source. However, in the current fiscal year, the Library is moving forward on the network upgrade project, using funds from the Library Services Retention and Enhancement Act (Measure Q). It has just completed a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a new Integrated Library System (catalog) that will be funded through Measure Q over FY 2004-05 and FY 2005-06. As well, though it is on a separate track, the PC Upgrade project will also be funded through Measure Q. The Library has set aside sufficient funding in FY 2004-05 to replace up to one-third of all public and staff computers and will request appropriation to continue replacement of older PCs in the FY 2005-07 Proposed City Policy Budget.

Was the Oracle 11 Gap Analysis project finished? If so, why not? Question:

Response: (from Finance) The Oracle 11 Gap Analysis project was completed in June

of 2002. The results of the analysis produced the technical and functional

Item# City Council November 16, 2004 requirements for the development of an Oracle 11i Upgrade Request for Proposal (RFP). In January 2003, the IT Division evaluated the vendor responses to the Oracle 11i Upgrade RFP, selected and awarded a contract to Solbourne Computer Incorporated in April 2003, and completed the Oracle 11i Upgrade project in August of the same year.

Question:

Can we have a list of all the improvements made under the Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program for FY 01-02 and 02-03?

Response:

(from PWA) The Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program (NTSP) was established to supplement Transportation Services Division's (TSD) operating budget in investigating neighborhood traffic safety issues and implementing improvements. Each year, TSD receives about two thousand requests from the community, the vast majority of which involve neighborhood traffic safety. NTSP funds the time staff spends in investigating these requests and the actual physical improvements (labor and material). In FY 01-02, TSD issued 816 "work orders" for actual physical improvements. In FY 02-03, TSD issued 707 work orders. Typical improvements include installing traffic control devices such as signs and pavement markings, parking regulations such as painted curbs, time restrictions, and permit parking. In addition to funding neighborhood improvements, much of NTSP also supports improvements at and around schools.

Question:

Speed Survey: Is the Dec 31 date when all locations will be done? Can speed surveys already completed be used for enforcement and traffic safety improvement purposes or do we have to wait until the whole report is done?

Response:

(from PWA) December 31, 2004 is still the date when all the speed surveys will be done and reviewed by TSD. (This is an essential step). Staff will know by then whether or not to accept the recommendations from the consultant, so before December 31, the surveys that are "completed" by the consultant will not be ready for enforcement use.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council accept this supplemental status report.
