RESOLUTION NO. 905087 C.M.S.

RESOLUTION:

- 1) ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING A GRANT FROM THE BUREAU OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE'S COMMUNITY-BASED VIOLENCE INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION INITIATIVE IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000) FOR THE PERIOD OF OCTOBER 1, 2024, TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2027; AND
- 2) ADDING THREE (3) FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) CASE MANAGER I POSITIONS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF VIOLENCE PREVENTION THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2027, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE MILLION TWO HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED SEVEN DOLLARS (\$1,279,207); AND
- 3) AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO OVERSEE THE DISTRIBUTION OF UP TO FOUR HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$465,000) IN GRANT FUNDS AS STIPENDS AND INCENTIVES TO SUPPORT RESIDENTS IN MEETING BASIC NEEDS AND REDUCING RISK FOR VIOLENCE; AND
- 4) AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ADJUST THE ALLOCATED FUNDING FOR THE SAME PURPOSES WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE GRANT AWARD.

WHEREAS, there were 120 homicides and 1,537 assaults with a firearm in Oakland in 2023; and

WHEREAS, a significant amount of Oakland's gun violence is driven by conflicts between individuals who are affiliated with street groups and networks; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland's Department of Violence Prevention (DVP) is charged with funding and delivering violence prevention and intervention services that reduce group violence in Oakland; and

WHEREAS, the DVP participates in Oakland's Ceasefire-Lifeline strategy for reducing group violence by providing intensive life coaching and violence interruption services to individuals at imminent risk for gun violence; and

WHEREAS, the DVP submitted a grant application to the Bureau of Justice Assistance in May 2024 to expand the DVP's capacity to deliver intensive life coaching services over three years; and

WHEREAS, DVP intends to use a portion of the grant funding to add three 1.0 FTE Case Manager I positions, with the positions having staggered start dates ranging from appropriately January 1, 2025, through July 1, 2025, and continuing in these positions through September 30, 2027; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Justice Assistance notified the DVP on September 26, 2024, that the DVP's grant application was selected for funding; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby accepts a grant from the Bureau of Justice Assistance's Community-Based Violence Intervention and Prevention Initiative in an amount not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for the term of October 1, 2024, to September 30, 2027; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby appropriates said funds to Project (To-be-determined), Award (To-be-determined), Fund (To-be-determined), Fostering Safe and Healthy Communities Program (SC22), and Oakland Unite Organization (70211); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is authorized to add three (3) 1.0 FTE Case Manager I positions in the DVP through September 30, 2027, for a total amount not to exceed One Million Two Hundred Seventy-Nine Thousand Two Hundred Seven Dollars (\$1,279,207); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is authorized to oversee the distribution of up to Four Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$465,000) in grant funds as stipends and grant incentives for clients engaged in the life coaching services, to support these residents in meeting basic needs and reducing their risk of violence; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized to complete all required negotiations, certifications, assurances, agreements, and documentation required to modify or extend grant award with the Bureau of Justice, and is further authorized to adjust the amounts allocated for stipends or incentives and the amount spent on FTE positions so long as the total amount does not exceed the amount of funds accepted and appropriated from the Bureau of Justice Assistance and is within the requirements of the approved grant award; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That prior to execution, all agreements shall be reviewed and approved as to form and legality by the Office of the City Attorney and placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk.


