

**RESOLUTION HONORING CAPTAIN ANTHONY HARE FOR HIS 25 YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE CITIZENS OF OAKLAND**

**WHEREAS**, Captain Anthony Hare has served honorably with the Oakland Police Department for **24** years; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Hare holds advanced degrees in psychology and counseling, and has taught hostage and critical incident negotiations and crisis management to military, diplomatic and law enforcement audiences around the world; and

**WHEREAS**, the guidelines he has created for advanced negotiations have been adopted by the Department of Defense, the FBI, the U.S. Department of State, London Metropolitan Police and major police agencies throughout the country; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Anthony Hare coordinates the Oakland Police Hostage Negotiations Team, is currently the Communications Division Commander and teaches the specialized role of the Communications Dispatcher in hostage, barricade and other critical dispatch incidents; and

**WHEREAS**, Capt. Hare’s outline for hostage negotiation training serves as the basis for the San Jose State University Negotiators Update, the California Post Advanced Course in Negotiations; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Hare has worked on hostage texts, doctrine, plans, articles and training for U.S. Army negotiators and psychologists; and

**WHEREAS**, Capt. Anthony Hare presents an annual seminar on Avoiding Criminal and Terrorist Incidents to military medical personnel and other health care providers who lead or support expedition travel abroad; and

**WHEREAS**, Capt. Hare’s work in communications and the OPD has directly and significantly improved the lives, safety and independence of seniors and people with disabilities who are at risk in Oakland; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Hare’s Publications include “Recovery in the Midst of Disaster-Management Access to the Cypress Freeway Collapse” in the USGS report to Congress on the Loma Prieta Earthquake, and “Training Crisis Negotiators: Updating Negotiations Techniques and Training”; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Anthony Hare is a Senior Partner in the Center for Crisis Response and Management, an Affiliate of the Institute of World Affairs, Washington, D.C.; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Hare has had a positive impact in the quality of life for all Oakland citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Hare has received the Medal of Valor, Oakland Police Department, Phi Delta Kappa Life Key for Achievements in Affirmative Action in Higher Education, the Bronze Star for Valor, Army Commendation Medal for Heroism with Oak Leaf Clusters and the Purple Heart with Oak Leaf Cluster; now, therefore be it

**RESOLVED.** That Oakland Police Department and the citizens of Oakland will continues to benefit from the outstanding legacy and foundation Captain Hare leaves upon his retirement; and be it
