NOTICE AND DIGEST

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING OAKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 15.34 (CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS COLLECTION, TRANSPORTATION, WASTE REDUCTION AND RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS), TO COMPLY WITH SB 1383 (THE SHORT LIVED CLIMATE POLLUTANT REDUCTION ACT OF 2016) AND ITS REGULATIONS AT CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS AT TITLE 14 SECTION 18899.1(a)(2), WHICH REQUIRE COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CALIFORNIA GREEN BUILDING STANDARDS CODE (CALGREEN) SECTIONS 5.408.1 AND 4.408.1 TO DIVERT 65% OF CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS; AND ADOPTING APPROPRIATE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) FINDINGS

The California Legislature adopted Senate Bill (SB) 1383, the Short-Lived Climate Pollutant Reduction Act of 2016, which establishes methane emissions reduction targets in a Statewide effort to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants. SB 1383 and its regulations require the City of Oakland to adopt and enforce an ordinance that complies with AB 1383 and with new California Green Building Standards Code (CALGreen) requirements with respect to residential and non-residential construction waste management, and that mandate the recycling or salvaging for reuse a minimum of 65% of the nonhazardous construction and demolition (C&D) waste. To comply with and implement the CALGreen minimum 65% reuse requirement, the City is adopting an ordinance amendment that revises Chapter 15.34 (Construction and Demolition Debris Waste Reduction and Recycling Requirements) of the Oakland Municipal Code.

This Ordinance was introduced at the City Council meeting, Tuesday evening November 16, 2021, and passed to print 3 Ayes. Final adoption has been scheduled for the City Council meeting Tuesday evening December 21, 2021, 1:30 p.m., Virtual Tele- Conference Via Zoom
